FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

INCARNATIONAL REALITIES

We will soon be celebrating the nativity of the Lord, otherwise known as Christmas. The main message of Christmas is that God became incarnate. Christ took on our flesh and dwelt among us, like us in all things, but sin.

The Incarnation is one of the foundational teachings of the Church. The Creed we profess expresses this mystery: "For us [people] and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man." Only the most fundamental teachings made it into the Creed. Incarnation is *that* important.

Being human carries with it all sorts of realities. We are embodied spirits. We can't get away from our bodies, at least, not on this side of eternity.

If we are cut, we bleed. If we are not able to eat, we starve. If we get cataracts, our vision is impaired (or nonexistent). And so on.

Incarnational realities for us humans mean that we need certain things in order to exist, function properly, and to be comfortable. In fact, as I write this, the plumbers are outside Sacred Heart church in the cold working on the sewers that connect to the restrooms.

This past weekend both restrooms in the Sacred Heart church gathering space were out of commission due to tree roots invading and clogging the sewer. This is just one of the many, many things that must be tended to so that we can do the work of ministry here at Divine Mercy parish.

If you've been reading the bulletin, you know that a lot more sewer work has been going on at our St Philip campus. These types of things are absolutely necessary (it's hard to disagree with the necessity of restrooms), along with boilers, windows, gutters, roofs, and

sidewalks. The list goes on and on.

Thank you for your continued commitment to Divine Mercy parish and your gifts and donations. Your generous support makes possible the very fine ministry in which we engage, serving the spiritual needs of many. Your support also makes possible our maintaining the material aspects of buildings and grounds that provide the platform and springboard for the spiritual life of the parish.

JOB DESCRIPTIONS

It's a challenge to get used to new staff positions. When things have been functioning in a certain way for many years, it's hard to break away from that to embrace new leadership.

As a reminder to all those who are working so hard to make Divine Mercy an effective parish system: all things operational are handled by Michelle Wasielewski, the parish Director of Operations. Anything at all to do with buildings and grounds, personnel issues, scheduling conflicts and the like are Michelle's purview. Anything having to do with ministry programs, service, and outreach are handled by Judy Pyke, our Director of Ministries. Judy and Michelle, in turn, report directly to me.

My intention is to hire a Director of Evangelization and Life Long Formation in the near future. Stay tuned for what that means in terms of parish revitalization and growth.

This is all part of phase five of *Renew My Church*. The season of Advent is all about anticipation and preparation, and certainly in terms of *Renew My Church* we are doing just that, anticipating and preparing for the future that God is unfolding among us. Happy Advent!

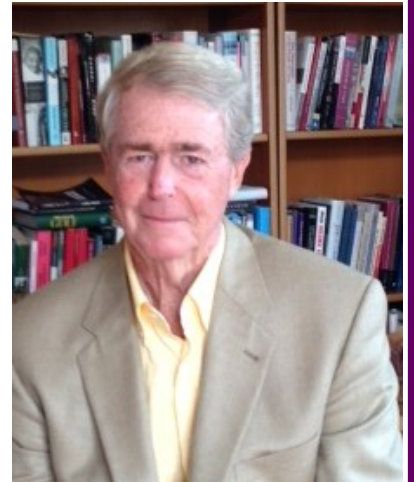

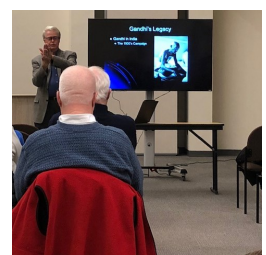

CHILDREN'S LITURGY AT SACRED HEART CHURCH

Children's Liturgy is actually the Liturgy of the Word for children. The Sunday scripture readings are proclaimed and explained on a level the children can understand and enjoy. Children's Liturgy takes place at our 10:30 am Sunday Mass from September through May (see schedule below). Any child in pre-kindergarten through 3rd grade is encouraged to join us. Parents are also welcome—especially if your child is a little nervous with new experiences. No registration is necessary.

Right after the opening prayer, the celebrant will invite the children to come forward for a blessing and the adult leader will lead them to the fireplace room in the parish office. After a brief welcome, they listen to the First Reading proclaimed from the Children's Lectionary. Next, the Gospel is proclaimed by one of the adult leaders. An age-appropriate reflection is shared by the leader through stories, discussions, or pictures - whatever the leader finds most appropriate. The children are then invited to share their own thoughts and ideas. The children return to the church after the Prayers of the Faithful to celebrate the Liturgy of the Eucharist with the entire community.

Tax Credit Scholarship Matching Gift Program

TRIPLE YOUR GIFT'S IMPACT!

PERSONAL BENEFIT, COMMON GOOD

In its first year the Illinois Tax Credit Scholarship Program, "Invest in Kids", awarded scholarships to more than 3,000 students from low-income families to attend a Catholic school of their choice in Cook and Lake Counties. This was made possible through the generosity of thousands of donors who took advantage of the 75 percent state income tax credit on their donation.

To help their donations have even more impact in 2019, several donors have agreed to pool their resources and offer a 2-for-1 matching gift program to the more than 160 schools run by the Archdiocese of Chicago, up to \$5 million total

HOW IT WORKS

- Donors should begin the process prior to Dec. 14, 2018 to ensure that they have enough time to make their gift by Dec. 31, 2018.
- For every dollar designated to a qualifying school through Empower Illinois between Dec. 1, 2018 and Feb. 28, 2019, the school will receive two dollars in matching funds. Donations are capped at \$100,000 per school.
- The program will end when all matching funds have been depleted or on Feb. 28, 2019, whichever comes first.
- After April 1, 2019, any matching gift program funds that are not awarded at a designated school will be reallocated to low-income students at schools with unmet demand.

EXAMPLE

A donor with about \$75,000 in income could make a donation of \$5,000 to Empower Illinois, in cash or stock, that would...

- Eliminate their Illinois state income tax liability (approximately \$3,750); and
- Provide \$15,000 in scholarship support (after the \$10,000 match)

For a total cost of \$1,250, this donor has now provided three students with \$5,000 in scholarships to use to attend a Catholic school of their choice (donation of \$5,000 minus the \$3,750 in state credit).

SACRED HEART SCHOOL



REGISTRATION for the 2019-20 school year for PS, JK and K began on Monday, December 3rd. If you have a child who will be 3 or 4 years old by September 1st, 2019, and wish to enroll them in our 3 year old preschool or our JK extended day program you will need to fill out a Registration form. If you have a child who will be 5 by September 1, 2019, and wish to enroll them in our full day kindergarten program, you will also need to fill out a registration form. All new students to Sacred Heart require a registration form and registration fee, as well as the child's Baptismal Certificate (if applicable) and Birth Certificate. If your child is presently at Sacred Heart School and is simply moving up a grade, there is a re-registration form to fill out as well as a registration fee. Please get your form in to secure your spot for next year.

Preschool, Junior Kindergarten and new kindergarten spots are first come first serve so don't delay turning in your registration form to the office. 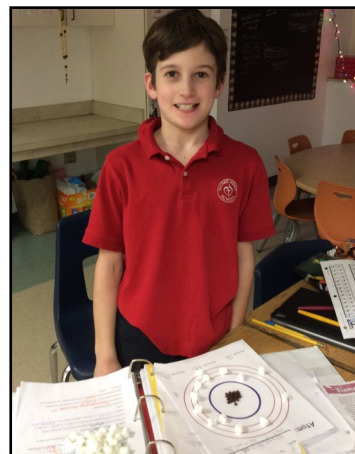
