FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

THE VATICAN MEETING

Due to bulletin deadlines, I am writing this column in advance of the special meeting of Pope Francis and the heads of all of the bishops' conferences worldwide. I am writing this on February 20. The meeting begins on February 21.

This means, of course, that I really cannot comment on what has just transpired because as of this writing I haven't a clue. In case the media haven't explained, let me say a few things about this special meeting.

It's unprecedented in the history of the church. First, because up until the Second Vatican Council there was no such thing as a bishops' conference. At least, not worldwide. In the USA there was a conference of sorts during the WWII years to coordinate the bishops of this country in their response to and support of the war (and relief) efforts.

The Second Vatican Council called for the establishment of bishops' conferences to be organized by nation or by distinctive geographic area. When they were initially set up by the Council (in October 1965 with the decree *Christus Dominus*), it was stipulated that each bishops' conference put together a central administration office for the conference, and that the conference would then hold regular meetings.

Each conference would focus on common concerns regarding the pastoral situation of that region and it had the power to make binding regulations for the whole region in certain specified liturgical and disciplinary matters. Since their establishment in 1965, Saint Pope John Paul II, on the advice of the then head of the Doctrinal Office, Cardinal Ratzinger, limited the ability of bishops' conferences to issue binding regulations, saying that the conference needed to be in unanimous accord (versus the majority vote previously needed). He argued this point in that each bishop of a diocese is the sole head with complete power within his diocese no other bishop other than the pope, the Bishop of Rome, could intervene within that diocese. Hence the need for a unanimous vote of the conference for authoritative national action. This voting restriction may have changed since then, I haven't kept up entirely up on this. Here is how the Catechism weighs in on the matter:

As Christ's vicar, each bishop has the pastoral care of the particular Church entrusted to him, but at the same time he bears collegially with all his brothers in the episcopacy the solicitude for all the Churches Though each bishop is the lawful pastor only of the portion of the flock entrusted to his care, as a legitimate successor of the apostles he is, by divine institution and precept, responsible with the other bishops for the apostolic mission of the Church (CCC n 1560).

As far as I know, the presidents of all the bishops' conferences have never been called to Rome to meet with the pope about a specific issue or problem. That's why I say this meeting is unprecedented.

It indicates the depth of concern over the abuse issue. It shows that Pope Francis is serious when he wants the entire worldwide church to address this effectively. We shall see what worldwide steps will be taken as a result of this special meeting and how those general steps will play out at each conference level and from there how it filters down to each diocese.

COMMONWEAL ARTICLE

The Pennsylvania grand jury report created a bit of press when it was issued. Since then, author Peter Steinfels has written a very lengthy critique of the report. I found it fascinating.

Commonweal. Those who receive the print version of that magazine read on the front cover of the January issue: "The Pennsylvania grand jury report on sex abuse by Catholic priests is inaccurate, unfair, and fundamentally misleading. Its shortcomings should not be masked by its vehement style, its befuddling structure, or its sheer bulk." -- Peter Steinfels (who actually read it)

The article is definitely worth reading.

Be Still and Know That I am God. (Psalm 46:10)

This simple wisdom saying is an invitation given to you by God during this Lenten Season. It is a call to take time and set aside some of your activities to explore the rich wisdom and teachings of the Contemplative tradition through the Method of Centering Prayer, and come into intimate relationship with God, with yourself, with others, and learn how to rest in God in silence, stillness, and solitude. It is our hope that this journey will transform your relationship with yourself, others, and most importantly, with God.

This five-week course is an opening to the presence of God through contemplative dimension of the Gospel. The topics for the course include: The Spiritual Journey with Fr. Thomas Keating, (A Cistercian Trappist monk); Who is God -Attitudes Toward God; Emotional Programs for Happiness; and the Spiritual and Psychological Experience of Centering Prayer. Centering Prayer is a contemporary prayer of the heart, a prayer of simplicity, a prayer of faith, and a method as a way of reducing obstacles to the development of grace.
