STAFF ADDITIONS AND RESTRUCTURING

A new person is coming on board staff starting this month. She will be working for a few days each week to start and then expand her hours in July. Before I tell you who that is, I'd like to set this information in the larger context of our overall non-priest staff restructuring.

After a very long process of consultation with the Archdiocesan *Renew My Church* team and HR department, we have finalized the new positions at Divine Mercy parish. Those new positions are all directors who will be in charge of various major facets of the parish. They are —

- Director of Pastoral Care,
 Outreach and Special Events
 (PT) Responsible for Ministers
 of Care, Bereavement Ministry,
 Senior Visits, Outreach to our
 Sharing Parishes, A Just Harvest,
 and large parish events, such as
 Mass in the Meadow, Advent by
 Candlelight, Pancake Breakfast,
 St. Patrick's Day Party, etc.
- Director of Communications (PT)

 Responsible for welcoming and engaging parishioners and guests in developing personal relationships with Jesus, making disciples, building communities and inspiring witness. Also responsible for communicating effectively with multiple constituency groups utilizing all forms of communication, including social media. Will work with other directors on our Alpha program and creating a culture of evangelization in the parish.
- Director of Evangelization and Lifelong Formation (FT) – Responsible for overseeing and supervising the Coordinator of Religious Education/Children's Ministry, equipping parishioners to encounter Jesus Christ through a lifelong process that encourages them to become missionary disciples in the world,

- and developing an engagement plan that assures the participation of the laity in the Church's mission of making disciples, building communities and inspiring witness.
- Pirector of Operations (FT) Responsible for financial management of the parish and school, as well as capital projects, capital campaigns, coordination with the Finance Council, facilities management and human resources. Works with the other directors to further the mission of the Church.
- Director of Music (FT) –
 Responsible for providing the
 music for all liturgies and
 coordinating with other
 musicians. Supervises the
 Associate Director of Music at St.
 Philip the Apostle.
- Director of Liturgy (future position, not yet filled).

Our newest staff member who joins us this month as the Director of Pastoral Care, Outreach and Special Events is Maureen Valvassori. Many of you know Maureen. She is a parishioner. Most recently, Maureen worked for The Well of Mercy. Previously, she worked for the Archdiocese as part of the Renew My Church team. Before that, she worked as the Director of Religious Education at Our Lady of Ransom. She has a ton of church experience and comes highly recommended. She will be a great asset to the parish staff and we are all looking forward to



working with her. Welcome, Maureen!

As you probably know, the other directors have worked for the parish in the past. Their titles and job descriptions have morphed into what they are now and are in line with the types of positions encouraged by the Archdiocese in order to pursue parish vitality and renewal.

Judy Pyke is now the Director of Communications, Sue Lehocky is the Director of Evangelization and Lifelong Formation, Michelle Wasielewski is the Director of Operations and Todd Gresick is the Director of Music. Not immediately, but in future years, as soon as our financial situation can afford, we will actively search for a Director of Liturgy.

We are currently searching for a Coordinator of Children's Ministry. We have not yet specifically defined the responsibilities of the three administrative assistant positions (two full-time and one part-time).

Cindy Atsaves is our Finance Manager. Alex Hodge is the Maintenance Engineer. Salvador Perez is the Associate Maintenance Engineer. Sarah Cozzi is the Associate Director of Music.

Kristen Fink is the Principal (FT) of our parochial school, Sacred Heart School. In that capacity, she also sits on the parish staff.

All of the positions that have been or will be filled are within the current budget. We have realigned responsibilities of our existing staff

members. Through several instances of "organic" staff attrition during these past months, we have freed up funding to use towards ministry.

The decision-making process that has led us to this point has been incredibly thorough and is in line with the vision of Divine Renovation, a model of vibrant Church embraced by the Archdiocese of Chicago, which promotes the primacy of evangelization and missionary discipleship. We firmly believe this new structure provides a solid foundation as we build our new reality as Divine Mercy Parish. We are blessed to have such talented and capable staff members whose strengths complement each other well!

CONGRATULATIONS TO FATHER CHRIS GRODECKI ON HIS ORDINATION!

Divine Mercy holds Chris Grodecki in our prayers as he is ordained to the priesthood this Saturday, June 8 at Fordham University in New York City! Join us next Sunday, July 16, at 10:30am for Father Chris Grodecki's first Mass here at Sacred Heart Church of Divine Mercy Parish! A reception will follow in the parish center rotunda.

Christopher Grodecki, SJ, grew up in Winnetka, III. He attended Sacred Heart School from pre-school to 8th Grade, and his family remain active parishioners at Divine Mercy Parish. Chris graduated from New Trier High School in 2001. He then attended Georgetown University, and in 2005 received his bachelor's degree in English and in German literature before receiving a master's degree in German. He remained in D.C., working as a writer and researcher at a non-profit public-interest law firm and participating in both social and young adult ministries as a parishioner of St. Matthew's Cathedral. Chris maintained his friendships with the Jesuits at Georgetown and began to discern his vocation to the Society of Jesus. He entered the Jesuits in 2009, and as a

novice, served as co-teacher and Ignatian Identity assistant at Washington Jesuit Academy. Chris was then missioned to Loyola University Chicago, where he received a master's degree in philosophy. While in Chicago, he was a SPRED (Special Religious Education) catechist at Queen of Angels Parish; catechist of the English RCIA program at St. Procopius Parish; and chaplain to the Loyola University Chicago women's soccer team. Thereafter, Chris taught philosophy and served as director of the RCIA program at Saint Joseph's University in Philadelphia for two years. In 2016, Chris began his theology studies at Regis College in Toronto and received the Master of Divinity degree. He served as a deacon at St. Anthony's Parish in Oceanside, New York. Chris is currently completing the Licentiate in Sacred Theology and Master of Theology programs at Regis College in Toronto and serves at the University of Toronto Newman Centre. He will begin an assignment to St. Ignatius of Loyola Parish in New York City at the end of the year.

NEW AND BOLD

As part of our Renew My Church efforts in building our new reality to become a vibrant faith community that seeks to make disciples, build church and serve others, we want to be BOLD in everything we do! That can manifest itself in so many exciting and creative ways. The possibilities are endless. We wanted to share with you one of the (visible) bold steps our Senior Leadership Team decided to take to help move our parish forward. On May 12th, when we celebrated Mother's Day with all the wonderful women who mother in one way or another, we invited several women from the parish and our staff to share their thoughts on motherhood, as it fit so well with that Sunday's Gospel:

"Jesus said:

"My sheep hear my voice;
I know them, and they follow me.
I give them eternal life,
and they shall never perish.
No one can take them out of my hand.
My Father, who has given them to me,
is greater than all, and no one can take
them out of the Father's hand. The
Father and I are one."

Given that these reflections were so well received and many parishioners want to hear more from women of the parish, we wanted to share with you the text of some of those Mother's Day Reflections in this column.

They're a great reminder to be bold!

This reflection comes to you from Claudia Goodrich, who spoke at the 10:30am Mass on May 12, 2019.

You all might be asking, What is she doing up there? That's a great question as I've never stood behind this lectern and I like to sit in the back of the church and be anonymous. If you read Father's Steve's letters in the bulletin - a great source of information if you don't - you will have read about how the parish is beginning to percolate with new ideas. And, one of the new ideas is to hear from our

parishioners. So, Mother's Day was picked as the day to roll this out. I thought it was a good idea and said so. And this is what you get when you say you like the idea....you get tapped. So, I tell myself "be bold, do it."

I stand here for the first time and notice that I've got Jesus to my right and Mother Mary to my left up in the stained glass windows. So, with them looking down on me, I pray that I can do this and I thank you for listening.

The ask of me is threefold; to speak about motherhood, to be a witness to my faith, and to tie my thoughts to today's Gospel.

Interestingly, on Mother's Day, I am going to start with my father. For it is my father who first shared with me, in both words and actions, how important the role of mother is. He is the one that told me what a difference a mother can make and that motherhood is a role to be honored.

My Dad's mother died when he was six months old. Her last words were his name. He grew up without her and grew up listening to older siblings, some much older, tell stories of a wonderful, nurturing mother. He had no such experience, no stories to tell.

As luck, or providence, would have it, he left his native country of Holland, came to the United States, and married an Irish Catholic, a woman who would become the mother to his seven children. I can remember him sitting back, smiling and watching my mother mother all of us. He loved watching her be a mother. The world's best mother, in my mind.

He talked about what it meant not to have a mother. He told us how lucky we were. I know he missed not having a mother that there was a gap in his life. And, one day that gap was filled. I don't know exactly when or how but he, a Dutch Reformed Protestant, adopted Mother Mary and began to

say the rosary every morning.

For me, I had the world's best mother and a Dad who prayed daily to Mother Mary. I knew I was in good hands.

My mother was a cradle Catholic from Chicago's northside. She went to Catholic schools all her life - Sacred Heart on Sheridan, Rosary College in River Forest, Loyola University downtown for a Masters. She raised her seven children as Catholics, put a rosary in every room and made Sunday mass non-negotiable. I could spend the rest of the day telling stories of how wonderful my mother was. She role-modeled having deep faith and giving unconditional love.

My parents are gone now and I have only my memories to lean on as guidance as I raise my own two beautiful children.

I think of my parents often. I wonder what they would do. I wonder what advice they would give me as I navigate motherhood. When I hit those moments of "What do I do now?" I talk to them in my head. And, I know that they would tell me to pray. That Mother Mary will guide me. That never was it known that anyone who fled to her protection, implored her help, or sought her intercession was left unaided.

So, I pray to Mother Mary, truly the world's best mother. I pray to her to step in and guide me. I pray to Jesus, The Good Shepherd, to lean forward and nudge me.

And, I know in the calmness of my heart that Mary is whispering in my ear and Jesus, as the Gospel says, is shepherding me.

Thank you and Happy Mother's Day.

Background

In January of 2019, the Religious Education Boards of Sacred Heart and St. Philip the Apostle came together to create a plan for the future to help our children become lifelong followers of Jesus. We recognize that times have changed and that the way our children come to know God's love and the Catholic faith must change too.



What You Need to Know

- Religious Education has a new name: Children's Ministry.
- Children's Ministry will be led by Sue Lehocky, the new Director of Evangelization and Lifelong Formation at Divine Mercy. Sue will be assisted by a Coordinator of Children's Ministry, to be hired in the near future.



- Beginning July 1, 2019, there will be **one**Children's Ministry program for both Sacred Heart
 and St. Philip the Apostle. We will offer 2
 programs—Sunday Morning Children's Ministry and
 Family Faith Connection—featuring Gospel based
 lessons, increased parental involvement and service
 and prayer sessions. Both sites will continue to host
 Sunday morning Children's Ministry. Family Faith
 Connection with be held at the Sacred Heart site.
- We have a new, creative plan to rejuvenate Sunday morning faith formation. This new approach will feature less time "in the classroom" and more time connecting faith to everyday life.
- Catechists and volunteers will still be needed at both sites.
- Divine Mercy families can register their children at either campus.



Children's Ministry focuses on growing faith and engaging hearts. We offer faith formation to children, kindergarten through 8th grade at both the Sacred Heart and St. Philip the Apostle campuses.
