4:30 PM MASS TO FEATURE PRAISE & WORSHIP ENSEMBLE: WELCOME MATTHIEU MIELING

Beginning in September, the Sunday 4:30p.m. Mass at Sacred Heart Church will feature an ensemble that will incorporate some 'praise and worship' music in the liturgy. What is 'praise and worship' music? It is a defined genre of music used in contemporary worship. It has developed over the past sixty years and is stylistically similar to pop music. The songs are frequently referred to as "praise songs" or "worship songs" and are typically led by a band or ensemble, with either a guitarist or pianist leading.

Matthieu Mieling will lead our 4:30pm ensemble, and act as the lead cantor. Matthieu is a Vocalist based out of Chicago. He sings a variety of genres including Jazz, Soul, Rock, and Contemporary Christian music. Mathieu



is completing his degree in Jazz Studies, emphasizing in Vocal Performance, and studies under famous Studio Singer, Cheryl Wilson.

Mathieu's home Parish is St. Mary of the Woods in Edgebrook, a neighborhood on the north side of Chicago. He soon became an active part of their music ministry, and is an active member of the Liturgical and Youth Choirs. He also plays congas and auxiliary percussion in their Contemporary choir. He is also a regular Cantor.

Respect for Life is the Path to Peace
"The path to the attainment of the common good and to peace is above all that of respect for human life in all its many aspects, beginning with its conception, through its development and up to its natural end. Every offence against life,

especially at its beginning, inevitably causes irreparable damage to development, peace and the environment. Neither is it just to introduce surreptitiously into legislation false rights or freedoms which, on the basis of a reductive and relativistic view of human beings and the clever use of ambiguous expressions aimed at promoting a supposed right to abortion and euthanasia, pose a threat to the fundamental right to life."

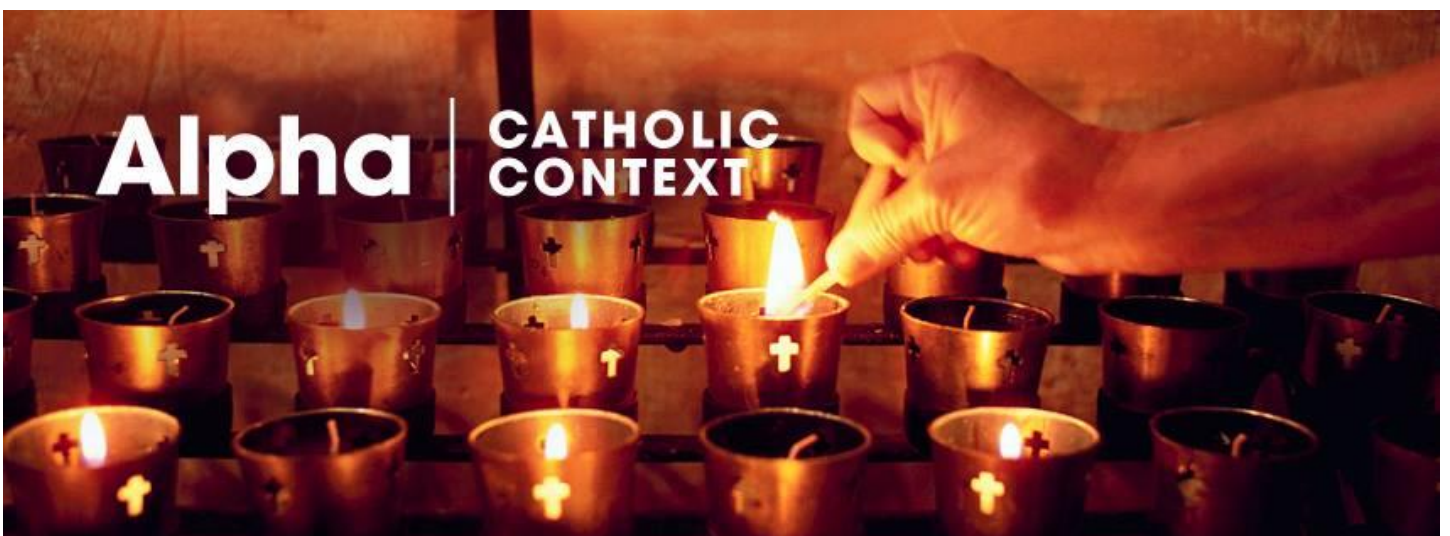

On June 16th, the Feast of the Holy Trinity, when we celebrated Father's Day with all the wonderful Dads we know, we invited several men from the parish and our staff to share their thoughts on fatherhood.

We wanted to share with you the text of some of those Father's Day Reflections in this column. They're a great reminder to us that we need to be bold!

This reflection comes to you from Nino Miceli, who spoke at the 9:30a.m. Mass (at St. Philip) on June 16, 2019.

When I think of Father's Day, I do not think about myself first, but rather of my own father. I guess it has not sunken in yet that I am a father after four and half years since my first daughter was born.

My father immigrated to this country to find a better life with the promise of the American Dream. His life towards the American Dream was not an easy one and full of hardship and adversity. Besides the long hours of working in what we would today consider "dirty jobs", my father also endured ridicule from others simply because he was an immigrant who spoke with an accent.

However, my father never complained about his difficult early days as a young man in this foreign country. He never

told me about this, but rather these stories were told to me by his family and friends. My father's faith in God surely helped him endure these afflictions.

Also, I remember stories of what a kind, generous and trustworthy man my father was.

As today's Second reading from St. Paul to the Romans says, endurance produces proven character. As I raise my two young daughters, I constantly see how difficult it is to raise them and how much my parents sacrificed to raise me. It is very true that you never really understand your parents until you grow up, have kids, and basically turn into them! I see myself doing and saying the same things to my kids as my parents did and said to me when I was growing up. My father did not see me get married and have kids.

My faith in God gives me the strength and hope that one day, I can meet my dad in heaven and say thank you for helping me become a father.

POPE ANNOUNCES THEMES FOR UPCOMING WORLD YOUTH DAY CELEBRATIONS

ROME - Announcing the themes for the next three World Youth Day celebrations, Pope Francis called on young men and women to meditate on the path of Christian life that God has called them to walk.

Note: Have you ever considered attending World Youth Day? Two parishioner families (the Kurts and the Kengotts) attended World Youth Day in Krakow, Poland in 2016. Ask them about it! They would love sharing their story!

Maria Kurt shared, "One of my objectives in taking my two daughters to World Youth Day in Krakow was for them to witness a strong and vibrant Catholic faith. Attending mass with 3 million fellow worshipers gave us all a renewal of hope and peace as well as fabulous memories for a lifetime."

Meeting with 280 young people from 109 countries who took part in a post-synod Youth Forum in Rome June 22, the pope said he hoped the themes of the World Youth Day celebrations for the next three years will be a "harmonious coordination" between the synod process and the next international celebration of World Youth Day in Lisbon, Portugal, in 2022.

"Do not tune out the voice of God, who urges you to arise and follow the paths that he has prepared for you," the pope told the young adults.

The Dicastery for Laity, the Family and Life had asked bishops' conferences around the world to identify two young adult leaders to participate in the forum, which was held at a retreat center just south of Rome.

According to the Vatican, the themes chosen by the pope for the World Youth Day celebrations were:

For 2020: "Young man, I tell you, arise!" (Lk 7,14)

For 2021: "Arise! I have appointed you as a witness of what you have seen." (Acts 26,16)

For 2022: "Mary arose and went with haste." (Lk 1:39)

World Youth Day is celebrated

annually on a local level and every two or three years with an international gathering with the pope. The annual Rome diocesan celebration with the pope is on Palm Sunday each year; the date of the celebration in other dioceses varies.

Speaking to the Youth Forum participants, the pope said that like the disciples of Emmaus, who upon recognizing the resurrected Christ set out on a journey to announce what they witnessed, today's young people also are "called to bring the light of Christ into the darkness of the world."

"You, dear young people, are called to be light in the dark night experienced by so many of your friends who do not yet know the joy of new life in Jesus," he said.

He also said that Jesus can be found above all in their communities and encouraged them to return to their homes and spread the Good News like the disciples because "the more we bring him to others, the more we will feel his presence in our lives."

"The Emmaus account tells us that Jesus lit a fire in the hearts of

NORTH SIDE KAIROS

North Side Kairos is a 4-day retreat for North Side Chicago teens who have just completed their Sophomore, Junior, or Senior years of high school. This year's retreat will take place at the Bellarmine Jesuit Retreat House on August 9-12, 2019.

Kairos Retreats are well known throughout the Chicagoland area. Many Catholic high schools have Kairos retreats on a regular basis. This particular Kairos is unique because of its diversity. The youth who participate in and lead this particular Kairos come from both public and Catholic high schools. They come from many different parishes in the city and the suburbs, and this Kairos is co-educational, which many are not. This retreat is also led by trained peer leaders. With appropriate adult

leadership from priests and male and female lay ministers, we feel this Kairos is the best possible environment for a Catholic retreat. And even though a participant need not be Catholic to be on the retreat, this diversity creates a safe environment to understand the richness of our Catholic community.
