IMPORTANT INFORMATION YOU SHOULD KNOW

CHILD PROTECTION EFFORTS IN THE CHICAGO ARCHDIOCESE

Given all the news of late, the Parish Council thought it might be helpful for parishioners to know the practices of the Chicago Archdiocese regarding the protection of our youth, and what processes are in place when accusations are made . The following information comes from the Archdiocesan website, which you can find at https:// protect.archchicago.org/.

THE SAFE ENVIRONMENT OFFICE

The Safe Environment Office educates clergy, employees and volunteers of the Archdiocese of Chicago on how to prevent sexual abuse, recognize grooming behaviors and create safe environments for children and young people in our parishes, schools and community. In addition, the Safe Environment Office is responsible for tracking the screening of clergy, employees and volunteers.

TRAINING

The following are required trainings for clergy, employees and adults who volunteer of the Archdiocese of Chicago:

Protecting God's Children for Adults™/Virtus Training

Protecting God's Children for Adults is a training conducted by certified facilitators on the prevention of child sexual abuse. The training educates participants on the signs of child sexual abuse, the methods and means by which offenders commit abuse, and how to prevent it.

Mandated Reporter Training

Provides adults mandated by state law and Archdiocesan policy to report suspected child abuse and neglect with information on how to recognize and report child abuse and neglect. This requirement includes school personnel, clergy, DREs/CREs, catechists, youth ministers and coaches.

Child/Youth Training

As part of the implementation of the Charter for the Protection of Children & Young People, the Archdiocese of Chicago requires its parishes and schools to provide valuable training to children and youth in schools and programs annually.

ADDITIONAL TRAINING Site Administrator Training

Every parish and school is required to hire a Site Administrator, an onsite employee designated by a pastor or principal at their parish or school, whose qualifications and duties include, but are not limited to, the management of compliance data for their site's employees and volunteers. Site Administrator Training provides administrators with an understanding of responsibilities and expectations to ensure that every employee and volunteer has complied with requirements.

Virtus Facilitator Training

Each parish and/or school should have a trained, certified Virtus Facilitator. All Virtus Facilitators are required to participate in this two-day training hosted by the Office for the Protection of Children and Youth (OPCY).

The Safe Environment Office abides by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. The charter requires that all dioceses/eparchies have clear and well-publicized standards of behaviors and boundaries, maintain safe environment programs for all children and adults and evaluate the background of all lay employees, clergy, and all volunteers who have contact with children.

THE OFFICE FOR CHILD ABUSE INVESTIGATIONS AND REVIEW

The Office for Child Abuse Investigations and Review (CAIR) works to provide a compassionate and thorough process to receive and investigate reports of abuse against personnel of the Archdiocese of Chicago. CAIR and the Independent Review Board were instated in 1992 by Joseph Cardinal Bernardin. Though the office title has changed through the years – initially titled the Office of Professional Fitness Review, and later named the Office of Professional Responsibility – the mission remains the same.

CAIR is one of four offices that make up the Archdiocese of Chicago's Office for the Protection of Children and Youth (OPCY). Each office works together to ensure cases are handled properly and by the most appropriate public authority, office and/or entity. CAIR is available to all individuals who choose to report their abuse as children or who have the knowledge of the abuse of children in the Church.

You have the right to report your story, and we are here to help, listen and connect you to the right services. To ensure the best resources and investigation practices are engaged, we encourage all allegations concerning the abuse and/or neglect of minors are reported to the DCFS Hotline (1-800-25-ABUSE) and/or the local police department first before reaching out to the Office of the Protection of Children and Youth (OPCY). If you need to report historical abuse, please contact OPCY at 312.534.5254.

INDEPENDENT REVIEW BOARD

The Independent Review Board (Review Board) advises the Cardinal on allegations of sexual abuse of minors against clergy of the Archdiocese of Chicago who are in ministry. The Review Board serves as advisory to the Cardinal in his assessment of allegations of sexual abuse of minors and in his determination of suitability for ministry of those clerics accused.

The Review Board consists of nine to 11 individuals appointed by the Cardinal. Six of the Review Board members are lay Catholics and are not employees of the church. They represent one of each of the following backgrounds: a psychiatrist, a psychologist or social worker, an attorney, a parish council member, a parent, and a victim/survivor or parent of a victim/survivor of child sexual abuse. Three members of the Review Board are clerics of this Archdiocese (two priests and one deacon). The Cardinal, in consultation with the Review Board, may appoint one or two additional lay Catholics who shall be considered at-large member(s). We want to assure our faith community that we take these issues seriously, and are doing everything we can to provide a safe environment for all of our parishioners, especially our children.

HOPE AND HEALING

THE ARCHDIOCESE OF CHICAGO TO HOLD A MASS FOR HOPE AND HEALING AT HOLY FAMILY PARISH—OCT. 20TH

The Mass is held to pray for the ongoing healing for child and youth sexual abuse survivors and their families. The Archdiocese of Chicago's Office of Assistance Ministry will hold a Mass for Hope and Healing on Saturday, October 20, 2018 at 11 a.m. at Holy Family Church, 1080 West Roosevelt Road, Chicago. Fr. Michael Gabriel, pastor of Holy Family Church, and Fr. Larry Dowling, pastor of St. Agatha Church, will co-celebrate the Mass, where we will offer prayers for the ongoing healing of child and youth sexual abuse survivors, their families and the Church.

Michael Hoffman and Jim Richter, both victims-survivors, will give witness on behalf of victim-survivors of clergy sexual abuse. Attendees will include clergy, victim-survivors of clergy sexual abuse, family members and caregivers of survivors, church lay ministry staff, Catholic school leadership and many others who are committed to the protection and safety of children and youth.

"I attend this Mass every year and I am grateful for the opportunity to share something in common with abuse survivors in this heartfelt and prayerful liturgy," said Hoffman. "This type of outreach has helped me to reconcile myself to the traumatic loss I experienced at the hands of my abuser. I am thankful for this healing opportunity."

The Office for Assistance Ministry works to provide pastoral care, support and resources to victims-survivors of clerical sexual abuse and their loved ones in their efforts to achieve psychological, emotional and spiritual healing. The office was established as one of the first victim assistance ministries in the United States in 1992 to respond to the sexual abuse of minors by Archdiocesan clergy. Since its creation, it has provided services and support to more than 400 victims-survivors and their family members.

"I am grateful for the energy, support and company of others on this journey of hope and healing," said Richter. "I pray that other victims who live in silence with shame and guilt will also find a way to emerge from the shadows of pain and loneliness to find a measure of peace and comfort."


