FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

COMMON MASS SETTING

Our parish is comprised of two houses of worship. Each place has its own Director of Music. Each place has its own repertoire of music which is used at Mass, a repertoire that has been built up over a long period of time.

However, we are now one parish, one community. In talking with our two Directors of Music, an idea surfaced which will help express how we are one community comprised of two houses of worship. The idea is that both places will adopt the same musical setting for use at weekend Masses.

Rather than adopt a setting already in use, which would favor one place over another, we determined that a brand new setting will be introduced, taught and used in both places. The two Directors checked what's available out there from the various music publishers and settled on two possibilities. They ran them by me and we settled on one which was then vetted by the combined staff of the parish, as well as the liturgy committee.

The new Mass setting is composed by Fr Ricky Manalo CSP. It's his "Mass of Spirit and Grace." We will begin to introduce this musical setting in early September. I'm sure you can go

somewhere on line or on YouTube and listen to pieces from this Mass, whether that's the Gloria, the Holy Holy, or the Lamb of God. Those who are good at finding this kind of stuff on line, check it out.

Enjoy! And get ready to sing the praises of God at liturgy.

That is, of course, one of the main functions of gathering to celebrate liturgy: to praise God for his manifold graces to us, his many blessings. Truly, Spirit and Grace are what gathers us as one, even as our united parish comes together in two houses of worship.



MINISTERING TO THE SICK

Responding with compassion to those who are sick is a universal Gospel mandate. From this mandate, we are inspired by the healing aspect of the ministry of Christ. In the spirit of His compassion, the Catholic Church trains and commissions ministers to visit the sick, bring them Holy Communion,



and pray with them. In some cases of serious illness, parishioners notify the parish to request a priest visit their loved one at home or in the hospital. Priests may help people heal through the Sacrament of Reconciliation and anoint them with the Oil of the Infirm, in the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick.

Divine Mercy Parish is blessed with many Ministers of Care who are well trained and prayerfully visit individual homes, nursing homes and hospitals. We thank them for their ministry and their devotion to the sick and homebound of our parish.

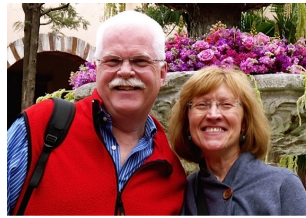
In my day job, I am the Director of

Since 2003, I've been assigned to Mundelein Seminary and in 2005 Cardinal George appointed me director of the seminary's Institute for Diaconal Studies, which forms deacons for the archdiocese. I've also assisted at St. Philip the Apostle for 15 years.

Prior to my call to diaconate, I wrote features and travel for the Chicago Sun-Times. During my 15 years writing for the paper, I had the opportunity to travel the country and the world. I've also written 31 books, mostly travel-related, though my latest focuses on diaconal ministry.

University of Nebraska. I've also taught at U of I, NU, Lewis University, and currently teach liturgical theology and rites practice at the seminary.



I'm an avid outdoorsman and spent many summers working on family farms in Wisconsin and Illinois and ranches in Texas and Oklahoma — doing everything from milking cows and herding cattle to stretching barb wire fences and mucking out stalls. I've also played hockey since I can remember and am a crazed Blackhawks fan.

Most important to me is my faith and family ... my love for the Lord and his Church, and my wife, Debbie and our two daughters — both blessed with successful media careers and incredible work ethics.

So join us and bring along your blankets and your lawn chairs! We'll have some chairs available for the seniors, so they don't have to worry about seating.

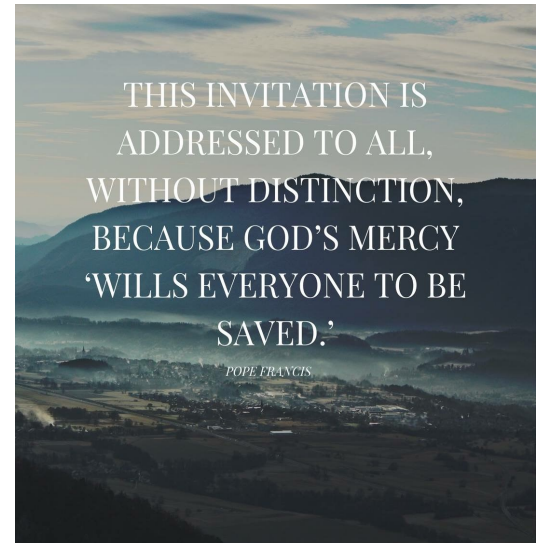

HEALING OURSELVES & THE WORLD FROM A PLACE OF CENTERING PRAYER

Is God calling you to more stillness in your life? Come learn a prayer method based on the early Christian, contemplative tradition. Centering Prayer is a method of silent prayer in which we experience God's presence within us.

New Centering Prayer groups will begin in September. The first 4-6 weeks focus on the theological foundation of Centering Prayer and on contemplative outreach to further the knowledge and experience of God's love in the consciousness of the human family. The foundation of Centering Prayer is the Divine Presence in every human person. The divine action is the healing process of transformation in Christ, enabling us to experience intimacy with God and the practical caring for others that

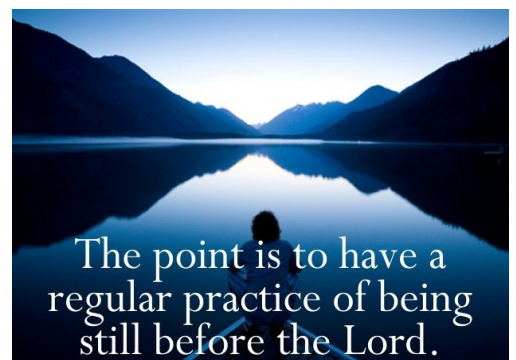
flows from this relationship. The Divine transformation is the gift of the Holy Spirit and the source of all the good that God is accomplishing through us.

- In order to be well grounded in the background of Centering Prayer, beginners will learn the Christian Contemplative tradition in dialogue with contemporary psychology, science and the wisdom teaching of other religions.
- As participants sensitivity to the spiritual dimension of their being develops, the first steps of Centering Prayer will be taught. Since Vatican II the Church has been encouraging Catholics to live the fullness of the Christian life without expecting priests, religious, or anyone else to do it for us. That implies creativity, as well as responsibility on the part of lay people to come up with structures that will enable us to live the

contemplative dimension of the Gospel in everyday life in the world.

Centering Prayer Group Sessions resume in September on Thursdays, Sept. 6th at 7pm and on Saturdays, Sept. 8th at 9am. If you want a head-start, purchase a new edition of **Open Mind, Open Heart** by Fr. Thomas Keating.

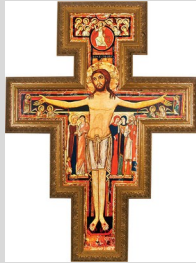
PRAYER FOR *RENEW MY CHURCH*

one God, forever and ever. Amen.

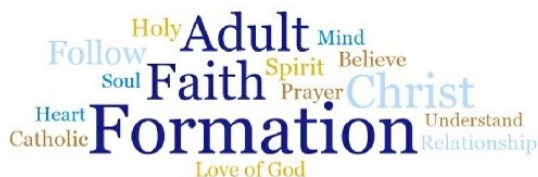


ADULT FORMATION

31 MINUTES FOR PEACE CHALLENGE

The Midwest Jesuits Facebook page recently included a post from Br. Matt Wooters, SJ referencing the challenge to take 31 minutes each day to pray for peace. They referenced the website www.31minsforpeace.com, which included the following reflection from one of their blog contributors.

It is important when taking time for meditation and prayer to understand the Source of the Peace we seek and find. For Peace exists as an unchanging state independent of the day to day activities we observe in this world. Through meditation and prayer we do not seek to find Peace in this world of never ending change and dis-ease. We find it at it's Source.

This is why so many meditation and prayer practices involve removing distractions. We learn to breath and sit quietly or walk in nature. We clear our minds and let go of thoughts of our day to day activities. We Forgive ourselves and others of times that have seemingly brought pain. When we do this, we find ourselves melting into Peace.

It can create some cognitive dissonance to realize that Peace exists all of the time. What if something happens in this world of change that we believe warrants anger, sadness, guilt or fear? Do we choose to stop experiencing eternal Peace so that we can experience getting upset about something? What about the times we don't actually feel Peace but we're still aware that it exists out there somewhere? These thoughts can occur even during our times of meditation and prayer!

For these reasons, let us be gently vigilant with ourselves. Let us use inspiring times, like a 31 Days for Peace Challenge, to establish healthy habits where we take more time to meditate and pray regularly. Over time, let us nurture our desire for Peace, because if we're honest, there are times we don't act like we want Peace at all, even though deep down, of course we do.

Don't worry if your life and the world around you don't seem at peace. Chances are, they won't. Remember, the Source of Peace is not of this world. It can shine into this world and be represented here to an extent. But nothing in this world is eternal and unchanging therefore nothing here will ever truly reflect the Peace you can feel within from meditation and prayer. For the Source of Peace and the Source of Who We Are is the same. We are not of this world, even if we seem in it.

Give yourself permission and encouragement to go deeper into your connection with Peace. Share the practice with someone else to strengthen it. And, Peace Be With Us All!

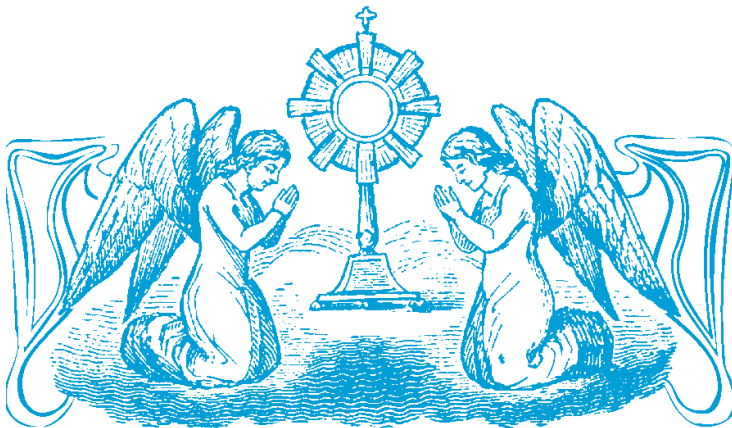
