FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

BEING PRESENT

When a pastor is pastor of a parish with only one worship site, it's easier to be present to people on a regular basis, versus a pastor of a parish with multiple worship sites. In the case of the former, the pastor stands in the back of church, the lobby, the narthex or the gathering space after each of the weekend Masses. People who want to connect with the pastor can do so fairly easily right after Mass because he's right there.

I heard another pastor once refer to the lobby of the church as his "office." That's where he saw a lot of people, interacted with them, even if only casually. And sometimes not so casually, as when a parishioner needed a bit of quick counseling or consoling. They didn't have to make an appointment. They just walked up to him then and there, after Mass.

How does one do that when there are multiple sites and the pastor (and other priests) are constantly rotating Masses weekend by weekend? It can still happen, but for those people who attend the same Mass time each week, the pastor will be less present. It can't be helped.

We can't be at two places at once.

Of course, with most people having the ability to email, the pastor is accessible with just a few clicks of the keyboard. It's not exactly the same thing as being personally present in the back of church, but still, it's an avenue for communication.

This is just one of the many new challenges we all face in our newly combined parish that is composed of two worship sites with Mass times that overlap. It may be in the future that those times won't overlap, and then the problem is solved. For now, however, we all will deal with the fact that we celebrate Mass in two different places and those Mass

times overlap enough that the pastor can't be seen in his other "office" each and every Sunday.

INSTALLATION

Our parish is a newly created parish. I'm newly appointed as the pastor, as of July 1, by Cardinal Cupich. As such, there will be an installation Mass, during which I formally will be installed as your Pastor. It will be celebrated on Saturday, December 1 at 5:00 p.m. at the Sacred Heart site with our new episcopal vicar, Bishop Mark Bartosic presiding.

The staff and the Parish Stewardship Council suggested the Sacred Heart site because there will be a parish-wide reception after the Mass, and the following morning the pancake breakfast is being held at the St Philip the Apostle site. Since the gym will be set up in advance of the pancake breakfast we thought it best to make use of the Sacred Heart site so that the installation reception can be held in the parish center on the corner of Gage and Burr.



There are some real advantages to having multiple campuses, as in this case. We have more options for ministry locations, event set-ups, and so on. This is a happy by-product of our combining.

I hope to see you all at both the installation and the pancake breakfast!

TO TEACH WHO CHRIST IS

St. PHILIP THE APOSTLE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE OCTOBER 2018

TTWCI

In August 2018, a status report on the St. Philip the Apostle *TO TEACH WHO CHRIST IS (TTWCI)* capital campaign was presented in the Divine Mercy weekly bulletin.

TTWCI Funds Collected to Date	\$746,400
Expenditures to Date:	
Church Roof Repair	\$277,000
Vestibule Restoration	\$55,300
Gymnasium Renovation	\$37,400 *
Storm and Sanitary Sewer Line Cleaning	\$40,100
Required Allocation to Archdiocese	\$220,000
Net Balance	\$116,600

* An additional \$20K remains to be spent with regard to the gymnasium sound system.

ADDITIONAL WORK AT SPA

We are still evaluating other proposed projects, including repairs to the church sound system (\$20K), possible improvement of the rectory heating system (\$50K), roof repairs on the convent and school (\$20K), tuckpointing on the convent, school and rectory (\$75K, and replacement of broken sump pumps (\$61K). Some of these projects may be funded from remaining TTWCI funds, as well as from St. Philip's building fund. We will continue to inform you about repairs and improvements to the St. Philip campus.

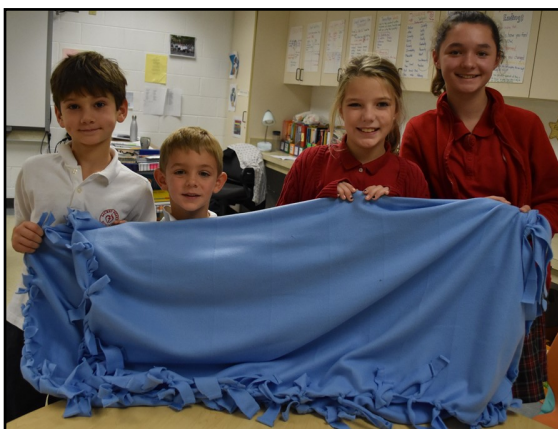
There will be a Parents and Tots class on Monday, November 12th from 9-10:00am.

Saturday is registration for the Catholic High School entrance exam. New Trier Placement Test is 7:45am.



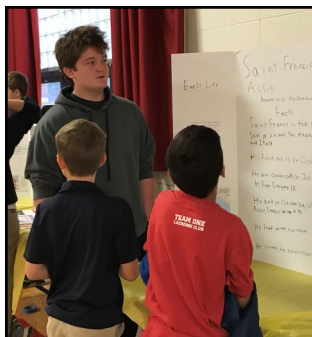
