FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

HOLY WEEK

We are getting closer to the celebration of the Easter Triduum, the three days within Holy Week that are the most solemn and important feasts in the entire liturgical calendar. In many ways, these three days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil "describe" for us the faith that makes us Christian and Catholic.

Given their importance, the feasts of Holy Thursday and Easter Vigil are meant to be concelebrated by priests within a given parish. The Vigil is of such importance that even in very large parishes that include multiple languages there should only be one celebration of it. Every effort should also be made to ensure that the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper and the Easter Vigil are celebrated with great care and vigor, in other words, that we pour into each of these liturgies the best of our human, musical and material resources so that they shine with great beauty and dignity.

Holy Thursday:

For the above reasons, Divine Mercy parish will gather at a singular Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, to be held at St. Philip the Apostle church on April 18 at 7:00 p.m. Sacred Heart church will be open for visits all day and also during the evening of April 18, but the liturgy itself will be celebrated at St. Philip; the chapel of reposition after the evening Mass can be found in the former convent chapel at St. Philip the Apostle.

A distinctive element of the Holy Thursday liturgy that has been very effective at Sacred Heart will be employed at St. Philip, that is, extending the invitation to the entire assembly to have every member join in the foot washing ritual.

Why do we wash feet at this Mass? The simple answer is because Jesus washed feet at the Last Supper. This ritual action ended up in the liturgy because the Church wishes to not only commemorate this startling action but to emphasize that discipleship involves humble service. Can there be anything more humbling than to wash another's feet? You have to kneel down to do so, like a servant, which is the attitude motivating all ministry. The original disciples balked at this, until Jesus explained.

We follow that gospel example and imperative. And we don't organize twelve "privileged" individuals from the parish. We open it to all, equally.

If you intend to join in, please dress accordingly, with socks that you can remove (on your own) easily. If past celebrations are any indication, we will have plenty of towels available, one for each person who comes forward so that they are not shared between persons.

Easter Vigil:

The Vigil will be celebrated at Sacred Heart church on April 20 at 8:00 p.m. All of the elements that make up the Vigil will be present. You will also notice a distinctive feature this year, given that two houses of worship comprise this one parish.

There will be two Easter Candles present. The Candle that will be lit first from the new fire is the one that will reside at Sacred Heart. Near to hand will be the Easter Candle that will be used throughout the season and the remainder of the liturgical year at St. Philip the Apostle. As all the congregational candles are lit, the Easter Candle for St. Philip church also will be lit.

After the liturgy, this particular Candle will be taken to St. Philip. This interesting ritual detail comes to us from the Secretariat of Divine Worship of the U.S. Bishops' Conference and will be duplicated in



many parishes in the Archdiocese and around the United States that are now "clustered" or which have a combination of churches or missions.

If you haven't received this healing sacrament in a long time, please



Eucharistic Adoration is a devotion in which many people feel drawn more closely to our Lord. It is a special time of peace and quiet for praying, reflecting, reading, meditating, contemplating, all in the Eucharistic Presence of our Lord.

One suggestion for what to do during

private Eucharistic adoration is to pray the Psalms or the Liturgy of the Hours. Whether you are praising, giving thanks, asking for forgiveness, or seeking an answer, you'll find an appropriate psalm. The ancient prayer of the Church called the Liturgy of the Hours presents an excellent way to pray through the Book of Psalms throughout the year.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will begin immediately after the 8:00 a.m. Mass and rosary at St. Philip the Apostle Church, followed by 6+ hours (9am-3pm) of silent time, concluding with the regularly scheduled Holy Hour from 3-4pm. HEALING OURSELVES FROM A PLACE OF CENTERING PRAYER

Be Still and Know That I am God. (Psalm 46:10)

This simple wisdom saying is an invitation given to you by God during this Lenten Season. It is a call to take time and set aside some of your activities to explore the rich wisdom and teachings of the Contemplative tradition through the Method of Centering Prayer, and come into intimate relationship with God, with yourself, with others, and learn how to rest in God in silence, stillness, and solitude. It is our hope that this journey will transform your relationship with yourself, others, and most importantly, with God.

This five-week course is an opening to the presence of God through contemplative dimension of the Gospel. The topics for the course include: The Spiritual Journey with Fr. Thomas Keating, (A Cistercian Trappist monk); Who is God -Attitudes Toward God; Emotional Programs for Happiness; and the Spiritual and Psychological Experience of Centering Prayer. Centering Prayer is a contemporary prayer of the heart, a prayer of simplicity, a prayer of faith, and a method as a way of reducing obstacles to the development of


