#### FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

#### **HEARTBREAKING**

With the Pennsylvania grand jury report and the news about former Cardinal McCarrick, we are reading about terrible lapses in leadership: seventy years of cover-ups by bishops in six Pennsylvania dioceses; and years of whisperings regarding McCarrick that went ignored. It's heartbreaking.

There has been so much damage done to so many innocent lives. Individuals and families have been taken advantage of by those in whom they placed their trust. Child sexual abuse is horrible, in and of itself. It is both a sin and a crime. It's even more horrible when it is perpetrated by priests and bishops, those who are ordained to help bring us closer to God and his church.

The details contained in the Pennsylvania grand jury report are sickening. But there is one significant detail overlooked in the report. As Commonweal magazine notes, "All but two of the cases predate the reforms implemented in the United States in the aftermath of the Boston scandal in 2002." The magazine goes on to say, "There's more than cold comfort to this fact, for it shows how additional institutional reforms could be devised, carried out, and enforced."

Further reforms or other protocols definitely need to be put in place so that, at the very least, no more cover ups occur and bishops are held accountable for not acting in a timely matter when allegations come to their attention. Additionally, a national conversation needs to be underway with regard to the deeper issues which contribute to secrecy and the "old boys" network spurred on by clericalism. Also, as Commonweal magazine notes, "attitudes of power, privilege, and entitlement that characterize many of the ordained and reinforce a structure that protects them from accountability" should also be examined and rooted out.

In addition, *Commonweal* forcefully suggests, "This means that the laity should be allowed greater participation

in many aspects of the church's life. They must be involved in investigations into clerical sexual abuse and abuse of power, in the selection of candidates for ordination, and in the training these candidates receive—including in matters of sexuality, mental health and trauma. Future priests should not be hidden away from the rest of the community in cloistered seminaries, where they pick up the bad habits of clericalism. If there is something to seize from this moment, it is the opportunity to envision—with vigor, clarity and discernment—meaningful and measurable reform."

Let us pray for victims of clerical sexual abuse. Let us pray for a lasting and widespread reform where policies and procedures concerning this issue and related issues would truly be addressed in a healthy and transparent way. Let us pray for a spirit of healing and wholeness to overtake the people of God in the face of such disheartening institutional failures.

#### A GLIMMER OF HOPE

At last weekend's family Mass, I tried something new. After the scriptures were proclaimed, I invited the assembly to get into small groups of three or four and share on the readings. I asked people to consider what they liked, disliked or questioned as a result of the scriptures.

After their small group sharing, I opened the discussion to the entire assembly inviting two or three comments or questions from individuals. Recall last Sunday's gospel account where Jesus asks his original twelve disciples if they want to leave him as did some other discouraged disciples. One brave soul shared her group's question in light of the Pennsylvania revelations, and like the disciples, asked should we stay or should go?

I tried at the time to answer as best I could. Since then, I've thought more about it.



I'm placing my hope in the people of God, all those individuals and families who *are* the church. The church is not made up of only leaders. The church is comprised mostly of the good, the strong and the resilient flock of Jesus.

Now more than ever, modern day disciples need to stick together; they need to look to each other to nurture and cultivate a deep faith in the Lord Jesus. Having said this, I personally think we have wonderful leadership here in the Archdiocese. Cardinal Cupich, and others like him, will continue to assist the people of God as they journey forward.

#### **DIRECTOR OF OPERATIONS**

This is why something like *Renew My Church* is so important. The Cardinal is convinced that the only way forward is if we work together creatively to achieve the vision of a revitalized church. The mission of *Renew My Church*—to make disciples, build communities, and inspire witness—requires us to work together in new and imaginative ways that bring about vibrant and life-giving faith communities within the Archdiocese.

As Divine Mercy parish continues with phase four of *Renew My Church*, we are examining all aspects of our ministry and operations to expand our focus on mission, evangelization and vitality. Our goal is to increase operational efficiency and to devote *more* resources to ministry activities.

To support this, we are eliminating the former Business Manager role and are creating a new role, Director of Operations. This new role, which will have responsibility for our operations, finances, facilities, project management and human resources, will report to me,

with the assistance of the Director of Vicariate Operations. After conducting interviews and reflecting deeply on the needs of our new parish, I am happy to announce that we have hired Michelle Wasielewski as the Director of Operations for our parish. Michelle has worked at Sacred Heart church as the Business Manager for the past eight years and has prior professional experience as a CPA at PricewaterhouseCoopers, with knowledge across a wide variety of industries, including manufacturing, financial institutions and law firms. She has a Bachelor of Science degree in accountancy from the University of Illinois.

Through all that is happening in our wider Church, I am cautiously optimistic. I am grateful that at Divine Mercy Parish, we have a great staff. We have ministries that will continue to expand and deepen. We have dedicated, generous parishioners who are the absolute backbone of the church.

#### MENS ANNUAL RETREAT OCTOBER 5-7
