FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

I am grateful to the many dedicated parishioners who have pledged and contributed to the two capital campaigns of the former Sacred Heart and St Philip parishes. Even with the merger of those two parishes to create a new parish, Divine Mercy, parishioners are continuing to pay on their pledges. Funds are tracked by campus and used exclusively for that particular campus.

Sacred Heart

At Sacred Heart campus, we replaced our aging school boilers. Just in time, too! The former boilers gave up the ghost prior to the start of school. The new boilers were put in place and fired up in time to provide heat just when our students and teachers needed warm classrooms and hallways.

Sacred Heart church windows were also cleaned (inside and out) and, where needed, the leading was replaced. The exterior frames of the stained glass windows were also scraped, cleaned and repainted. In addition, the outer layer of protective glass was replaced and as a result, we are seeing beautiful hues in the windows that we haven't seen in ages. The outside of the church looks neat and the windows themselves "pop" now that the frames have been repainted.

We were very fortunate that Hansen Roofing was able to replace broken tiles on the rectory roof, thus extending its life, rather than a total replacement, as was initially believed to be necessary by both an engineer and another roofing company that we consulted with in putting together the case statement for the Sacred Heart campaign. The broken tiles were identified by pictures from a drone pilot hired by a parishioner. The drone use substantially reduced the repair cost and collateral damage from trying to locate broken tiles.

Next up for Sacred Heart: replacing all the windows in the rectory. The new

windows will be a huge improvement over the almost 100 year-old existing windows. The new windows will require minimal maintenance while providing significant energy cost savings. A large portion of the cost, \$75,000 of the \$110,000 contract, has been funded by parishioners spearheading this project. The remaining amount will be funded by operating reserves, but we are always happy to accept donations!

St Philip

Before the merger took place, the capital campaign for St Philip funded roof work on the church building and enhancements to the vestibule.

Since the merger, funds from the campaign have also gone towards upgrades to the church sound system, upgrades to the school gym sound system, further renovations to the school gym - including repainting, replacement of ceiling tiles and exhaust fans, and installation of new LED lighting - along with extensive work to open and clean the sewers serving the entire St Philip campus.



Next up at St Philip: the installation of a boiler for the rectory (thus detaching the rectory heat from the convent heating system which proved to be highly inefficient and ineffective), and replacement of several sump pumps throughout the various buildings.

GRATEFUL THANKS

Again, my thanks to all those parishioners and friends of Divine Mercy parish who have, through their sacrificial giving, enabled these necessary projects to go forward. These sacrifices are making the two campuses of this new parish better places from which to work and pursue the mission of Christ in the world.

FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN (CONTINUED)

RENEW MY CHURCH & THE SENIOR LEADERSHIP TEAM

Back in November, I wrote about a new, official group in the parish. It's called the Senior Leadership Team. This team is distinct from staff, the Stewardship Council (Parish Council), and the Finance Council.

This handful of people shares responsibility for the effectiveness of the parish with the pastor as we begin phase 5 of Renew My Church. The team provides for greater accountability, transparency and support for the pastor. The team understands and honors the authority of the pastor but takes responsibility for helping him do what is needed to drive vitality in the parish. And that's the key: vitality.

The idea for the Senior Leadership Team comes from the Divine Renovation network, a network that is now engaged in coaching me (and the SLT every other week). The SLT meets weekly with me.

The Senior Leadership Team is comprised of: Jim Dietz, Kristen Fink, Claudia Goodrich, Sue Lehocky, Judy Pyke and Michelle Wasielewski. As you can see, it's a small group. That's deliberate. Meeting weekly for two to three hours, it needs to be small enough so that everyone has a voice in those meetings.

The members of the SLT put five principles into action. They are:

- 1) committed to being disciples of Jesus Christ;
- 2) united in the vision of renewal and revitalization as summarized, for example, in the book Divine Renovation;

- 3) balanced, as a group, in their gifts and talents;
- 4) determined to communicate honestly and with mutual trust even to the point of engaging in healthy conflict; and
- 5) willing to build relationships within the group, be vulnerable and take risks.

This is all part of phase five of Renew My Church, the phase dedicated to renewal, revitalization and evangelization. There will be more to come in phase five, including the establishment of the Evangelization Team. Stay tuned!
