## FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

### THE CHURCH YEAR ENDS

This weekend we close out the liturgical year with the celebration of Christ, the King of the Universe at all Masses. Next week we jump into a new Church year with the season of Advent.

Can you believe that Advent is already around the corner, which means that Christmas is not far behind? My goodness, time does fly!

### EXPLORING THE POWER OF NONVIOLENCE IN AN AGE OF VIOLENCE

Also, starting this weekend and running through the Third Sunday of Advent, we begin something new: a message series.

What's a message series?

The homilies for these four Sundays will explore the theme of nonviolence and peace-making through the lens of the Sunday scriptures, our Catholic tradition, and through the prayers of the Mass. We wanted to give maximum support to our parishioner, Terry Rynne, Professor of Peace Studies at Marquette University and Co-Founder of the Center for Peacemaking. Terry is offering a four-part symposium for all who are interested in pursuing the theme of nonviolence in greater depth.

Details on Terry's symposium can be found on the following page of this bulletin. Without a doubt this is an important subject matter. All you have to do is turn on the TV or read a newspaper to know that this is a timely topic that merits our attention. Terry will begin with Jesus and his teaching on nonviolence and expand from there. He'll also have guest presenters with him, including Phil Andrew, the Director of Violence Prevention Initiatives in the Archdiocese, Tim Jeffries, a teacher in *Peace Works*, and Fr. David Kelly of Precious Blood Ministries of Chicago.

You should also know that Terry has worked with the Holy See, along with several bishops and scholars from around the world, in crafting a number of authoritative statements on the Gospel testimony concerning Jesus' nonviolence as our living Catholic tradition continues to hone its teaching on peace and peace-making.

So, as we prepare to enter a new Church year, come to Mass to hear the message series and join with other interested parishioners in this extraordinary series of talks by Terry Rynne and his guest presenters..



### PASTOR INSTALLATION

The installation of a new pastor can be a wonderful event in the life of a parish. It is a powerful way to mark a new and exciting chapter in the life and growth of a parish community of faith. This occasion can be a profound expression of the ministry and service to which we are all called, and particularly that of a new parish pastor.

In order for the Archbishop of Chicago, Cardinal Cupich, to lead, support, and communicate with more than 350 parishes in Cook and Lake Counties, the Archdiocese is divided into 6 regions called Vicariates.

Each Vicariate has an Auxiliary Bishop at its head and he is called a Vicar. The Vicariates are then further divided into Deaneries with about 10 to 12 parishes and each one has a Dean, one of the pastors in the area.

Divine Mercy Parish is in Vicariate II and Deanery "A". When a priest is installed as a pastor of a parish, the Vicar and Dean come to the Parish for the Rite of Installation. Our Vicar is Bishop Mark Bartosic and our Dean is Fr. Kevin McCray, Pastor of St. Mary Parish, Evanston.

Please join us for the Installation Mass of Fr. Steven Lanza as our Pastor of Divine Mercy next Saturday, December 1st at 5:00 p.m. at Sacred Heart Church. A reception will follow in the Parish Center. We hope you'll be a part of this extraordinary celebration in the life of our parish!

There will be **NO Confessions or 5:30 p.m. Mass** at St. Philip on December 1st, so that all the priests may concelebrate at the Installation Mass and all parishioners can join together to share in this liturgy.

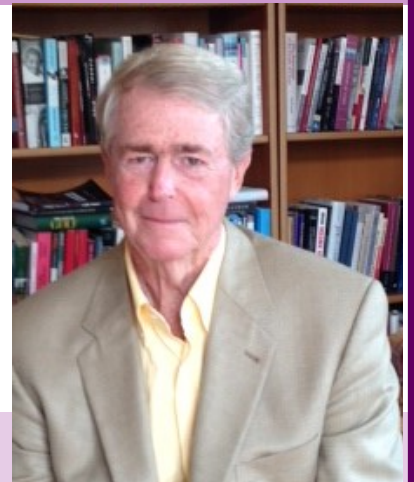

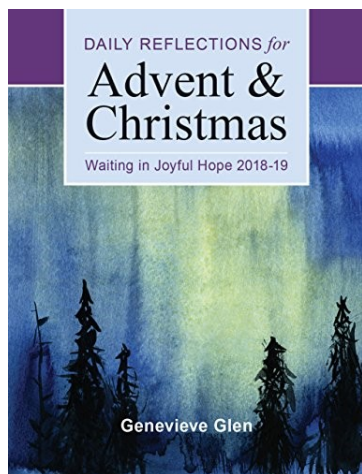

### CHILDREN'S LITURGY AT SACRED HEART CHURCH

#### What is it?

Children's Liturgy is actually the Liturgy of the Word for children. The Sunday scripture readings are proclaimed and explained on a level the children can understand and enjoy.

Children's Liturgy takes place at our 10:30 a.m. Sunday Mass from September through May (see schedule below).

Any child in pre-kindergarten through 3<sup>rd</sup> grade is encouraged to join us. Parents are also welcome – especially if your child is a little nervous with new experiences. No registration is necessary.



#### What exactly do they do?

Right after the opening prayer, the celebrant will invite the children to come forward for a blessing and the adult leader will lead them to the fireplace room in the parish office. After a brief welcome, they listen to the First Reading proclaimed from the Children's Lectionary. Next, the Gospel is proclaimed by one of the adult leaders. An age-appropriate reflection on the Word is shared by the leader through stories, discussions, or pictures - whatever the leader finds most appropriate to conveying the meaning of the scriptures. The children are then invited to share their own thoughts and ideas. The children return to the church after the Prayers of the Faithful to celebrate the Liturgy of the Eucharist with the entire community.

There will be a Parent and Tots class on Monday, November 12<sup>th</sup> from 9-10:00am.

Our 8<sup>th</sup> graders will be having their dance class Monday, November 12<sup>th</sup> in the Parish Center starting at 3:15pm.

Our second graders will be receiving the sacrament of their first **RECONCILIATION**. This will take place on Tuesday, November 27, at 6:30pm in church.

**REGISTRATION** for the 2019-2020 school year begins December 3<sup>rd</sup> at 7:30am! If you have a child who will be 3 or 4 years old by September 1, 2019, and wish to enroll them in our 3 year old Preschool or our JK extended day program you will need to fill out a registration form. If you have a child who will be 5 by September 1, 2019, and wish to enroll them in our full day kindergarten program, you will also need to fill out a registration form. All new students to Sacred Heart require a registration form and registration fee, as well as the child's Baptismal Certificate and Birth Certificate.

If your child is presently at Sacred Heart School and is simply moving up a grade, there is a re-registration form to fill out, and you will be guaranteed a spot for next year.

PS, JK and new kindergarten spots are first come first serve so don't delay in turning in your registration form to the office. We suggest getting here right when registration opens so you don't miss your opportunity to enroll your child at Sacred Heart. If you have any questions please contact the school office.
