

Renew My Church: Let's Review

It's always good to remember the roots of Renew My Church. Why the need for change? Why did St. Philip and Sacred Heart need to come together? Our journey is both spiritual and structural. We need to re-encounter Jesus Christ as disciples and parish communities, and we need to ensure our parish has adequate resources for vitality.

Why the need for spiritual renewal?

We are facing not an "age of change" but a "change for the ages." We have moved from a Christ-centered age to a secular age, in which our mission once again becomes apostolic.



What is the fundamental change needed for a truly renewed Church?

Making sure that everything we do is implicitly and explicitly rooted in helping people know and share Jesus Christ. This involves change, or conversion, on three levels:

- **Personal:** Our own, personal encounter with Christ through which we become missionary disciples.
- **Parish:** Sharing with each other the life we have experienced in encountering Christ. This means taking responsibility for the building up of the parish as a community of faith. We hope to embrace this responsibility through our participation in Alpha. We encourage everyone to attend Alpha, which will help build up our faith and our community.
- Archdiocese: The Cardinal and his staff are responsible for providing vision, resources, and support necessary to lead us to authentic relationship with Christ. They have been a great resource for Divine Mercy Parish.

FIRST FRIDAY DAY OF ADORATION September 6th 8:30 AM - 4PM ST. PHILIP CHURCH

Eucharistic Adoration is a devotion in which many people feel drawn more closely to our Lord. It's a wonderful time to come sit for a short time in the Presence of our Eucharistic Lord exposed on the altar. The Lord is eager to see you and hear your concerns for your family and friends, country, Church, etc. It is a special time of peace and quiet for praying, reflecting, reading, meditating, contemplating, all in the Eucharistic Presence of our Lord. Amid this peace and quiet, allow some time to listen to the Lord. Need a special prayer this month? Ask for forgiveness and intercede for others. Think of those who have hurt you and request a special blessing for them. Ask God to forgive you for all the times you have neglected or hurt someone else. Bring before the Blessed Sacrament all those who have asked you to pray for them. Ask the Lord to address their concerns.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will begin immediately after the 8:00 a.m. Mass and rosary at St. Philip the Apostle Church followed by 6+ hours (9am-3pm) of silent time, concluding with the regularly scheduled Holy Hour from 3-4pm. Come when you can, leave when you must. May God bless you and all for whom you pray!

A facilitator will be present to guide us through the conversation, as well as representatives from the Archdiocesan Office for the Protection of Children and Youth who can educate attendees on efforts taken to prevent such abuse from happening in the future.

It is a call to take time and set aside some of our activities to explore the rich wisdom and teachings of the Contemplative tradition through the method of Centering Prayer and Meditation.

The main focus in this spiritual journey program is: Who is God in my life? Who am I (from psychological and spiritual perspectives)?, and How can I transform? The Centering Prayer/ Meditation was developed by Fr. Thomas Keating, a Cistercian Trappist Monk, of St. Benedict's Monastery in Snowmass, Colorado. In the past, our parish has partnered with North Shore Congregation Israel to raise funds to provide students at Jordon Elementary Community School in Rogers Park with much needed school supplies. There are over 500 children at Jordon—with almost 500

different stories of family problems and living conditions that impact daily life. In some cases, just survival is a triumph. But there is one common thread that links almost all of the



stories: Education is the path that will lead each person to a happier life. Operation Backpack helps them on their journey.

The student body at Jordan is primarily Hispanic (64%) and African-American (30%). 96% of the students are from low-income families. Operation Backpack - a coalition of private citizens, North Shore Congregation Israel & Divine Mercy— provides school supplies to all. It's a tangible way to can help these children start the year with tools they need to thrive.
