FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

STILL IN PHASE FOUR

We continue to work hard to combine what had been two parishes into one new parish whose name is Divine Mercy. This is all part of Cardinal Cupich's initiative known as Renew My Church.

The newly combined staff continues to meet this summer or what's left of it. We are also preparing for the Archdiocesan-wide Renew My Church summit on October 1-3 at the Donald E. Stephens Convention Center.

Yes, the Archdiocese needs a venue that big. All the priests are invited to attend, as well as all the permanent deacons and school principals. In addition, each pastor has been encouraged to invite a number of staff and parishioners to this event.

Remember that I wrote to you about my attending a conference in Halifax, Canada? That's because I can't attend the October summit here, and the one held in Canada is very similar to what we will experience here in the Archdiocese. The author of Divine Renovation, Father James Mallon, is the main presenter at the summit (just as he was in Canada, too). Even though our new parish is currently in phase four of Renew My Church, the summit looks towards phase five. All parishes in the Archdiocese, whether they are the result of a combining or not, will enter phase five of Renew My Church, for that phase is the heart of the whole thing: concerned with revitalization, evangelization and building up the Church of Chicago to serve all and spread the gospel more effectively.

The point of the summit is to foster the vitality of the Archdiocese in all its parishes, to articulate a shared vision of where we are going, to learn together and experience an inspiring message that will prepare us for the tasks ahead.

As we get closer to the October summit, I will share with you the names of those from our parish who will be attending. Please continue to pray for the success of Renew My Church. We've never done anything remotely like this in our Archdiocese, or taken on anything as challenging. Prayer will be a vital key which opens before us the future God intends for us.

UP FOR SOME READING?



Join us as we say farewell to summer and celebrate families at the Table of the Lord!








HEALING OURSELVES & THE WORLD FROM A PLACE OF CENTERING PRAYER

KEYNOTE SPEAKER: SR. HELEN PREJEAN

Sister Helen Prejean is known around the world for her tireless work against the death penalty. She has been instrumental in sparking national dialogue on capital punishment and in shaping the Catholic Church's newly vigorous opposition to all executions. In 1982, Sister Helen started corresponding with Patrick Sonnier, sentenced to die in the electric chair of Louisiana's Angola State Prison for the murder of two teenagers. Sonnier asked her to become his spiritual advisor and she accepted. In 1984, Elmo Patrick Sonnier was put to death in the electric chair. Sister Helen was there to witness his execution.

In the following months, she became spiritual advisor to another death row inmate, Robert Lee Willie, who soon met the same fate as Sonnier.



SR. PREJEAN (CONTINUED)

After witnessing this second execution, Sister Helen realized that this lethal act would remain hidden unless she spoke up about it. She came together with others to hold execution vigils and to march to draw attention to the issue. She founded a support group for victims' family members called Survive. And she sat down and wrote a book, Dead Man Walking: An Eyewitness Account of the Death Penalty in the United States. Dead Man Walking ignited a national debate on capital punishment and it inspired an Academy Award winning movie, a play and an opera.

Over twenty years later and with capital punishment still practiced in 32 states, Sister Helen divides her time between campaigning

against the death penalty, counseling individual death row prisoners, and working with murder victims' family members. She has accompanied five more men to their deaths and is currently spiritual advisor to Manuel Ortiz, a man she believes is innocent of the crime that has put him on death row at Angola for over 23 years.

Sister Helen is currently at work on her third book, River of Fire.

MENS ANNUAL RETREAT Bellarmine Jesuit Retreat House, Barrington, IL October 5-7, 2018

Our annual retreat will be led by Fr. Paul Mueller, S.J. He will help us to contemplate two interrelated themes. First the glory of God's creation, Second God's justice and mercy.

Father Mueller, ordained in 1993, earned an MS in Physics and a PhD in History & Philosophy at the University of Chicago. Since 2010 he has been assigned to the Vatican Observatory, the astronomical research institute of the Popes, first as religious Superior of the Jesuit community and as a member of the research staff, and since 2015 he has also assumed the role as Vice Director of the Observatory.

St. PHILIP THE APOSTLE TO TEACH WHO CHRIST IS CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTORS

In 2015 St. Philip the Apostle Parish participated in the Archdiocesan TO TEACH WHO CHRIST IS (TTWCI) capital campaign to benefit important ministries in the Archdiocese of Chicago and our own parish. Our goal was \$550,000, of which \$330,000 (60%) was to remain with St. Philip parish.

Within St. Philip, four areas in need of funding were identified. They were church roof repair, \$150,000; vestibule renovation, \$50,000; school gymnasium updates, \$75,000; and a fund to provide financial aid for PREP families.

Through the overwhelming generosity of our parishioners, St. Philip collections and pledges totaled nearly \$1,050,000. Any funds collected or pledged in excess of our parish goal stayed in full with our parish. Therefore, \$830,000 were collected for the benefit of St. Philip parish. In 2015 repairs to the church roof were completed at a cost of nearly \$330,000. Vestibule renovations were finished in early 2017 at the allocated amount of \$50,000. Currently updates to the school gymnasium are underway and the costs are expected to be within the \$75,000 allocated. Together with the \$55,000 for the PREP financial aid

fund, a total of \$510,000 of the \$830,000 will have been invested, leaving a balance of \$320,000 for the benefit of St. Philip. As Father Steve Lanza mentioned in his article in last week's bulletin, any pledges made and paid towards St. Philip's TTWCI campaign remain at St. Philip in order to fund the various capital expenditures as outlined in the original case statement, and other projects at the St. Philip site deemed necessary.

Recently water inflow issues have plaqued the convent and the St. Philip school building leased by Hyde Park. The issues have been identified as stemming from plugging in storm sewer lines, roof and gutter damage, and brick tuck pointing. Estimates have been developed to complete the necessary work over the next 12-18 months. Total cost of these items will likely be in the range of \$100,000. Funding will be provided from the remaining balance of TTWCI funds. Thank you again for your interest in maintaining the integrity of St. Philip campus, and generous contributions to TTWCI that are providing the funds to effect the necessary updates and repairs.
