



FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

CAPITAL PROJECTS STATUS

I want to thank all of our parishioners and friends, all those who have donated to the capital campaigns of the two former parishes that comprise this new parish of Divine Mercy. My gratitude also is directed to all those over the years who have given to our predecessor parishes and our current parish who make possible the current necessary work on the infrastructure of our two campuses.

There are a bunch of capital projects that, at the moment, are being worked on or there are a few slated to start soon. So I asked our very dedicated and hard-working Director of Operations, Michelle Wasielewski, to put together a report for this column.

I asked her to give a brief description of the project and where the funds are coming from in order to complete each project. Below is what she has for us in the way of this important information.



Father Steve asked that I share with you some of the building and grounds projects that we have been planning/executing at both Divine Mercy campuses in recent months.

The village of Northfield notified us that the deteriorating stucco on the outside of Hyde Park Day School (HPDS) needs immediate repair. We are in the process of obtaining bids and based on the bids received thus far, we need to do further analysis. Fortunately, we have remaining "To Teach Who Christ Is" funds from the St. Philip campaign, conducted before our merger, to cover the cost of these repairs.

We are also in the process of obtaining quotes for a number of new doors at HPDS, including all of the front doors, courtyard doors and various repairs to classroom doors. We have adequate

building funds and other reserves to cover the cost of these repairs.

We are continuing to progress on repairing gas lines at the SPA campus. All of the interior repairs are complete and we are in the process of developing a plan for the exterior lines based on discussions with both the gas company and our plumber. Again, we are fortunate that we have adequate building funds and other reserves to cover the cost of these repairs.

Using funds raised in the Legacy of the Heart campaign conducted by Sacred Heart prior to the merger of our two parishes, we have ordered and are awaiting installation of new windows (\$229,719) and new boilers (\$192,379) for our parish office building. The boiler project necessitated abatement of asbestos, which we completed during the summer. We anticipate that both of these projects will be complete by late October and will provide for increased energy efficiency (and a more comfortable working environment would be a nice perk!)

Earlier in the summer during a heavy rainfall, we had a flood in the parish office boiler room that destroyed the hot water heater and two sump pumps. Fortunately, the replacement cost of these items (\$31,104) is covered by our insurance, except for a \$1,000 deductible and a small charge to upgrade the sump pumps that comply with code.

The new boilers, hot water heater and sump pumps also created a need for a new electrical panel in our boiler room. The original panel, dating from 1957, was no longer capable of meeting our needs and we were fortunate to be able to replace the panel at an advantageous price of \$6,700.

The Finance Council recently approved structural repairs on the interior of the bell tower at Sacred Heart Church, as well as replacement of the netting in the tower to deter the neighborhood birds from setting up residence. For the same reason, we will install netting at the



parish center overhang. This project, contracted at a price of \$27,314 will be completed during the fall season.

This list is just the tip of the proverbial iceberg. Our A+ maintenance team has been dealing with many, many other repairs and projects during the summer months and we are truly blessed with their skills and fortitude!

A WONDERFUL DISCOVERY FOR THIS VOLUNTEER BY KATHLEEN CLARKE

I have to admit that I was a bit reluctant when asked to write about my experiences as a volunteer tutor at our sharing parish, St. Moses the Black's (formerly St.Columbanus) Augustus Tolton Catholic Academy. When I began, I was tutoring with other parishioners who had been giving their time for many years. Who was I to talk about our ministry with Tolton Academy when so many others had been involved for nearly a decade?

Secondly, the last title I ever thought I would apply to myself would be tutor. I even feel a bit embarrassed to use this word to describe something that I am doing. I am speaking for all of my fellow "tutors" when I say this. You see, we are not early education reading or math specialists, but simply ordinary women and men who truly enjoy spending time with young children again.

I will tell you that I fell in love at first sight with the students of Tolton Academy. Every time we visit, the children burst through the doorway to greet us with only pure joy and excitement on their faces. In fact, every time we visit this wonderful, small Catholic school on the South Side, each of our students is hoping that they will be selected by their teacher to spend some one-on-one time with us. I can't even explain how much these very young children, ranging in age from pre-kindergarten through fourth grade, look forward to receiving individual attention from us. For most of us, it has been quite a while since a young hand required help in learning how to hold a pencil or a budding reader cozied up to us to with a Dr. Seuss book. I never imagined it could be this much fun to work alongside an eager fourth grader tackling long division. It is a winwin situation for all of us.

A big reason why this effort has been so successful is that our Divine Mercy tutors give only the time they have, whether it is a few times a year or every week. We make it easy by carpooling and covering each other when a conflict arises. All of us are grateful for the enormous privilege of being invited into

this wonderful, small Catholic school on the South Side. It is a unique and rewarding opportunity; one that others were fortunate to find long before me.


