FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

SENIOR LEADERSHIP TEAM: PART FOUR

Last week I focused on the Senior Leadership Team using broad strokes. This week let me tell you the most pressing agenda item of the SLT in upcoming meetings.

We meet almost every Monday from 11:30 until 2:00 or 2:30. In that timeframe, we share a working lunch together and handle a variety of parish issues as well as do a lot of team building. Now we're going to shift focus and over the next several meetings, begin to draft a parish vision statement.

The Importance of a Vision

A vision statement articulates what we hope and dream to be as a parish. It does not describe where we are now, or what we do or value. The vision statement will give voice to where we want to be as a parish, say, in ten years.

Alright, the new parish reality may happen sooner than ten years. But it may not. Depending on the vision, it may take us many steps and many years to get there.

Remember, we didn't get where we are at right now overnight. We are where we are as a parish after many years.

Sure, we may have a new name, but the new name doesn't mean that we are actually "doing" or "being" parish in a new way. You can all probably say with a great deal of surety that we are not really a new parish; we are, quite simply, the result of combining what was. Indeed, aren't we, right now, simply double the same as we were before?

Yes, some details of operation and doing ministry have changed. But those are just small pieces of a bigger puzzle.

The question is: how do we make the transition from maintaining things

the way they've always been, to a vibrant, energetic parish composed of what Pope Francis calls "missionary disciples," believers on fire with the word of God, embracing Jesus in a relationship that makes a difference in their lives such that we go out and make a difference in the world.

Daniel Im, in his book *No Silver Bullets* (2017, B & H Publishing Group, Nashville, TN), says "Vision is about the preferred future. It's the ability to conceptualize a picture of a golden tomorrow that does not yet exist. It's about seeing both the difficulties and possibilities so clearly that you can actually visualize a different reality than the one you can see with your eyes. Simply put, vision is about painting the dreams that God has laid on your heart for all to see. In order to discover those God-given dreams, you need to start by considering 'everything to be a loss in view of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord' (Phil. 3:8) so that you can stop wondering 'what kind of mission God has for me,' and instead begin asking, 'what kind of me God wants for *His* mission.'"

How We Will Arrive at a Vision

In terms of what the SLT will do with the exercises we've been given from the Divine Renovation Network that will help us develop our parish vision statement, that last bit from above would read: stop wondering 'what kind of mission God has for *us*,' and instead begin asking 'what kind of us (that is, parish community of Divine Mercy) God wants for *His* mission.'

As I said, we've been given a trio of exercises to work through to arrive at a draft vision statement. From there, the draft will go to our Parish (Stewardship) Council for them to edit. A final version will be shared after the Parish Council puts the finishing touches on the vision statement.



This sounds like a lot of work. It will be. And we've also been counseled: the vision statement isn't long. It should be very succinct, not more than three sentences.

Short and Sweet

That seems odd, doesn't it? All that work for a few sentences. But capturing and articulating a vision for the parish we want to be should be as neat and short as possible, otherwise we'd lose sight of that vision very quickly.

And it can't be so detailed that it precludes creativity and the evolution of ministry over the years, or we will be right back in the place we are now, which is simply maintaining things as they are.

Think of some powerful vision statements that are short and sweet. How about the vision of the USA articulated by Abraham Lincoln in his Gettysburg Address, "this government of the people, by the people, for the people"? That's pretty succinct. Whether or not we are there yet, in this country, is beside the point. It's a great vision statement on how government should work in this country, and it's only 11 words long!

Your Prayers are Needed

Please pray for the Senior Leadership Team as they begin this valuable *visioning* work. It represents the heart of the entire process of renewal because it will point the way to what we believe God is calling us to be as Divine Mercy parish participating in the mission of Christ in the world.

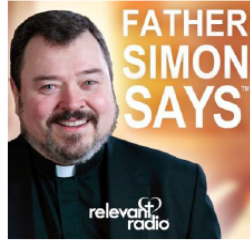

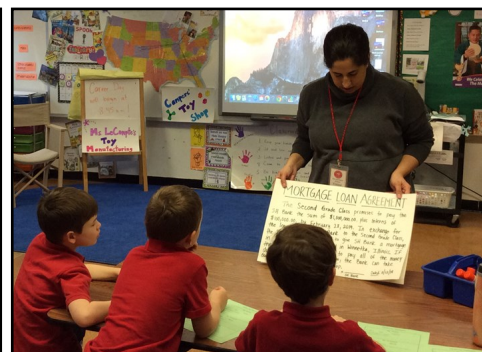

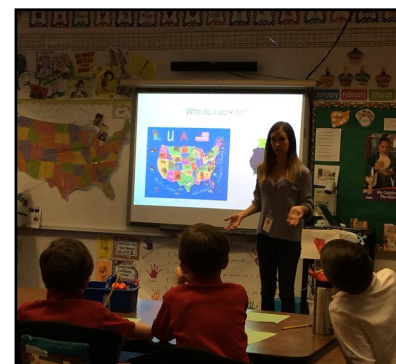
