FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

HOMILY REPRINT

A number of people have asked for a reprint of the homily I gave this past weekend at the Saturday evening Mass and again at the 7:30 am and 4:30 pm Sunday Masses all at Sacred Heart church. Sharing in print what was spoken aloud always carries with it the risk that people will read into the lines a tonality or emotion that wasn't there.

I tried to deliver this with a kind of unemotional tenor (i.e., without anger coloring it). Regardless, here it is with a few footnotes included.

A week ago last Saturday we experienced a strong storm in Winnetka. During that storm, at about 3:00 a.m., lightning struck the bell tower. One of the decorative finials at the top was partly exploded, ending up on the ground below. The lightning strike also damaged the sound system, frying the speakers here in the church. It also took out the middle row of keys on the organ and it fried the camera in the choir loft that sends video to the TV in the gathering space.

A lot of damage was done. You can imagine the number of vendors involved this past week and in the weeks to come to make the necessary repairs: sound system people, organ people, video people, construction people, artisan people, and insurance people.

In addition to all those companies that are working on repairs, we are also exploring with other companies how to add specially designed lightning arrestors (formerly called lightning rods) to the tower and the roof so that future storms and strikes will hopefully cause less damage.

Another kind of storm has engulfed the universal church. But this storm and the damage caused comes from within, from a leadership that fumbled in its response to clergy sex abuse of minors and with the coverup in Pennsylvania in which too many were involved.

The initial heartbreaking damage was perpetrated by trusted adults against innocent children. It should not have ever happened—but it did, many times and in many dioceses. Further damage was caused because abuse cases should have been dealt with appropriately, quickly, and transparently—but they were not, that is, not until the Dallas Accords that were enacted by the bishops in 2002. Protocols and procedures are now in place, which we can attest to in **this** Archdiocese.

But it is going to take a whole lot more than protocols and procedures to repair the damage done and to arrive at a healthy, holy church. Clericalism and the "old boys" culture has to go.

I believe that Archbishop Viganó represents that "old boys" culture. I suspect that he, along with some other prelates, oppose Pope Francis and the compassion that the pope brings to his position of supreme pontiff. So, in my opinion, the pope is being smeared because there are some in leadership who will do anything to maintain a clerical position of power, control and privilege.

Changing that culture won't be easy to do because culture is the hardest thing to change.

In his ministry, Jesus sought change—not only in the religious practice of his day but in the very way people would relate to God and to one another. That's why the controversy erupted between Jesus and the Pharisees and scribes back then.

He calls them hypocrites (see Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23). Jesus holds up a mirror to them, challenging them to



go deep and look inside themselves. Faith and religious practice do not consist merely of external, ritual behaviors. Faith and religious practice begin in the human heart—hearts open to God, to the gospel, to the sacraments.

Change in one's personal life most often comes with a cost. So too, does institutional change.

Lightning eradicators, if you will, need to be installed in the universal church, such as

- greater lay leadership at all levels of governance— in parishes, dioceses, and within the Vatican;
- women appointed to leadership positions— even at the highest (curial) levels;
- bishops themselves being held accountable to the Dallas Accords as are their priests;
- clerics unlearning the tendency of the past to believe that they are special or better than laity due to ordination alone; and
- replacing every other clerical instinct and inclination with the bedrock understanding that humble service is the only thing that grounds authority and teaches us how to use power.

Jesus says evil comes from within. **That** is what defiles.

We've got to go really deep and uproot that which allows evil to flourish in the church, or else all the bell towers in Christendom won't be enough to withstand this storm.

We've got trust where the Holy Spirit is leading us, which is more openness,

greater humility, and compassion for the least among us, and the most vulnerable.

That's the mission of Christ, and the whole reason for the Church's existence.

MORE LIGHT ON THE MATTER

In the homily I didn't say much to back up the claim that Archbishop Viganó's so-called "testimony" which he released to the media through a right wing Catholic outlet is suspect in all of its aspects. We will probably be hearing more about all of this in the days and weeks ahead. Meanwhile, let us stay as focused as we can on the ordinary ministry of the parish and on the work of *Renew My Church*.

The media will, no doubt, continue reporting. The bishops' conference will continue to address what needs to be addressed, especially in its upcoming November annual meeting. We will continue pursuing the mission of Christ here in Winnetka, Glencoe and Northfield.
