

FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

RUN, SPOT, RUN!

Growing up who didn't like books like the above titled story? I know I enjoyed and wanted to hear it again and again until I was able to sound out the words for myself.

I thought of "Run, Spot, Run!" because as I write this column, the Chicago marathon is underway. I'm not sure just how many are running in it, but if previous years are any indication, it is a pile of people.

Thoughts of the marathon remind me of Saint Paul's imagery in a few of his letters where he talks about having "run the race" (most notably in 2 Timothy 4:7, but also in Hebrews 12:1, Philippians 2:16, Galatians 2:2 and 5:7). Thoughts of the Chicago marathon also put me in mind of all the writings from Church commentators about how parishes currently pursuing revitalization and evangelization are in a marathon, not a sprint.

NO SILVER BULLET

If I'm going to be using book titles for the subheadings in this column I'm might as well continue in the same vein with Daniel Im's 2017 book entitled "No Silver Bullet." The title says it all. There's no magic silver bullet, no one particular thing, that if we do it as a parish, we will grow and become stronger, better and more adept at the mission of Christ in the world.

Im's point is that there are a handful of small shifts that will transform ministry and make parishes more viable. Let's look at the first of the five shifts that Im describes; it's changing from destination to direction.

What's he mean by this? With regard to discipleship, Im says that the more we look at discipleship as a direction versus a set destination, the better off we'll be as a parish as we go about designing resources for discipleship. He mentions that if discipleship was only about destination then Saint Paul would have been fully mature the

moment he encountered Christ and submitted his life to the Lord.

Clearly Saint Paul matured in his discipleship throughout his ministry. So too should we. We shouldn't be surprised by this insight.

In every other aspect of life and living we don't stop learning and growing and maturing. Just because we graduate from grammar school doesn't mean we're all set for life. We go on to learn more in high school. We go from there to learning more in college. Perhaps we go on to graduate school. Even after that, we continue to learn. In fact, all of our formal education simply prepares us to be life-long learners.

In the same way, discipleship doesn't end with the religious formation we received in our youth. We keep at it.

All of which means that as a parish, we have a ways to go in cultivating a life-long following of Jesus (discipleship) as young people, as middle-aged folks and as older folks. This is why we are putting such emphasis on Alpha.

It's a program designed to answer adult-sized questions about life, love, faith, God, Jesus, the Spirit and Church. It's also only meant as the **first** step (hence the name "Alpha," the first letter in the Greek alphabet) in a life-long adult process of being oriented toward Jesus Christ.

Another way to say all of this is that the journey toward Christ, and therefore toward each other in love and service, never really stops this side of heaven. Parishes that understand this notion will offer resources and platforms for the journey of discipleship for all ages, that is, for people who are new to Jesus, as well as those who have had a relationship with him for many years.

This shift in parish priorities from destination to direction is only the first small step Daniel Im talks about. There are four more. Stayed tuned in future bulletins. You may see more in this



column on those other small steps forward.

Meanwhile, in our ministry efforts, we keep at it.


DIVINE RENOVATION

That's the title of Father James Mallon's book. It's the single best Catholic book out there that deals with the challenges of the modern secular world and how our parishes can adapt to those challenges, meet them and grow.

Father Mallon himself uses the image of the marathon to describe the process of change he advocates in his book. We didn't get into this situation of decline and falling numbers overnight. We won't get out of it overnight.

So, like Saint Paul, we keep running the good race. We keep planting seeds and we keep praying for the help of the Holy Spirit as we continue to evaluate, prepare our five year strategic plan, meet the needs of people and proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ to those near and far.

What is a Centering Prayer? It is a contemporary form of prayer of the heart; a prayer of simplicity and faith. It's a method of reducing the obstacles to receiving the gifts of contemplative prayer, and of facilitating the development of habits conducive to responding to the inspiration of the Holy Spirit.

Contemplative prayer is a development of one's relationship with Christ to the point of communing beyond words, thoughts, and feelings; a process of moving the simplified activity of waiting upon God to the ever-increasing dominance of the gifts of the Spirit as a source of one's prayer.

This introductory program includes the methods leading to the contemplative prayer in Spiritual Journey.

If you feel that God is calling you for a deeper relationship with Him , a six week session will follow the Introductory Program.



PRAY FOR OUR ALPHA GUESTS





RESPECT LIFE MONTH

In October, the Church in the United States observes Respect Life Month. During this Year of St. Joseph, the humble and often hidden carpenter of Nazareth is guiding our reflections on the gift of life.

At the word of an angel, Joseph took Mary into his home, despite the mysterious nature of her pregnancy. He accompanied Mary in her pregnancy, assisted at the birth of the Messiah, presented Jesus in the Temple, fled with his family far from their homeland to protect them, and lovingly raised Jesus as his own son.

Like every other human family, the Holy Family had to confront real and concrete challenges. Yet, "in every situation, Joseph declared his own 'fiat'" (*Patris corde, 3*). His "yes" to the Lord meant that regardless of the hardship and personal sacrifice to himself, he consistently chose to put the needs of Mary and Jesus before his own. Joseph's devotion helps reveal to us

our own call to show special care for the lives of those whom God has entrusted to us. Joseph shows us how to say "yes" to life, despite our own fears, frailties, and weaknesses. May his witness of courage and faithful trust in the Lord inspire us to welcome,

safeguard, and defend the precious gift of life.

SOME REFLECTIONS

During this Respect Life Month, we can start to become more like St. Joseph by asking ourselves a few questions and reflecting on them: Do we realize how precious every person is? As we go about our day, do we treat people accordingly? How can we help those in our society who are struggling to welcome new life, like moms who are pregnant or parenting in difficult circumstances? How can we reach out to those having a hard time seeing the worth of their own lives? How do we reassure those at the end of life who are afraid they are a burden or feel like their lives don't have meaning?

At times, we may feel like we can't make a difference, or that we're unequipped for what God is asking of us. But St. Joseph "teaches us that faith in God includes believing that he can work even through our fears, our frailties and our weaknesses" (PC, 2).

When human life is threatened, when our brothers and sisters need support welcoming or embracing life, may we lovingly respond with the faithfulness of Joseph.

LET US PRAY

Dearest St. Joseph, at the word of an angel, you lovingly took Mary into your home.

As God's humble servant, you guided the Holy Family on the road to Bethlehem, welcomed Jesus as your own son in the shelter of a manger, and fled far from your homeland for the safety of both Mother and Child.

We praise God that as their faithful protector, you never hesitated to sacrifice for those entrusted to you. May your example inspire us also to welcome, cherish, and safeguard God's most precious gift of life.

Help us to faithfully commit ourselves to the service and defense of human life - especially where it is vulnerable or threatened. Obtain for us the grace to do the will of God in all things. Amen.
