FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

WHAT WE HAVE HEARD

If you recall, on Sunday, October 20, we held a town hall type of meeting for all our parishioners. The goal of this gathering was to offer a brief presentation on what has been happening regarding the creation of our new parish, Divine Mercy. Staffers Judy and Michelle did a great job in making this presentation that provided an overview of just how far we have come since our first days as Divine Mercy.

After the presentation we opened the floor to questions and comments. The questions were good ones, which we attempted to respond to, where appropriate. The comments were illuminating, helping us to understand how folks in the pews perceive their new parish.

An Interesting Comment

One thing we have heard from a parishioner is the statement that "St. Philip has been acquired by Sacred Heart." I understand how that may *seem* to be the case, given that some decisions emanating from staff (who are mostly located at the Sacred Heart campus) have impacted operations at St. Philip, for example, the decision to cut back on office hours at St. Philip. The office at St. Philip is now only open on Fridays. Meanwhile, the office at Sacred Heart campus is open on Monday through Thursday. It also seems to be the case, given that we still use the names of the former parishes in order to designate which campus or building we are talking about.

However, here is the reality. The two former parishes officially ceased to exist on July 1 of 2017. At the same time, a new parish community was created by decree of the Cardinal.

A Critical Truth

My point in reminding us of this reality is that one parish did not acquire the other parish. Why? Because both parishes were extinguished at the same time. One new parish was the result. Vestiges of the old parishes can be seen in the new Divine Mercy parish, of course. We inherited all the former buildings, the former staffs, the various direct ministries, the traditions and events, and the people who made up the former parishes. But my point is that, in spite of that, we are essentially something new. Given that we inherited all that was, it will take a good deal of time for us to discover how to be this new parish which we are. Things will continue to change. New initiatives will be entered into. As we do so, we will build on the past.

The Past is the Past

However, we will not be stymied by that past, which is gone. We honor the past but the past cannot define who we are or where we are going because, clearly, "the past" was no longer effective or working the way it needed to in order to advance the mission of Christ in the world.

Those former parishes were both in decline. That is not going to be where we are headed. We have purposely set our sights on a vision which includes forward momentum, growth, newness, and vitality.

The former parishes did not get where they were overnight. Achieving or creating a vibrant parish community at Divine Mercy will not happen overnight.

Looking Forward, Looking Ahead

Everyone in parish leadership that we've talked to who have been in this situation which we find ourselves says that we need to be patient, we need to stay the course, and take the steps, one by one, that will lead to renewal. The first big step has been taken with the operational phase of Renew My Church. We are pretty much done with that.

The next big step is where we are at right now: getting the first season of Alpha under our belt, and then, following that, continuing with more seasons of Alpha as well as beginning to offer formation and leadership



opportunities to laity after Alpha.

So back to my main point. One place has not acquired the other. The only thing we all have acquired is a new vision and a new direction (making disciples, building church, serving others). In pursuit of that vision, we have also acquired, if you will, one another in Christ.

Thank you for your patience as we take this parish into God's future. Thank you for being patient with one another.


