#### FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

## STATUS OF RENEW MY CHURCH

The name Renew My Church is given to the broad initiative of Cardinal Cupich to revitalize parishes throughout the Archdiocese and to jump start a whole new way of being Church. This includes combining existing parishes into new ones, which is precisely what happened to the old Sacred Heart and St. Philip the Apostle parishes. As a result of Renew My Church we are now the new Divine Mercy parish which is comprised of two houses of worship, Sacred Heart and St. Philip the Apostle.

For us, it doesn't stop there. This is only the beginning. Defining our new parish as having two houses of worship is not the only result of this phase of *Renew My Church*, but it is perhaps the most visible result.

Did you know that the Archdiocese has developed an Excel spreadsheet with over 500 actionable items that we are to be working on during this phase of Renew My Church? Let me give you a few simple, easy examples of items on the list: 1) taking the two separate databases and merging them into one single data base, and 2) taking what had been two separate budgets and creating one new single budget out of them. The first was relatively easy for us to do because we were blessed by the fact that both former parishes used the same software to house their databases. I can't imagine how combined parishes elsewhere using different data bases did that. The second is a little more complicated in that even within a combined budget we need to keep separate the capital funds raised through the two different campaigns. The Archdiocese is assisting us in this budget work, so it's a little more complicated given that it has become a two-way conversation between us and the Archdiocese.

There are many, many other items on

the list, some more prosaic than others. Like the fact that we have had to examine and standardize our office procedures since we are currently operating two offices. Or that since we are a new parish we needed to order a new seal for our official documents such as baptismal, wedding and confirmation certificates. The old seals wouldn't "work" for the new parish since those former parishes don't exist anymore. The list goes on and on.

Some people are apt to think that the cancellations of the Sacred Heart Octoberfest or the St. Philip Movable Feast are the result of *Renew My Church*. Nothing could be further from the truth. The fact of the matter is that we just don't have the folks who want to work on these events at this time. Anyone who wants to step forward and mount these efforts: have at it! We'd be happy to see that happen.

Meanwhile, we are about to enter another phase of *Renew My Church*, the phase more focused on evangelization, renewal and revitalization. We won't be finished with the operational phase with the 500+ action items, but we will forge ahead at the same time to begin focusing on the vision of renewal as presented at the Archdiocesan summit held on October 1 -3.

Select staff members and invited parishioners attended. You'll hear from them in upcoming bulletin articles on what they experienced at the summit. You'll also hear from me in future bulletins just what precisely we will be doing to generate that new vision and energy here within our parish.

God has great plans for us. He sent to us his Son, Jesus, who shows us the way of discipleship, a way that will change the world because we ourselves are changed into his people, adopted sons and daughters of God who spread the joy of his



message and his love to all.

And remember, if you want to know the vision behind the summit and all of the next phase of *Renew My Church*, get a copy of Father James Mallon's book, *Divine Renovation: Bringing your parish from maintenance to mission.* Read it for yourself and see the broad outlines of where we are going.



#### **RENEW MY CHURCH**

#### WHAT'S HAPPENING?

Some of you may be wondering, "Our two parishes have merged, but it seems like nothing has happened since! What happens next for Renew My Church?" There's a lot!

The work of merging St. Philip the Apostle and Sacred Heart is more complex than one might think. It involves a lot of behind the scenes activities one might not consider. For example, two parishes mean two landscapers, two sound systems, two cleaning services, two internet systems, two heating and cooling providers, two publishers of liturgical booklets, two suppliers of hosts, etc. All of these (and many more) "contracts" have to be reviewed and combined into one. This is extremely time consuming and complex, as each "contract" has different terms.

Since we are now one parish, we had to create a new logo which can be seen on the bulletin and website mastheads, new stationery, new note pads, new welcome brochures, new business cards, etc. As many of you know from the corporate world, this takes time, too!

We combined our parish councils and our finance councils. Our Religious Education Directors are working together to plan for the future. Some

ministries have combined, like the Men's Club, or have invited parishioners from both worship sites to join them. All of this takes time and coordination.

We realize that change can be difficult for some, so we want to be careful during this first year to be respectful of existing parish activities, ministries and organizations as we navigate this new reality of Divine Mercy Parish.

#### THE SUMMIT

Several members of our staff and select parishioners recently attended the 3 day Archdiocesan Renew My Church Summit, where they heard several inspirational speakers talk about where the Church of the Chicago Archdiocese is heading, and the changes we must make in order to take our parishes from maintenance to mission. What does that mean? We must respond to the call of Jesus Christ that we hear in Matthew's Gospel (28:19-20), often called the Great Commission. The disciples are told "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy

Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you." This Great Commission calls us to "go, make, baptize and teach." We do some of these things very well (baptize and teach to some extent) and others, such as making disciples, we don't do so well. If we did, maybe our pews would be full for every Mass every Sunday, not just on Christmas or Easter. Maybe some family members or friends would be in the pews beside us.

To be a disciple is to be an intentional learner. "To be a disciple of Jesus Christ is to be engaged in a lifelong process of learning from and about Jesus the master, Jesus the teacher." Thus, to truly become a disciple of Jesus Christ, one must commit to an intentional, disciplined process of growth. These are all thoughts shared by Fr. James Mallon, author of *Divine Renovation*, and keynote speaker at the Renew My Church Summit.

As we continue to move forward with Renew My Church, have no fear, we will share with you the progress we are making. And if we don't, or if we forget because we've got caught up in all the behind the scenes details, ask us! This is <u>your</u> parish. This parish belongs to all of us, which is why all of us must respond to the call of Jesus to 'go, make, baptize and teach'!
