SUMMER LIST

Around about this time of year I usually share with you my summer reading list, books I've begun or books that are on the pile for me to read. I don't share this information with the expectation that you read the same stuff. We all have different tastes and needs. I just want you to know what kinds of books I'm reading.

A book that I am currently deeply into and will soon finish is Rick Atkinson's *The British Are Coming: The War for America, Lexington to Princeton, 1775-1777* (Henry Holt and Company, New York, 2018). This is the first of a planned three-volume history of the revolutionary war. I picked it up at the bookstore on the strength of Atkinson's three volume history of WWII (his Liberation Trilogy) which I loved. *The British Are Coming* does not disappoint. I can't put it down. Great stuff.

I'm also into Pope Francis' *On the Call to Holiness in Today's World (Gaudete et Exsultate, Apostolic Exhortation, 2018)*. Having already said that I am not sharing this information expecting you to read what I'm reading, nevertheless, if you are so inclined, I'm pretty sure you can find it on-line at the website for the Holy See. If you desire, you can pick it up from Pauline Books and Media. I'm finding this a refreshing easy read, unlike some papal documents. It's direct and, I think, practical and its main point is that holiness is possible for each one of us in whatever walk of life we find ourselves.

I'm almost finished with Carey Nieuwhof's *Didn't See It Coming: Overcoming the 7 Greatest Challenges That No One Expects and Everyone Experiences* (Waterbrook, a division of Penguin Random House, New York, 2018). Talk about expecting! Expect that some of his insights make their way into future preaching of mine, when appropriate.

Also on my shelf, yet to be read is

Patrick Lencioni's *The Advantage: Why Organizational Health Trumps Everything Else in Business* (Jossey-Bass, a Wiley Imprint, 2012). A parish is not a business, but every parish can learn from great business books. I'm told this a great business book. I certainly think his *Death by Meeting* book is great!

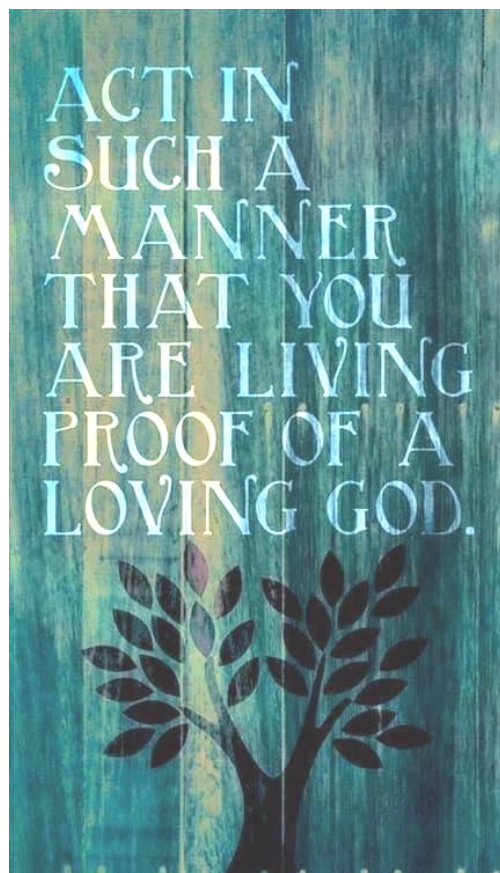
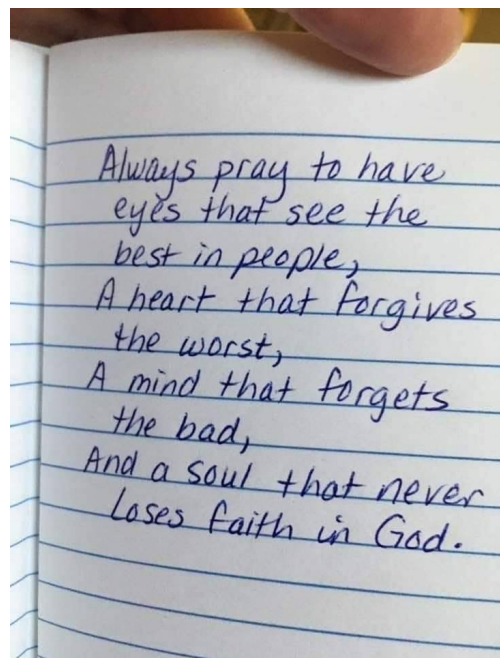

I picked it up in the airport bookstore while waiting around for a flight. It looked good to me. Each chapter has one of those brief summaries at the end to help you solidify insights (just like the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*). So I purchased it. We'll see if it lives up to its easy-to-walk-around-inside-the-book format.

INSPIRED BY THE HOLY SPIRIT

As part of our Renew My Church efforts in building our new reality to become a vibrant faith community that seeks to make disciples, build church and serve others, we look to the Holy Spirit for guidance and strive to be BOLD in all that we do! That can manifest itself in many ways, that the possibilities are endless. We wanted to share with you one of the (visible) steps our Senior Leadership Team decided to take to help us be more bold!

On June 16th, the Feast of the Holy Trinity, when we celebrated Father's Day with all the wonderful Dads we know, we invited several men from the parish and our staff to share their thoughts on fatherhood.

We wanted to share with you the text of some of those Father's Day Reflections in this column. They're a great reminder to us that we need to be bold!

This reflection comes to you from Jim Dietz, who spoke at the 7:30am Mass (at St. Philip) on June 16, 2019.

FATHER'S DAY

Good morning! Happy Father's day to all the fathers, grandfathers, great-grandfathers, and perhaps even great-great-grandfathers.

I am a member of the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) for Divine Mercy Parish, a group formed to assist our Pastor, Fr. Lanza, in renewing our parish by focusing on what Christ taught us: to be disciples, to feed his lambs, and to love one another as he loves us. One of the items we discussed recently was the benefit of having members of our parish speak at Mother's and Father's Day Masses to share their personal reflection on the impact of motherhood or fatherhood on them. So, here I am.

Is there any responsibility more important than fatherhood to do what Christ is asking? (certainly many of you may say motherhood!!) If we as fathers, and mothers, are not teaching our children the fundamentals of our faith, are we doing our best for them?

When I think of my own childhood and recall the influence my father had on me, several things pop into my head. Dad was a farmer as was his father. He was the middle child of seven with an equal split of brothers and sisters on either side. The great depression hit in his teenage years and that experience etched a conservative mark on him for the rest of his life, a characteristic he passed on to all of his children.

He was 23 years old when the us entered WWII, ripe for the draft you could say. Three of his brothers were selected to serve in the army and his oldest brother was already married and a father and therefore excluded. Since my grandfather was a farmer and nearly 70 years of age at the start of the war, he needed help on the farm. Being a strong dutiful son, dad was chosen to stay at home while his brothers went off to duty. He always regretted not having the opportunity to serve his country, but he knew his responsibility.

My Mom and Dad married in 1945 near the end of the war. I was born a little over a year later, the first of six over the next eighteen years. Dad realized when I was a young teen that he could not support a growing family on the income an 80-acre farm could provide so he found a job in a factory. He trusted my oldest brother and me (along with the guidance of our mother) to do the bulk of the farming, particularly during our school summer vacations. He taught us well - neither my brother nor I ever wanted to be farmers.

Dad did teach us many values that have carried me through my life - tenacity, responsibility, discipline, respect, and faith in God. His most

important teaching though was to, like him, marry the right woman - and for once I really listened to him. Not only did I marry a beautiful and terrific woman to be the mother of our children, but I gained a relationship with her parents, in particular her father. He loved life. It's he who taught me how to enjoy people. He was not intimidated by anyone or anything and loved playing cards, going dancing, drinking beer, smoking cigars, partying, and laughing. He despised hypocrisy. I miss my dad, and my father- and mother-in-law greatly. Along with my mother they taught me the values to live by.

We all have had individuals in our lives who in one form or another have provided fathering to us. I certainly have had many in my life thus far. Far and away though, my parents and parents-in-law had the greatest influence on me.

I pray that I am providing that same benefit to my own children. As a parent, I believe my primary and perhaps only objective should be to do all I can to assure our children achieve that eternal reward with our Father that we all hope for. I know that I can do more, but I need the Holy Trinity's help.

On this Feast day, and Father's Day, I think about the help and support of the Holy Trinity which we are blessed to have. Our God and Father, because he loves us, is providing the home for us to rest in peace eternally. He wants us to be with him. So much so in fact that he sent his son Jesus to show us the path to get there and to clear the way for us by dying for our sins. The Holy Spirit is providing that conscience and inner strength that we so desperately need to not lose hope when things are not going the way we would like, to have the courage to step forward every day, and to love unconditionally.

What You Need to Know

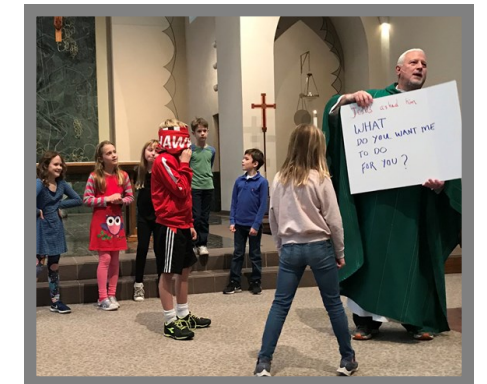
- Religious Education has a new name: Children's Ministry.
- Children's Ministry will be led by Sue Lehocky, the new Director of Evangelization and Lifelong Formation at Divine Mercy. Sue will be assisted by a Coordinator of Children's Ministry, to be hired in the near future.
- We have a new, creative plan to rejuvenate Sunday morning faith formation. This new approach will feature less time "in the classroom" and more time connecting faith to everyday life. Key features are Gospel based lessons, increased parental involvement, service and prayer sessions.
- We will offer 2 programs—Sunday Morning Children's Ministry and Family Faith Connection
- Beginning July 1, 2019, there will be **one** Children's Ministry program for both Sacred Heart and St. Philip the Apostle. Both sites will continue to host Sunday morning Children's Ministry. Family Faith Connection will be held at the Sacred Heart site.
- Catechists and volunteers will still be needed at both sites.
- Divine Mercy families can register their children at either campus.
