FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

LOOK HOW FAR WE'VE COME

This Monday is the first-year anniversary of Divine Mercy parish. It's only been twelve months.

We've come a long way since then. I think it's important to acknowledge just precisely what has transpired to combine St. Philip the Apostle and Sacred Heart, the two former parishes, into one.

The lay leadership groups began to meet together as soon as the merger occurred. The combined Parish Council and Finance Council have continued to do so, along with the combined Religious Education Board. Their members are comprised of people who made up the former councils and boards. As we get into the fall months, one of the tasks of each of these councils is to ratify new guidance documents appropriate for our new parish.

The staff of the new parish, made up of members of the former staffs, met together every other week. While this combined staff meeting attends to the usual parish details of administration and ministry. We spend a considerable amount of time getting to know one another and share our hopes and dreams for the new parish. We also have articulated our shared core values. The parish staff members also now have revised job descriptions that reflect the direction toward renewal and evangelization that the Archdiocese desires all parishes to eventually pursue.

With the help of the combined Religious Education Board and staff members, we looked to further innovate our children's ministry in order to meet the formation needs of grammar school children in the parish. What has resulted is a unified program that will, for the most part, be offered at each of the campuses. The work of innovation in this area

certainly will continue. We very much desire to do everything we can to form young disciples who are on fire with the faith and who know and love Jesus Christ.

A new group, the Senior Leadership Team (SLT), was formed. It is made up of four staff members, two lay people (one from each campus) and me. The purpose of the SLT is to ensure that what we are pursuing in the parish is revitalization, renewal and missionary discipleship at all levels consistent with our parish vision statement.

Some of the next topics under discussion at the SLT are: improving the weekend liturgical experience (music, cross-over lay ministries, consistent practices at both campuses, creation of a more robust hospitality ministry), the weekday and weekend Mass schedule, and a parish "leadership summit" to be held sometime next year.

In the last few months, the SLT and the Parish Council also examined all of our past special events of the former parishes and formulated a list of potential current and future events along with a tentative schedule. Almost all of the former events have been retained, although some have been combined with other events so that the calendar and lay leaders are not overburdened. We like the direction we're going.

Of course, Alpha will also launch in the fall. The pilot was held over the course of the last 12 weeks, to great success and we are ready to dive in and offer it to everyone.

What is the fundamental change needed for a truly renewed Church?

- Archdiocese: The Cardinal and his staff are responsible for providing vision, resources, and support necessary to lead us to authentic relationship with Christ.

INSPIRED BY THE HOLY SPIRIT

As part of our Renew My Church efforts in building our new reality to become a vibrant faith community that seeks to make disciples, build church and serve others, we look to the Holy Spirit for guidance and strive to be BOLD in all that we do! That can manifest itself in many ways, that the possibilities are endless. We wanted to share with you one of the (visible) steps our Senior Leadership Team decided to take to help us be more bold!

On June 16th, the Feast of the Holy Trinity, when we celebrated Father's Day with all the wonderful Dads we know, we invited several men from the parish and our staff to share their thoughts on fatherhood.

We wanted to share with you the text of some of those Father's Day Reflections in this column. They're a great reminder to us that we need to be bold!

This reflection comes to you from Joe McGowan, who spoke at the 5:00pm Mass (at Sacred Heart) on June 15, 2019.

In today's gospel reading, Jesus says "Everything that the Father has is mine." For most people, their first impressions of fatherhood come through their experiences with their own dads. For me, I had a terrific role model in my father, who projected the image of someone who is loving, stern, responsible and morally straight. From those images, us future fathers make some adjustments. Maybe we try to listen better or be more lenient than our predecessors. However, overall I would be thrilled if someone told me that all of the attributes my dad had, I have as well.

As a man prepares for fatherhood, his enthusiasm and anxiety both equally grow. One questions whether they have what it takes to be a successful father. They read books and consult family and friends. However, nothing quite prepares you for the news that you are about to become a dad.

So what exactly is fatherhood? I do not know how anyone else defines it, but after more than 20 years as a dad and fathering 3 girls, I will tell you how I define it.

- It is the thrill of hearing the first word out of your child's mouth be "dada".
- It is watching them mimic you.
- It is having the soccer coach pull you aside to ask you to be a bit less intense during your child's games.
- It is flying through rush hour traffic to arrive on time for their violin performance.
- It is telling your family members really funny jokes, which they refer to as "dad jokes", while they merely snicker in response.
- It is holding your 3-year-old and having them unexpectedly puke all over your sweater right before guests arrive for the Christmas party you are hosting.
- It is comforting your daughter after a classmate says mean things to her or excludes her from a fun activity.
- It is having your children roll their eyes when you wear Elvis Presley sunglasses and do impersonations of the King.
- It is questioning the fifth-grade teacher as to whether there are more books to read and math problems to solve over the summer to better prepare your kid for 6th grade.
- It is having your children stare at you in shock and disbelief when you scream at the TV while watching your alma mater's basketball team play during March Madness.
- It is trying not to cringe while your child drives the car over a curb while practicing with her drivers permit.

 And finally, it is the immense sense of pride in watching your girls grow into the beautiful, successful and self-confident women you prayed that they would become.

The most special part of this awesome journey has been sharing it with my wondrous wife of 22 years, Lisa. I could not wish for a better parenting partner. I look forward to enjoying more wonderful moments with my family.

To conclude my thoughts on fatherhood, I address "What is Father's Day?" I recognize that this day has many different meanings to people. A year ago, I was in a much more somber mood as the day marked the one-year anniversary of my father's passing after fighting blood cancer.

Today I have a much happier outlook as the day approaches. The answer is that Fathers Day is a celebration where we recognize fathers for who they are and what they mean to us. For us dads, it is a time where we can have some fun while our children grin and bear it.


