FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

A GREAT VISIT

This past Saturday evening our parish welcomed twelve visitors from France at the 5:00 Mass at Sacred Heart church. They are visiting their friend, Rev. Daphne Cody, who is the pastor of St. Elizabeth Episcopal church in Glencoe. Pastor Daphne got to know them when she was on sabbatical in their hometown of Nantes, France.

The twelve men and women are all Roman Catholic and wanted to celebrate Mass with us. They brought along their pastor, Father Jean-Yves (who does not speak any English).

Three from the group were fluent in our language and did the translating, especially when the group joined some of our parish lay leadership from both houses of worship along with some staff members for supper afterwards in the parish center. We invited them to have a conversation with us to tell us more about themselves, since their parish in Nantes is the result of a combining of three churches. They've been at it for many years now and are thriving as a result.

The conversation was wonderful. The only thing they didn't like about the day was that as they walked around, they experienced a few snowflakes. They thought it was cold. We invited them to return in February to see just how cold it can get here. I don't think they they're going to take us up on the offer to join us for winter.

TO TEACH WHO CHRIST IS

St. PHILIP THE APOSTLE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE OCTOBER 2018

TTWCI

In August 2018, a status report on the St. Philip the Apostle *TO TEACH WHO CHRIST IS (TTWCI)* capital campaign was presented in the Divine Mercy weekly bulletin.

TTWCI Funds Collected to Date	\$746,400
Expenditures to Date:	
Church Roof Repair	\$277,000
Vestibule Restoration	\$55,300
Gymnasium Renovation	\$37,400 *
Storm and Sanitary Sewer Line Cleaning	\$40,100
Required Allocation to Archdiocese	\$220,000
Net Balance	\$116,600

* An additional \$20K remains to be spent with regard to the gymnasium sound system.

ADDITIONAL WORK AT SPA

We are still evaluating other proposed projects, including repairs to the church sound system (\$20K), possible improvement of the rectory heating system (\$50K), roof repairs on the convent and school (\$20K), tuckpointing on the convent, school and rectory (\$75K, and replacement of broken sump pumps (\$61K). Some of these projects may be funded from remaining TTWCI funds, as well as from St. Philip's building fund. We will continue to inform you about repairs and improvements to the St. Philip campus.

While their teacher was absent, they were absolutely ready to share their understanding of Jesus' sacrifice. They talked with a great excitement about this special place of being with God.

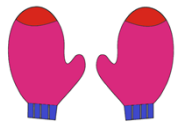
