

# FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

### MASS ETIQUTTE

It's good from time to time to review the Church's expectations on how we are to celebrate the parts of the Mass. In that vein, I'd like to go over a few things with you.

# The Fast Before Mass

The Church asks all those who will be celebrating the Mass with the intent of receiving Communion to fast from all food and drink (except water) for one hour before Mass. The purpose of this fasting is to prepare one's self physically for the reception of Jesus in the Eucharist.

The other exception to this rule is for those who must eat or drink due to medical conditions such as diabetes or other similar conditions. Likewise, medications are not considered food or drink.

### Proper Attire

When we are in church we are on holy ground. If you were a guest in someone's house because they're throwing a party, you'd generally dress up as a sign of respect to the hosts. This is the same for attendance at Mass.

Notice I'm not being real detailed here. There's a wide range of what people would consider tasteful and appropriate. I leave it up to your own good judgment. Sleep wear and pool wear aren't generally considered to be appropriate for Mass.

# **Getting There On Time**

Late-comers are always welcome but it's best not to make this a regular practice. The constant flow of bodies entering the assembly late makes for a less-than-desirable celebration because it breaks the spirit of the assembly. Would you do this in a theatre? (Most theatre ushers don't let you come in once the performance has started.) For the same reason, it's really good for people to make the effort to arrive in church before Mass starts.

# Reception of Communion in the Hand

The proper way to receive Communion in the hand is to cup one hand in the other so that the top hand is palm -open. The minister of Communion places the host in that open hand. This is important because Communion must always be received, not taken. So in the case of Communion in the hand, we're talking about not reaching out and grabbing the host using your fingers. In other words, the Eucharist is a gift which is given or bestowed on us by God, so grabbing is not an option—except for those who literally, physically cannot cup one hand in the other.

# Reception of the Precious Blood

If you are going to drink from the chalice then you must go through the physical action of drinking, precisely because that is the liturgical action in which we engage at that point: in order to manifest the fullness of the sacramental act (eating and *drinking*). In other words, the act at this point is not eating and "dunking," it's eating and drinking. The formal term for "dunking" the host in the Precious Blood is *intinction*.

Self-intinction is not permitted. In fact, the word in the Church documents governing this is "forbidden." Why can't you receive a host and then walk it over to a minister of the chalice and dip it into the Precious Blood? Because, once again, no one can take Communion, it must be received. The Church judges selfintinction to be taking rather than receiving. Again, the other reason upon which this rests is the sacramental action of actually drinking, versus dunking or dipping. It may seem like splitting hairs or making too fine a distinction, but I'm not the one making the rules here, it's the universal Church which regulates how we celebrate Mass. I'm just passing on to you what the Church says about all this.



Like I said at the beginning, it's good to know what's expected of us. Following through on expectations help to bind us as one, as opposed to a collection of individuals each doing what he or she wants to do.

Obviously, in educating ourselves in these matters we never want to lose sight of the heart of the matter which is that the Mass is the privileged place to deepen our relationship with the Lord Jesus within his household among the community of the faithful. That's why we gather. That's why we pray and sing and celebrate the holy Presence that makes us who we are.

# HEALING OURSELVES & THE WORLD FROM A PLACE OF CENTERING PRAYER

Is God calling you to more stillness in your life? Come learn a prayer method based on the early Christian, contemplative tradition. Centering Prayer is a method of silent prayer in which we experience God's presence within us.

New Centering Prayer groups will begin in September. The first 4-6 weeks focus on the theological foundation of Centering Prayer and on contemplative outreach to further the knowledge and experience of God's love in the consciousness of the human family. The foundation of Centering Prayer is the Divine Presence in every human person. The divine action is the healing process of transformation in Christ, enabling us to experience intimacy with God and the practical caring for others that flows from this relationship. The Divine transformation is the gift of the

Holy Spirit and the source of all the good that God is accomplishing through us.

- In order to be well grounded in the background of Centering Prayer, beginners will learn the Christian Contemplative tradition in dialogue with contemporary psychology, science and the wisdom teaching of other religions.
- As participants sensitivity to the spiritual dimension of their being develops, the first steps of Centering Prayer will be taught. Since Vatican Il the Church has been encouraging Catholics to live the fullness of the Christian life without expecting priests, religious, or anyone else to do it for us. That implies creativity, as well as responsibility on the part of lay people to come up with structures that will enable us to live the contemplative dimension of the Gospel in everyday life in the world.

Centering Prayer Group Sessions resume in September on Thursdays, Sept. 6th at 7pm and on Saturdays, Sept. 8th at 9am. If you want a headstart, purchase a new edition of *Open Mind, Open Heart* by Fr. Thomas Keating.


# **SEPTEMBER 8th!**
