FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

LENT

This week will find us celebrating Ash Wednesday. That particular day and the three days which follow have been described by the early Fathers of the Church as "the porch of Lent."

Using the imagery of "porch" they conveyed to the faithful that while Ash Wednesday and the days following it until the First Sunday of Lent were a prelude to and part of the Lenten season, the actual counted days, the forty days, of the season run from that First Sunday of Lent until Holy Thursday.

In other words, Ash Wednesday and that Thursday through Saturday are bonus days, additional days that are Lenten in nature.

The Church gives us an abundance of Lent, that joyful time of year which prepares us for and launches us into the Easter season. I say "joyful" because Lent brings us face to face with the great mercy of God. Yes, it is penitential. But penance grounds us in the loving kindness of God who is infinitely patient with us sinners, infinitely kind and merciful.

The name of our parish, Divine Mercy, proclaims to all the world the goodness of God who encourages us to strive for our best selves, our most loving selves in the light of his love which saves us and sets us free for authentic life, that is, living as members of the kingdom.

Let us go together into the Lenten season and ask of God his grace to live up to his goodness and mercy, to be the individuals and the parish he intends for us to be.

FOLLOW UP WEEKEND

This weekend we follow-up on last weekend's commitment Sunday to the Annual Catholic Appeal. If you were not able to be at either last weekend or this one in order to commit to the Appeal, there are pledge envelopes available at the back of church (both churches, St. Philip the Apostle and Sacred Heart) and also at both church offices.

STEWARDSHIP REPORT

Last weekend we made available the annual Stewardship Report to the parish. Reports can be found in the back of both churches and in the offices. The report details the finances for the final fiscal year of both Sacred Heart and St Philip the Apostle parishes.

Given that they were, at the time, separate parishes their finances were reported as such in this report. Next year, of course, the Stewardship Report will reflect that we are now one parish with two worship sites.

In the very near future, you will be receiving an additional report that details how your contributions to the two separate capital campaigns have been used to fund repairs at each campus using that campaign's funds. Thank you for your patience as we continue the work of the combining.

LENTEN RESOURCES

LENT BEGINS THIS WEEK

Renewal, transformation, preparation, restoration, conversion, reflection. These are all common themes we ponder as we begin the season of Lent. In simple terms, Lent is the season in which we refocus ourselves on the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We hope and imagine that our Lenten journey will be different: focused, prayerful, and full of desire to have a closer relationship with our Lord. Lent is a time we retreat to the desert and venture into the wilderness with Christ. We pray it will be a season of full of prayer, grace, love, sacrifice and service.

As we begin our Lenten journey, we are marked with the sign of Christ. Let this sign be the cause or opportunity for discussion. Let us recall the prayer recited as we receive our Lenten Ash: Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return, or Repent, and believe in the Gospel.

PRAYER, FASTING & ALMSGIVING

These are three traditional practices of Lent that can easily be incorporated into your life at home. They are meant to help us turn away from unhealthy habits and open our hearts to God.

Through **prayer**, we come to know God. Talk to God during Lent. There are many different kinds of prayer (petition, intercessory, thanksgiving, adoration). Simply put, it's a conversation with God.

Fasting is actually a spiritual exercise. We fast to grow our inner spirit and life. It draws us nearer to God and opens our hearts to God. We fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday to remember Christ's passion and death and the sacrifice he made for our sins.

Almsgiving benefits those in need. As Catholics, we are *always* called to share what we have with the less



fortunate, but during Lent, we are especially called to share God's love with others through the giving of our time, sharing our gifts & talents, and offering our treasure for those in need. Almsgiving involves sacrifice, a reminder of Christ's passion and sacrifice for us.




LENTEN DAILY REFLECTIONS

HEALING OURSELVES FROM A PLACE OF CENTERING PRAYER

Be Still and Know That I am God. (Psalm 46:10)

This simple wisdom saying is an invitation given to you by God during this Lenten Season. It is a call to take time and set aside some of your activities to explore the rich wisdom and teachings of the Contemplative tradition through the Method of Centering Prayer, and come into intimate relationship with God, with yourself, with others, and learn how to rest in God in silence, stillness, and solitude. It is our hope that this journey will transform your relationship with yourself, others, and most importantly, with God.

This five-week course is an opening to the presence of God through contemplative dimension of the Gospel. The topics for the course include: The Spiritual Journey with Fr. Thomas Keating, (A Cistercian Trappist monk); Who is God -Attitudes Toward God; Emotional Programs for Happiness; and the Spiritual and Psychological Experience of Centering Prayer. Centering Prayer is a contemporary prayer of the heart, a prayer of simplicity, a prayer of faith, and a method as a way of reducing obstacles to the development of grace.

Weekly classes will be offered on 2 different days and times: Thursdays at 7-8:30 pm: March 7, 14, 21, 28, and April 4, 2019. Saturdays at 9:15 – 10:45 am: March 9, 16, 23, 30, and April 6, 2019.


