FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

IMPRESSIONS AND INSIGHTS

At the beginning of October, almost three-thousand people attended the Archdiocesan *Renew My Church* summit at the convention center in Rosemont led by Father James Mallon, author of *Divine Renovation*. Twelve of the participants were from our own parish, Divine Mercy, seven staff members and five lay persons.

I want to thank all twelve for giving up their time and energy to attend. I met with most of the twelve for supper recently in the rectory to get their impressions and insights from the summit. It was a wonderful evening. I'd have to say it was an exciting evening!

Our participants came away with a number of insights. However, the greatest "take-away" was their excitement at what the future might hold for us as a result of the vision contained in *Divine Renovation* as imparted by Father Mallon.

At the Halifax Divine Renovation conference that I attended and also at our Archdiocesan *Renew My Church* summit, a point was hammered home that every pastor who is engaged in revitalization and renew of a parish needs a Senior (or Core) Leadership Team. We are in the process of forming a Senior Leadership Team for our parish; more on this in a future bulletin.

Meanwhile, I asked Deacon Mike McNulty to share his own insights from the summit with you. Here's what he has to say. Thanks, Mike, for sharing this with everyone!

DEACON MIKE'S TAKE ON RENEW MY CHURCH SUMMIT

What's the Church really all about? Is it a place to go on Sunday morning, attend Mass, say hello to a few friends, then head home and forget about it until next Sunday? Is it a place that offers religious education for our children to assist us in our responsibility for passing on the faith to the next generation?

Reflecting on the word of God, receiving His body and blood, giving thanks for the sacrifice He made in order to redeem us from our sinfulness, in other words "Doing this in memory of Him" as he asked is wonderful. So is passing on faith to our children. It's about maintenance.

During the convocation that resulted in the election of Pope Francis, but before he was elected, he wrote a piece about what the next Pope would need to be. It was not about maintenance. It was about mission. What is the real mission of the church? What Jesus set out to do was to turn His disciples into apostles. Go forth and baptize throughout the world. The second Vatican Council focused on a lay apostolate. Faithful people reaching out to share the good news, but right in our own neighborhood. We need not go to Corinth.

Father James Mallon in his book entitled "Divine Renovation" expresses concern that the lay apostolate so hopefully proposed by the Council, actually became lay ministry. We usher, sing in the choir, lector, distribute Holy Communion, catechize children, and even support St. Columbanus, Haiti, Father Paul and other worthwhile ministries.

Pope Francis expressed concern that we have become self-referential, concerned with the maintenance of our parishes, and no longer dedicated to sharing the good news with the world, or even the neighborhood. Renew My Church is not just a request of our God to St. Francis Assisi. It is our mission. And,



Lord knows, we need it. It is time for the laity to take a much more active role in the church, not just as lay ministers, but as active leaders, and as apostles who go forth to share the good news.

In the weeks ahead we will hear much more about the "Summit" that took place on Oct. 1-3. Father Mallon and his team led almost 3,000 of us in a conference focused on insuring that the Archdiocese of Chicago would not be self-referential, would not be satisfied with just maintenance. Cardinal Cupich has devoted significant resources to support us in our efforts to fulfill our mission. We who are disciples of Christ are called to become apostles, and our mission is to lead people to a deepening encounter with Christ.

SACRED HEART SCHOOL WINS COVETED NATIONAL BLUE RIBBON DISTINCTION FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

Sacred Heart School (SHS) has been celebrating a very special honor, and we are excited to share this news with everyone at Divine Mercy Parish. SHS has been named a 2018 National Blue Ribbon School, which is a prestigious honor that recognizes the highest performing public and non-public schools in the country and celebrates school excellence at all levels. The award was bestowed upon Sacred Heart School by Betsy DeVos, secretary of the U.S. Department of Education.

"We recognize and honor your important work in preparing students for successful careers and meaningful lives," Ms. DeVos said in making the announcement. "Congratulations on your students' accomplishments and for your extraordinary commitment to meeting their unique needs."

Sacred Heart School is one of only 49 private schools recognized this year.. Ms. DeVos noted that the coveted National Blue Ribbon award affirms the hard work of educators, families and communities in creating safe and welcoming schools where students master challenging and engaging content.

"The students, parents, faculty and staff of Sacred Heart School could not be more excited about being named a 2018 National Blue Ribbon School," said School Principal Kristen Fink. "There are so many reasons our school is a truly special place to learn and grow, not only because of our test scores, which rank us in the top 15% in the country in English and mathematics, but also because of our commitment to meeting the individual needs of each child."

The process of being named a National Blue Ribbon School is arduous, and digs deeply into a school's leadership and teachers, its culture, values, commitment to students, parent-school partnership, ongoing professional development and more. SHS is committed to educating the "hearts and minds of students," Ms. Fink said, noting that service projects, Courtesy Catchers, Prayer Families, and Viking Bucks are key to fulfilling the school's Roman Catholic faithbased mission. "Sacred Heart is more than a community -- it's a family, and a second home to our students, their families, and our staff."

SHS integrates state-of-the-art technology into its curriculum. It has a STEAM Lab dedicated to Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics. In fact, since 2009, Sacred Heart School has been designated an Apple Distinguished School six times. In addition, a highly specialized Student Services Department helps SHS meet the individual needs of each student, including those who need support or enrichment.

Sacred Heart School will receive its commendation at a ceremony for all Blue Ribbon educators in Washington, D.C. on Thursday, November 8. Father Steve and Ms. Fink will be there to accept the award. A special celebration is being planned for Sunday, November 11, 2018, at the 4:30 p.m. Family Mass followed by a reception for all parishioners, students, family members, alumni and community members.
