

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

#### **HAPPY NEW YEAR**

No, I haven't lost it. Next weekend, the First Sunday of the Advent season will be celebrated. This marks the start of the Church year, the year of grace.

A number of things happen with this new liturgical year. As with every Advent, we prepare for the celebration of the nativity of the Lord, Christmas. That preparation looks back in time to the Incarnation of Christ. It also looks forward in time to the Second Coming of Christ. Happy new year!

Also with the start of the new Church year we leave Luke's gospel behind, for the most part. Having heard almost every passage from Luke in the previous Church year on Sundays, we now turn our attention to Matthew's gospel which predominates in this year. Each of the Advent gospel passages will be taken from Matthew's gospel. A number of the Christmas season gospel passages are also taken from Matthew. Once we arrive in Ordinary Time, we will pretty much consistently hear from Matthew's gospel. Happy new year!

Raymond E. Brown, in his work Introduction to the New Testament, has this to say about the Gospel of Matthew. It runs to about 18,300 words in the original Greek text. It's more than 50% longer than Mark, with its greater length explained by the two chapters of the infancy narrative of Jesus and the long preaching or sermon material from Jesus found in chapters five through seven. Matthew stands first in all of the ancient biblical codices and has been the Church's gospel par excellence. It is a foundational document of the community of faith, grounding us in the teaching of Jesus, a church built on the rock against which the gates of hell will not prevail. "Matthew's Sermon on the Mount, the eight beatitudes and the Lord's Prayer are among the most widely

known treasures in the Christian heritage," says Brown in his book. We will hear all of this in the liturgical year which is about to begin. Happy new year!

As we step off into the new Church year we will be lighting the four candles of the Advent wreath as we move through the season and get closer to Christmas. May the light of the Advent wreath illuminate our hearts with the warmth of God's grace! Happy new year!



# THE SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING OF THE UNIVERSE

On the last Sunday of each liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Christ the King. Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical *Quas Primas* ("In the First") to respond to growing nationalism and secularism. He recognized that these related societal ills would breed increasing hostility against the Church. His encyclical reminds the faithful that while governments and philosophies come and go, Christ reigns as king forever.

The following are some quotes from Pope Francis on this Solemnity.

The Kingdom Demands Discipleship Jesus is the center of creation; and so the attitude demanded of us as true believers is that of recognizing and accepting in our lives the centrality of Jesus Christ, in our thoughts, in our words and in our works. (Homily of Pope Francis, Solemnity of Christ the King, November 24, 2013)

We must work every day, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to draw closer to Jesus. In our own increasingly "post-Christian" society, we cannot be complacent in our spiritual lives. To acknowledge the kingship of Christ means that we should dedicate ourselves to prayer, to building up our families and our parish communities, and to bringing healing to a broken world.

#### The Kingdom is Humble

Jesus inaugurates a kingdom that grows through humble acts of service. Even as her freedom to carry out her ministries is threatened, the Church must patiently continue to serve the poor, educate the young, welcome the migrant, visit the prisoner, heal the sick, bury the dead, and love others.

The kingdoms of this world at times are sustained by arrogance, rivalries and oppression; the reign of Christ is a 'kingdom of justice, love and peace.' For a Christian, speaking of power and strength means referring to the power of the Cross, and the strength of Jesus' love: a love which remains steadfast and complete, even when faced with rejection, and it is shown as the fulfillment of a life expended in the total surrender of oneself for the benefit of humanity. (Angelus Address of Pope Francis, Solemnity of Christ the King, November 22, 2015)
