

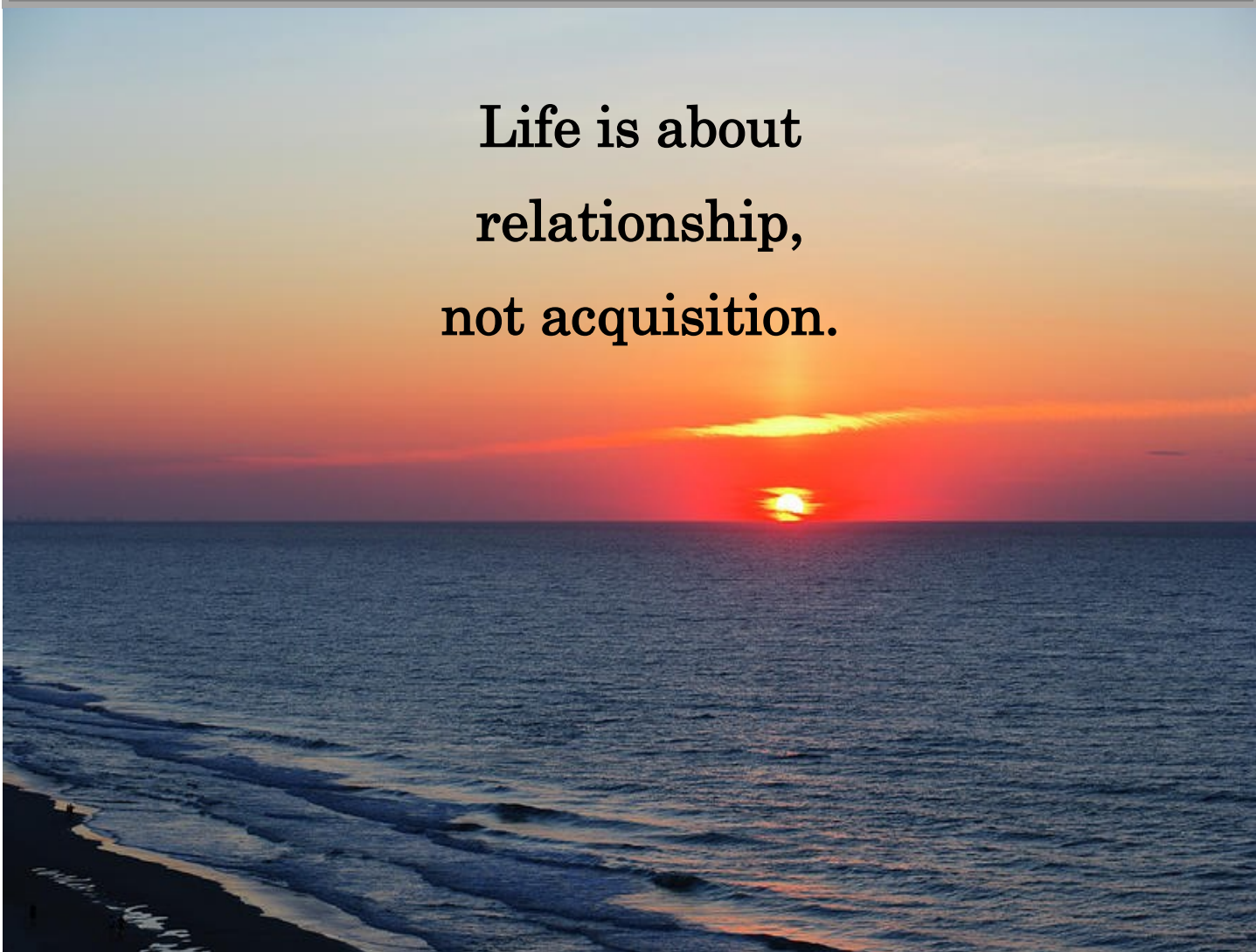

FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

I wrote the following column for a monthly newsletter that goes out to all the priests of the Archdiocese. I thought you might be interested in what it is that I wrote for them.

ONE YEAR LATER

Divine Mercy parish is now one year old. It is the result of combining the former Sacred Heart and St. Philip the Apostle parishes. That combining, in turn, is the result of the discernment process of *Renew My Church*.

I've been asked, "Is it all you expected?" The short answer is, "Yes, it's about what I expected. And also, no, there are things in this process of combining and merging that I did not expect."

Here are the main surprises or unexpected stuff. Spoiler alert, it's almost all good.

Lots of help. I truly did not expect the amount of assistance we have received from the Archdiocese. This came, first and foremost, in the form of the two project managers, one for phase four and another for phase five. They both were on-site at least once a week, if not more. They acted as indispensable liaisons to the various departments of the Archdiocese so that our questions and needs were handled very quickly and efficiently. And we had tons of questions and needs in both phases.

Forgetful. I didn't anticipate how often I would need to refresh my memory on key insights and ways of proceeding that we pastors learned at the start of *Renew My Church* through the Priest Leadership Program. Some of those key insights and ways of proceeding entailed information on leading change in an organization and communication for change. I've gone back to those notes again and again to refresh my memory. I realize that these are important for an organization as it addresses where it's at and where it

needs to go.

Abundance of Outside Resources.

There are all sorts of resources available to us outside of the Archdiocese that have helped us move through phase five, the revitalization phase of RMC. Membership in the Divine Renovation Network has been a huge help. The Archdiocese has paid for us to be members and this has been invaluable. The DR Network provides personal coaching for myself and coaching for the Senior Leadership Team. I'm also a part of a pastor cohort that meets monthly through videoconferencing with Fr. James Mallon for further support and encouragement as we move from maintenance to mission. The DR Network also provides a ton of podcasts for the Senior Leadership Team, myself, and the parish staff to watch, consider and talk about. Finally, the Alpha organization in the USA has also been a source of support as we seek to promote and run Alpha. I'm also liking everything that Carey Nieuwhof writes, especially his newest book, *Lasting Impact: Seven Powerful Conversations that Will Help Your Church Grow*. This particular book is a good complement to James Mallon's *Divine Renovation*.

Gobs of Time. I did not expect the sheer amount of time needed to effect the transition to a combined parish operation. Taking two places, two parishes and merging them into one parish with two campuses has taken an enormous amount of time and effort among staff. Maybe that's because I like things to be organized and fairly efficient. Perhaps other pastoral leaders in other situations would be more comfortable with less consistency regarding procedures, but that's not me. And this, of course, will not apply to every RMC situation, since not all places will be the result of a combining.



Nonetheless, we've been at it for a year and we are *still* not precisely where we need to be in terms of office procedures, ministry efforts and staff reorganization due to the combining.

Excitement of Re-Envisioning. I'd have to say the biggest, most pleasant surprise has been the excitement and energy created around our focus on evangelization and revitalization. Lay leaders are genuinely excited about new possibilities: entertaining ideas, talking about who we want to be as a parish, exploring new avenues and ways of doing things as a faith community. We recently had a Parish Council meeting that I wasn't sure would be a positive, upbeat event. And yet it was. Folks from both campuses want this combining to work. They truly want us to move forward as a parish, not backwards. And they are willing to try new things to achieve that newness and vitality.

God bless the wonderfully committed people of our parishes! God bless initiative! God bless God for planting gospel seeds of change and growth in our hearts!

MEET ST. DOMINIC

We celebrate the Feast day of St. Dominic this week on August 8th. St. Dominic has an interesting background. "If he hadn't taken a trip with his bishop, Dominic would probably have remained within the structure of contemplative life; after the trip, he spent the rest of his life being a contemplative in active apostolic work."



Born in old Castile, Spain, Dominic was trained for the priesthood by a priest-uncle, studied the arts and theology, and became a canon of the cathedral at Osma, where there was an attempt to revive the apostolic common life described in Acts of the Apostles.

On a journey through France with his bishop, Dominic came face to face with the then virulent Albigensian heresy at Languedoc. The Albigensians—or Cathari, "the pure ones"—held to two principles—one good, one evil—in the world. All matter is evil—hence they denied the Incarnation and the sacraments. On the same principle, they abstained from procreation and took a minimum of food and drink. The inner circle led what some people regarded as a heroic life of purity and asceticism not shared by ordinary followers.

Dominic sensed the need for the Church to combat this heresy, and was commissioned to be part of the preaching crusade against it. He saw immediately why the preaching crusade was not succeeding: the ordinary people admired and followed the ascetical heroes of the Albigenses. Understandably, they were not impressed by the Catholic preachers who traveled with horse and retinues, stayed at the best inns and had servants. Dominic therefore, with three Cistercians, began itinerant preaching according to the gospel ideal. He continued this work for 10 years, being successful with the ordinary people but not with the leaders.

His fellow preachers gradually became a community, and in 1215 Dominic founded a religious house at Toulouse, the beginning of the Order of Preachers or Dominicans. Dominic's ideal, and that of his Order, was to organically link a life with God, study, and prayer in all forms, with a ministry of salvation to people by the word of God. His ideal: *contemplata tradere*: "to pass on the fruits of contemplation" or "to speak only of God or with God."

THE DEDICATION OF THE BASILICA OF ST. MARY MAJOR, AUGUST 5th

Why does the Church recognize the dedication of this Basilica? Following the declaration of Mary as "God-bearer" by the Council of Ephesus in the year 431, Pope Sixtus III rebuilt this church in Rome, now considered to be the oldest Basilica in the West dedicated to the Mother of God.

"St. Mary Major is one of the four Roman basilicas known as patriarchal cathedrals in memory of the first centers of the Church. St.

John Lateran represents Rome, the See of Peter; St. Paul Outside the Walls, the See of Alexandria, allegedly the see presided over by Mark; St. Peter's, the See of Constantinople; and St. Mary's, the See of Antioch, where Mary is supposed to have spent most of her later life.

One legend, unreported before the year 1000, gives another name to this feast: Our Lady of the Snows. According to that story, a wealthy Roman couple pledged their fortune to the Mother of God. In affirmation, she produced a miraculous summer snowfall and told them to build a church on the site. The legend was long celebrated by releasing a shower of white rose petals from the basilica's dome every August 5."

NORTH SIDE KAIROS

North Side Kairos is a 4-day retreat for North Side Chicago teens who have just completed their Sophomore, Junior, or Senior years of high school. This year's retreat will take place at the Bellarmine Jesuit Retreat House on August 9-12, 2019.

Kairos Retreats are well known throughout the Chicagoland area. Many Catholic high schools have Kairos retreats on a regular basis. This particular Kairos is unique because of its diversity. The youth who participate in and lead this particular Kairos come from both public and Catholic high schools. They come from many different parishes in the city and the suburbs, and this Kairos is co-educational, which many are not. This retreat is also led by trained peer

leaders. With appropriate adult leadership from priests and male and female lay ministers, we feel this Kairos is the best possible environment for a Catholic retreat. And even though a participant need not be Catholic to be on the retreat, this diversity creates a safe environment to understand the richness of our Catholic community.
