



GENEROSITY ENABLES CREATIVITY AND LIVELINESS



MEMORIAL DAY MASS AT SACRED HEART CHURCH

It has been a tradition to offer Mass on Memorial Day at Sacred Heart Cemetery as we pay tribute to those who have given their lives in defense of our nation, as well as to pray for all of our beloved dead buried there or elsewhere. Due to construction on Dundee Road at Lee Road it would be inconvenient to have the Mass there. Hence it will be moved, for this year only, to Sacred Heart Church. It will be the only Mass offered on Memorial Day at Divine Mercy Parish.

It has also been a tradition to invite those in attendance at the cemetery to take a flower to the grave of their loved one at the end of Mass. This year those attending will be offered a flower as they enter church; and they will be invited

after the homily to bring their flower forward and place it in a vase at the altar. After Mass there will be a reception in the Sacred Heart Church Courtyard, and the vases will be carried in the recessional and placed before the statue of the Sacred Heart in the courtyard. Please join us at 10:00 a.m. on Monday, May 27 for this lovely and meaningful Mass and the reception following.

UNOPENED GIFTS


There was once a woman who had a dream and, upon waking, she

LET'S TALK ALPHA
