



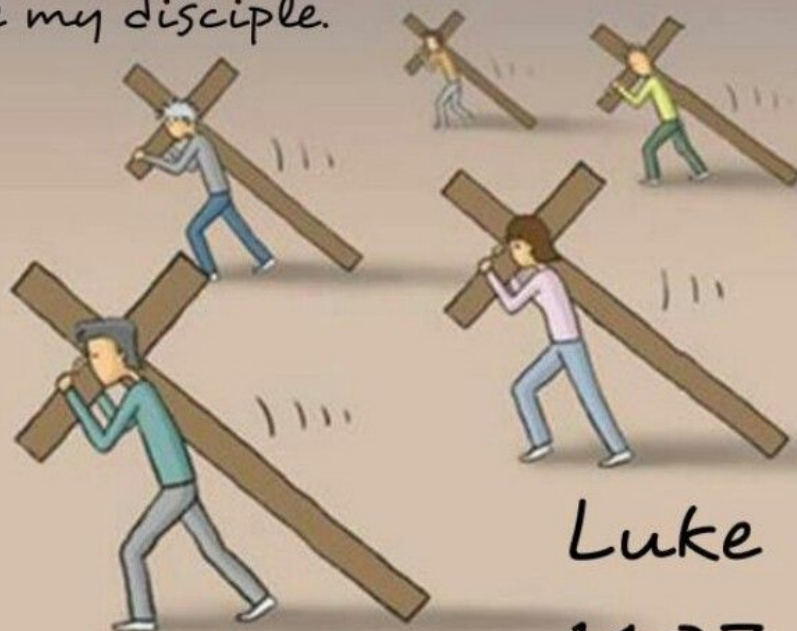

WHAT'S UP?

I'd like to keep you updated on where we are with phase five of Renew My Church, otherwise known as "building the new reality." We are at an important juncture. In particular, I'd like to call your attention to two things.

Alpha

Elsewhere in the bulletin you can read about Alpha and how the first season of this experience is about to kick off starting Monday evening, September 23 at 6:30 p.m. or, for those who need to attend during daytime, Wednesday morning, September 25 at 9:30 a.m. Check out page 4 of this bulletin for more information about Alpha.

I attended the pilot experience of Alpha this past Lent and I loved it. I found it to be truly a worthwhile investment of my time and energy. My faith was deepened and energized by Alpha. This could be one of the best gifts that you give to yourself. Come and see what Alpha offers.

Discussions at Senior Leadership Team

Since we entered phase five of Renew My Church, the SLT has guided our renewal and revitalization here at Divine Mercy parish. The SLT will begin a review of liturgy that will run the course of a handful of weeks and which will run the gamut of topics, for example: (1) the invitation and structuring of crossing over of liturgical ministers between our two houses of worship, (2) consistent liturgical practices for weekday and weekend liturgies at both campuses, (3) the creation of a vigorous hospitality ministry and the establishment of the information desks at both church lobbies/gathering spaces, (4) the formulation of a new Mass schedule for both weekday and weekend liturgies to be implemented this coming June.

What is the fundamental change needed for a truly renewed Church?

Making sure that everything we do is implicitly and explicitly rooted in helping people know and share Jesus Christ. This involves change, or conversion, on three levels:

- **Personal:** Our own, personal encounter with Christ through which we become missionary disciples. #TRY ALPHA!
- **Parish:** Sharing with each other the life we have experienced in encountering Christ. This means taking responsibility for the building up of the parish as a community of faith. We hope to embrace this responsibility through our participation in Alpha. We encourage everyone to attend Alpha, which will help build up our faith and our community.
- **Archdiocese:** The Cardinal and his staff are responsible for providing vision, resources, and support necessary to lead us to authentic relationship with Christ. They have been a great resource for Divine Mercy Parish.

LISTENING SESSION ON THE CHURCH-CLERGY ABUSE SCANDAL:

SEPTEMBER 16th at 7pm PARISH CENTER

Are you, or any of your friends or family members, struggling with the Church because of the abuse scandal? Stopped going to Mass? Walked away from a faith community because of it? Angry or hurt?

If you are a hurting Catholic or ex-Catholic, please consider attending a listening session about the abuse scandal on Monday night, September 16th at 7:00 p.m. at the Divine Mercy Parish Center, at the corner of Gage and Burr in Winnetka. Come share your frustrations and your struggles with others. This will be a safe place where people can express their feelings. A facilitator will be present to guide us through the conversation, as well as representatives from the Archdiocesan Office for the Protection of Children and Youth and Victim's Assistance. This session is not expected to achieve closure, but seeks to better understand the depth of the pain, outrage and moral damage experienced by victims, those they love and those in, or estranged from the Church, that struggle with this reality.

Attendees can also learn about efforts taken to prevent such abuse from happening in the future.

This simple wisdom saying is an invitation given to you by God during our spiritual journey. It is a call to take time and set aside some of our activities to explore the rich wisdom and teachings of the Contemplative tradition through the method of Centering Prayer and Meditation.
