FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

THE SEASON TURNS

I think I've mentioned this before. My desk top computer faces the windows overlooking the parking area at Sacred Heart. Just on the other side of the windows are planted a row of trees.

Recently, I noticed the trees directly outside my office window are beginning to drop their leaves. It no longer appears as if I am working in a tree house. Here we are, at the turn of another season.

We officially entered into autumn on September 22, a little over a week-and-a-half ago. The older I get, the faster the weeks and months seem to go by. I'm not sure that I like that. On the other hand, I don't have much control over the passing of time or how fast it seems to go by. So be it.

I hope your autumn is a good one. The parish seems to be positioned well as we continue to pursue the mission of Christ in the world.

Two Alpha groups are continuing to meet. One group is in-person, the other is virtual. Folks are still contributing foodstuff to the Hunger Hero collections. Hospitality is offered once a month at St. Philip and Sacred Heart churches after select Masses. Given that we have resumed a maskwearing mandate for all our in-person gatherings, including Mass, the numbers of worshippers is holding steady and I continue to see new faces at both worship sites. We are regularly wiring sizable checks to our sister parish in Haiti, which means generous donors are continuing to support the rebuilding efforts there.

I want to underscore something from above: I continue to see new faces at both worship sites. While this is true, it's also anecdotal. I don't have hard numbers. But there are enough new faces each weekend to be noticeable. It's happening.

We continue on mission with Christ. We strive to be a warm and welcoming community. We strive to inspire a modern-day, intentional discipleship or following of Jesus Christ. Because of our relationship with the living, Risen Lord we strive to transform the world by serving the needs of others and, therefore, by being Good News to those who would most by it in their lives.

This autumn we move forward together and attempt as best we can to live up to our parish vision statement: **Divine**Mercy Parish is a welcoming community that inspires disciples of Jesus to share God's love and transform our world.

As this week begins to unfold for you, think ahead to what you might do in concert with other disciples in this parish to make a positive impact in the world. Where might that lead you? Where might that lead us?

I'd like to share some news with you and ask your prayers. A few weeks ago, I learned that I needed surgery on my Left Carotid artery. Then, after an Angiogram procedure, I found out that I would also need Open Heart surgery which takes priority.

On Thursday Oct. 21 at 7AM, I will have Open Heart Bypass surgery. I'm told that the Recovery period is between 4 to 6 weeks, so I will away from Divine Mercy Parish during that recuperation time.

It's been a real joy and privilege for me to be part of this awesome Parish Community over these past 5 years. With God's gracious help and great medical

care, I look forward to returning soon, healthier than ever.

CONTEMPLATIVE VISION FOR OUR TIMES: AN INTRODUCTORY PROGRAM TO CENTERING PRAYER

What is a Centering Prayer? It is a contemporary form of prayer of the heart; a prayer of simplicity and faith. It's a method of reducing the obstacles to receiving the gifts of contemplative prayer, and of facilitating the development of habits conducive to responding to the inspiration of the Holy Spirit.

Contemplative prayer is a development of one's relationship with Christ to the point of communing beyond words, thoughts, and feelings; a process of moving the simplified activity of waiting upon God to the ever-increasing dominance of the gifts of the Spirit as a source of one's prayer.

This introductory program includes the methods leading to the contemplative prayer in Spiritual Journey.

FIGHT HUNGER LOCALLY

A WONDERFUL DISCOVERY FOR THIS VOLUNTEER BY KATHLEEN CLARKE

I have to admit that I was a bit reluctant when asked to write about my experiences as a volunteer tutor at our sharing parish, St. Moses the Black's (formerly St.Columbanus) Augustus Tolton Catholic Academy. When I began, I was tutoring with other parishioners who had been giving their time for many years. Who was I to talk about our ministry with Tolton Academy when so many others had been involved for nearly a decade?

Secondly, the last title I ever thought I would apply to myself would be tutor. I even feel a bit embarrassed to use this word to describe something that I am doing. I am speaking for all of my fellow "tutors" when I say this. You see, we are not early education reading or math specialists, but simply ordinary women and men who truly enjoy spending time with young children again.

I will tell you that I fell in love at first sight with the students of Tolton Academy. Every time we visit, the children burst through the doorway to greet us with only pure joy and excitement on their faces. In fact, every time we visit this wonderful. small Catholic school on the South Side, each of our students is hoping

that they will be selected by their teacher to spend some one-on-one time with us. I can't even explain how much these very young children, ranging in age from pre-kindergarten through fourth grade, look forward to receiving individual attention from us. For most of us, it has been quite a while since a young hand required help in learning how to hold a pencil or a budding reader cozied up to us to with a Dr. Seuss book. I never imagined it could be this much fun to work alongside an eager fourth grader tackling long division. It is a winwin situation for all of us.

A big reason why this effort has been so

successful is that our Divine Mercy tutors give only the time they have, whether it is a few times a year or every week. We make it easy by carpooling and covering each other when a conflict arises. All of us are grateful for the enormous privilege of being invited into this wonderful, small Catholic school on the

South Side. It is a unique and rewarding opportunity; one that others were fortunate to find long before me.
