FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

FROM MAINTENANCE TO MISSION

The book that is guiding us in the *Renew My Church* process is Father James Mallon's *Divine Renovation*. Our parish council read and discussed it. Our staff has read and discussed it. The Senior Leadership Team has read and discussed it. Perhaps some of you have also read it, given that I've written about it many times in this column.

The subtitle of the book is "Bringing Your Parish from Maintenance to Mission." What does this mean?

It means that most parishes in the U.S. do the same things in the same way every year. In other words, they are "maintenance" parishes, more or less just going through the motions with regard to ministry, doing the same thing year after year, without questioning why they do what they do, or without exploring new and innovative ways of doing things.

Father Mallon's idea is that we need to move from maintenance to mission: we need to be a mission-driven operation. And our basic mission is given to us by Jesus, that is, to go and make disciples of all the nations, teaching others as Jesus taught, bringing others into the life of the Holy Trinity, into that blessed divine life of Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

A mission-driven parish will focus on bringing others to the faith. A mission-driven parish will also focus on discipleship. It seeks to cultivate in each of its members a personal relationship with Jesus that makes a difference in their own lives and in the life of the world around them.

Divine Mercy parish is in the final (never-ending) phase of *Renew My Church*. As such, we are attempting to build the new reality of mission. This is not something that will happen quickly or overnight. It will not depend on only one particular

mechanism, tool, or program.

But we have started! A good example of us moving from maintenance to mission is our piloting of the Alpha program. In the fall, Alpha will be open to the entire parish (by then, we will have worked out the kinks we encountered in the pilot—although it's going remarkably well).



Another example of us moving closer to being a mission-driven parish is the Family Mass we celebrated for the close of the religious education year at Sacred Heart this past Sunday at 9:00 a.m. The Family Mass is something we definitely want to continue in the parish; something that we will work to refine and improve.

Alpha and the Family Mass are just two examples of the steps we are taking to move from maintenance to mission. We will take many more steps forward as the months go by.

You'll hear about those steps in a new column that will soon debut here in the bulletin, mostly likely on this same page. The column will be entitled, *Our Parish, Our Future*. It's coming soon. Enjoy!

FIRST EUCHARIST AT ST. PHILIP CHURCH

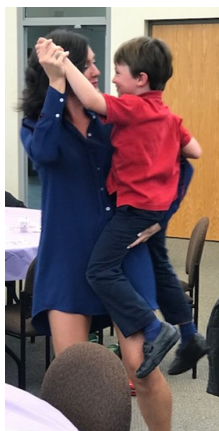
Last Sunday, seven children received the sacrament of the Eucharist for the first time during a beautiful Mass.

LOOK WHAT'S HAPPENING AT SACRED HEART SCHOOL!



A very special event was held on Tuesday, May 7, when the kindergarteners held a tea for their mothers. The children danced with their mothers, gave them a beautiful handmade necklace, sang songs, including the Our Father, and even served their moms treats and iced tea. What's more, each mom received a book of the children's work that they have been compiling all year long. Mother's Day came early to this special group of moms!



Our Sacred Heart School community participated in the "Because I Can" challenge to raise awareness and funding for the Small Heroes Foundation. The foundation, created by the Small Family of SHS, raises funds for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy (DMD) clinical trials and provides families with assistance for uncovered medical equipment. The students raised money by bringing in change. The challenge at Sacred Heart provided students with a chance to celebrate their ability to be active by dancing, climbing, hula-hooping and more. To date, nearly 100 participants, children and adults, have joined the challenge. For example, a group of mothers with preschoolers at Sacred Heart have vowed to take 10,000 steps a day on group walks, while families have also pledged to eat healthy and get outdoors to exercise and play.

Last week the kindergarten students participated in the annual Kindergarten Poetry Reading. The students did a wonderful job reading their poems and the audience loved hearing their rhymes. As Mrs. Wettersten explained, the reading provided many important lessons: the children learned memorization and many pre-reading skills, how to practice and present with a microphone in front of a group, and they gained confidence and showed poise and presence. Lifelong skills learned at a young age!

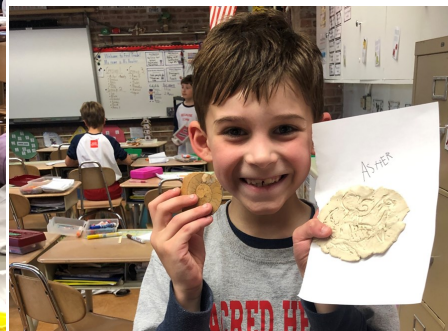
