FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

A REALLY GOOD FIT

I include the following write up in my column, knowing that the folks who worship at St Philip church already know this stuff, more or less. However, worshippers located at Sacred Heart do not. So I asked the staff of the Hyde Park Day School to provide me with information that I could share with all of you.

Hyde Park Day School leases the school building on the St Philip campus. Hyde Park is a separate operation from that of Divine Mercy parish, but it's a wonderful fit and complements what we do as a community of faith to lift up all those in need.

What follows is a summary of the Hyde Park Day School provided to me by their staff. Enjoy reading it and learning what goes on at HPDS!

At Hyde Park Day School (HPDS), our sole purpose is to help bright first through eighth grade students with learning disabilities reach their full potential. We believe students who receive the appropriate intervention can develop the skills necessary to keep pace in traditional classrooms. We achieve this by teaching our students how to leverage their significant strengths in areas that are difficult, and how to self-advocate for the tools that they need to be successful.

We believe that the complex nature of significant learning disabilities requires a program that focuses on the remediation of fundamental skills, the development of strategies to compensate for learning challenges and the use of appropriate accommodations. This is accomplished through:

- a low student-to-teacher ratio;
- a state-of-the-art technology program;
- an integrated services approach;
- highly talented staff, all with a

comprehensive professional development program;

• a safe, nurturing environment designed to build self-esteem, self-confidence, and a genuine interest in learning.

Hyde Park Day School opened in 2000 in a small converted auditorium on the campus of the University of Chicago. After quickly reaching a maximum enrollment of 40 students, we opened a second campus in Northfield, IL to expand the number of students that we could serve. Similar to the Chicago campus, our Northfield campus quickly grew to its maximum enrollment. Realizing that we were turning away many students, we embarked on a building campaign to replace our Chicago campus in 2011.

We heralded the opening of our new state-of-the-art facility in the Woodlawn neighborhood in the spring of 2014 to further our reach and impact on bright students with learning disabilities. Realizing our potential for growth and continued success, we completed a full strategic plan in January 2016, Vision 2020, which set our vision for the next five years. In addition to codifying the instructional practices at the school, we have also pledged to expand the number of students directly and indirectly served by our program as well to continue to provide the best quality education to our students. As a direct result of this planning process, and years of work and experience behind it, we are happy to announce the opening of our new west suburban campus in Lemont, IL in August, 2018.

Hyde Park Day School is accredited by the North Central Association and The Independent School Association of the Central States. It is also an institutional member of the Lake Michigan Association of Independent Schools and the International



Dyslexia Association.

BACK AT IT

As I write this our own parochial school is back in operation. The first day of the 2018 academic year at Sacred School was this past Tuesday.

I watched as kids entered the building at the opening bell. They ran in! This tells me they wanted to be there, excited for the start of another school year.

The spirit of our school couldn't be stronger or better. Administration and teachers are rested and ready. Students seem to be eager to get back into the swing of things.

It is always an honor for me to share my musical gifts here at Divine Mercy for Sunday Masses, Weddings, Funerals and many other occasions when music is considered to be an important element of celebration.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER: SR. HELEN PREJEAN

Sister Helen Prejean is known around the world for her tireless work against the death penalty. She has been instrumental in sparking national dialogue on capital punishment and in shaping the Catholic Church's newly vigorous opposition to all executions. In 1982, Sister Helen started corresponding with Patrick Sonnier, sentenced to die in the electric chair of Louisiana's Angola State Prison for the murder of two teenagers. Sonnier asked her to become his spiritual advisor and she accepted. In 1984, Elmo Patrick Sonnier was put to death in the electric chair. Sister Helen was there to witness his execution.

In the following months, she became spiritual advisor to another death row inmate, Robert Lee Willie, who soon met the same fate as Sonnier.



SR. PREJEAN (CONTINUED)

After witnessing this second execution, Sister Helen realized that this lethal act would remain hidden unless she spoke up about it. She came together with others to hold execution vigils and to march to draw attention to the issue. She founded a support group for victims' family members called Survive. And she sat down and wrote a book, Dead Man Walking: An Eyewitness Account of the Death Penalty in the United States. Dead Man Walking ignited a national debate on capital punishment and it inspired an Academy Award winning movie, a play and an opera.

Over twenty years later and with capital punishment still practiced in 32 states, Sister Helen divides her time between campaigning

against the death penalty, counseling individual death row prisoners, and working with murder victims' family members. She has accompanied five more men to their deaths and is currently spiritual advisor to Manuel Ortiz, a man she believes is innocent of the crime that has put him on death row at Angola for over 23 years.

Sister Helen is currently at work on her third book, River of Fire.
