## FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

### MANY THANKS

We are grateful to the many parishioners who helped make the Easter Triduum such a beautiful experience: Todd Gresick, Sarah Cozzi, the Divine Mercy Choir (which included parishioners from both worship sites), the cantors, lectors, eucharistic ministers, altar servers, greeters, ushers and all of the wonderful people who decorated both churches, especially Tanya Scandariato, Maureen Claps, Mary Claps, Cathy Stegich and Bobbie Weiss, as well as the many other volunteers who assisted in this task.

### TODAY IS SPECIAL

This weekend we celebrate the patronal feast of our parish, Divine Mercy. Given that our parish was created as of July 1, this is the first time we will honor the infinite mercy of God, intentionally invoking this awesome attribute as we gather to celebrate the Lord's patronage.

Divine Mercy Sunday always falls on the second Sunday of the Easter season, ever since Saint Pope John Paul II canonized Sister Faustina Kowalska in the year 2000. On that day he proclaimed the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday. During her life, Sister Faustina claimed to have been personally visited by Jesus and kept a diary of these apparitions. She promoted devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and painted an image of the Lord with rays coming from his heart, one pale for water and one red for blood. Below the image, she inscribed: "Jesus, I trust in you."

The Second Sunday of Easter is part of the octave, the first eight days of the season and is considered in the liturgical calendar as if it were one whole day. One of the fathers of the Church wrote centuries ago that as Sunday is to the week, so too is the octave of Easter to the year. Those of you who pray Morning Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours know this in that the psalms and antiphons are the same from Easter Sunday all through the octave (as if it were one great day).

On this Sunday that closes the octave, the opening prayer for Mass invokes the loving kindness of God:

God of everlasting mercy, who in the very recurrence of the paschal feast kindle the faith of the people you have made your own, increase, we pray, the grace you have bestowed, that all may grasp and rightly understand in what font they have been washed, by whose Spirit they have been reborn, by whose Blood they have been redeemed.

The Holy Spirit fills us with joy on this Divine Mercy Sunday! Alleluia!

Happy patronal feast day!

### WHAT HAS HAPPENED SINCE JULY?

In a word, lots. A lot has happened since we became Divine Mercy parish. Most of the action has been behind the scenes, so to speak.

#### *Bulletin*

The first thing to happen was that one bulletin was created for both worship sites. That took place immediately.

#### *Offices*

We have organized almost all of the internal procedures, the stuff that takes place in the office. This took a long time, given that we are continuing to keep open two offices, one at Sacred Heart and one at St. Philip. The office procedures, while parallel, were not exactly the same. For communication purposes, not to mention for smoother running, it took some time to iron all of that out. Some of it couldn't happen until, in the course of the year, things surfaced which called our attention to differing procedures in each office.

#### *Lay Leadership Groups*

The two former parish councils were merged into one new Parish Council, as were the two Finance councils. Meanwhile, the Archdiocese recreated our chart of accounts, which by way, was just finalized. The two religious



education boards began to meet together and were merged into one new board. That board has also revamped religious formation so that what happens with public school children and their parents, starting this July 1, will be the one program at both campuses under the guidance of one religious formation staff.

#### *Staff Positions*

With the assistance of the Archdiocese, we rolled out new staff positions, some of which have been filled and others which will soon be filled: Director of Operations, Director of Communication, Director of Evangelization and Life Long Formation, Director of Service and Outreach, and Coordinator of Children's Ministries. (More on these staff positions in an upcoming bulletin.)

#### *Senior Leadership Team (SLT)*

This group is made up of staff and lay leaders. Its job is to help advise the pastor weekly on decisions that push forward the vision of the parish to revitalize and evangelize. This is the group more concerned with tactics, while the Parish Council is more concerned with strategy and strategic planning.

#### *Vision*

The SLT and the Parish Council formulated the vision statement for our parish. This statement will guide how we go about everything from here on out. It's a simple vision statement but it is profound in its scope. It is: "Divine Mercy Parish is a welcoming community that inspires disciples of Jesus to share God's love and transform the world."

This vision fits with our parish "tag line" that you see on our stationary and elsewhere: Making Disciples. Building Church. Serving Others.



### Alpha

The most exciting new thing that we've worked on in the months since we became Divine Mercy Parish is the pilot program of Alpha which is currently happening. Alpha will, most likely, be a premier mechanism for evangelization and will hopefully bring in new parishioners in the future. As we work through the pilot of Alpha, we are ironing out the kinks and this fall we will open it to everyone (we'd like everyone to see what we will be doing with newcomers, the curious and the seekers). In addition, Alpha will lead participants to other parish formation opportunities that are in the works!

### Capital Campaigns

As both worship sites continue to collect on our respective capital campaigns, with the funds being retained at the original sites, we are grateful for your financial support. Your generosity has enabled us to complete two major projects at the Sacred Heart site: the replacement of the school boilers and the restoration and repainting of the stained glass windows in the church.

Likewise, at our Saint Philip site, we have completed the refurbishment of the church vestibule, updated the gymnasium (painting, new lights, updates to the sound system), and storm and sanitary lines were thoroughly cleaned and repaired.

We are committed to being good stewards of the gifts you have

entrusted to us and we will keep you informed about future progress of projects as set forth in the respective campaign case statements.

### What's Next?

The above is just a summary of what has transpired over the last ten months. Imagine working on all of this while keeping up with regular ministry. Fun!

Up next: the building of a new parish website and social media platforms, opening Alpha to everyone, the first year of a unified approach to children's formation and ministry at both campuses, and the introduction of praise music at some of our weekend Masses, special family Masses in church throughout the year, and the creation of a revitalized welcoming (or greeter) ministry focused on radical hospitality. We have an exciting year ahead!

Eucharistic Adoration is a devotion in which many people feel drawn more closely to our Lord. It is sometimes hard to get started, so why not try coming for a short time into the Presence of our Eucharistic Lord exposed on the altar? He is eager to see you and hear your concerns for your family and friends, country, Church, etc. It is a special time of peace and quiet for praying, reflecting, reading, meditating, contemplating, all in the Eucharistic

Presence of our Lord. Amid this peace and quiet, allow some time to listen to Him. Need a special prayer this month? Recite the "Jesus Prayer". Say "Lord Jesus, have mercy on me, a sinner," repeatedly as you quiet your heart and mind.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will begin immediately after the 8:00 a.m. Mass and rosary at St. Philip the Apostle Church followed by 6+ hours (9am-3pm) of silent time, concluding with the regularly scheduled Holy Hour from 3-4pm. Come when you can, leave when you must. May God bless you and all for whom you pray!



### JOIN US FOR ALPHA... ...WHAT IS ALPHA?

Divine Mercy Parish is currently piloting a program called Alpha, which we plan to roll out to the parish and the community in September.

What is Alpha? Alpha is a space to explore life's big questions, to say what you think and to hear other people's points of view. It's a series of sessions exploring the Christian faith. Each session includes a video that looks at different questions around faith and is designed to create conversation. Alpha is run around the world, and no two Alphas look the same, but generally they have three key things in common: good food, a video and good conversation.

### UPDATE ON FATHER PAUL FROM SRI LANKA

Many concerned parishioners have asked if Father Paul was impacted by the horrific bombing attacks that occurred in Sri Lanka on Easter Sunday.

Deacon Mike McNulty received the following email response from Father Paul:

*"Dear Mike,  
Easter Greetings,  
Thank you very much for your concerned letter.  
Easter was a disaster for us. The Christians were attacked. 300 meters from our Jesuit Residence, a Sion Church was attacked and 27 people were killed. Attacks were also elsewhere more than, 290 people were killed. As regards, help, I will get back to you soon.

Fr. Paul S.J"*

We will continue to share updates from Father Paul, as well as information on how we can provide assistance.

Following is the statement released by Cardinal Cupich following the attacks:

*"With profound sorrow, we offer our prayers to the Christian community of Sri Lanka, and all those devastated by today's horrific acts of violence, killings carried out while Christians offered their own prayers of gratitude on this great feast of hope, Easter Sunday.*

*In solidarity with the survivors and their loved ones, we grieve the dead and pray for God to heal the wounded, comfort the mourners, and instill ever more deeply in all peoples a commitment to peace, which our creator fervently desires for all his children."*

We join those around the world in prayer as we remember the victims of this terrible attack. We keep them and their families in our prayers.

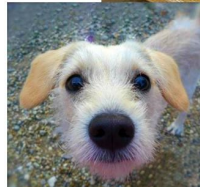
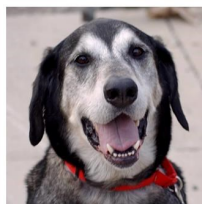
