FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

GREAT RETREAT

I am told the Holy Spirit moved among them (I was only able to be with them Friday night, not the whole time). Glory be to God! Thank you to the Alpha Team and all those who prayed for the success of the weekend!

Keep up your prayers as we finish Alpha with our nearly 100 participants. After Alpha they will move on to wonderful things in their deepening relationship with the Lord Jesus.

For those who'd still like to participate in Alpha, but didn't have the time this fall, season two begins in late January. We hope you'll consider this opportunity to deepen your relationship with Christ and others in our parish community.

LITURGIST-MUSICIAN SEARCH

Members of the search committee met this past Sunday morning with me. We hashed out a number of details regarding the search.

As of November 11, thirteen individuals from around the country and the world have applied for the position. The next step will be a series of video conference calls with candidates we wish to pursue. After that, we will hold interviews and auditions, in person, with those candidates who are the strongest contenders.

If you are scratching your head at the two paragraphs above, then you didn't see my column of several weeks ago where I informed the parish that Todd Gresick wishes to retire from full-time work here in February (when he turns 65). This has triggered a search for a successor. We're taking the opportunity this represents to expand the current position into a dual one: a combined liturgist and music director for the parish.

We hate to see Todd retire. On the other hand, we are happy that he can begin to enjoy the "golden years" of retirement. He won't be entirely gone since some brides have already asked him to return to play for future weddings. I think that's great. I have no doubt that his successor will enjoy an afternoon or two off on the days of those weddings!
