
# FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

# STRATEGIC PLAN

The Parish Council is trying hard to finish its work on the parish strategic plan. We have two meetings scheduled for this month. We usually meet once a month but we really want to complete our work on this important plan.

As I say this, a couple of points come to mind that I'd like to share with you.

The first is that while the Parish Council will finish its part in the strategic plan, you need to know that both the staff and the Senior Leadership Team will be adding their own touches to the plan by articulating details. In other words, the

Parish Council is crafting the "big picture." The staff and Senior Leadership Team will be taking what the Council gives them and fine tuning and filling in the "how to," the execution of the plan.

The second point I'd like to share with you is that while the plan will be on paper, as we move through each year of the five year plan the Parish Council will assess where we are at and as a result of this constant evaluation update and revise the plan as needed. In other words, the plan is meant to be flexible. There's no point to crafting a strategic plan that is so set in stone that it doesn't correspond to reality. We all know that events on the ground will determine the effectiveness of the strategic plan and that the plan itself may change things such that we need to "keep up" with the changing face of ministry and mission in our parish.

This is what makes this work so important. Think of it this way: operating with the strategic plan in hand we will be embarking on a work in progress over the next five years.

The best thing that we can all do to ensure the success and effectiveness of the strategic plan is to keep praying to the Holy Spirit. We will do well and bear fruit as long as we are open to the Spirit and the Spirit's direction and guidance.

You're all certainly aware that many companies and organizations work on strategic plans to chart their future. We differ in that we are not a company and we are not a mere organization. We are a Church and as such we have a powerful engine for positive and fruitful change, the Holy Spirit! Come, Holy Spirit and enlighten the hearts of the faithful!



What is a Centering Prayer? It is a contemporary form of prayer of the heart; a prayer of simplicity and faith. It's a method of reducing the obstacles to receiving the gifts of contemplative prayer, and of facilitating the development of habits conducive to responding to the inspiration of the Holy Spirit.

Contemplative prayer is a development of one's relationship with Christ to the point of communing beyond words, thoughts, and feelings; a process of moving the simplified activity of waiting upon God to the ever-increasing dominance of the gifts of the Spirit as a source of one's prayer.

This introductory program includes the methods leading to the contemplative



prayer in Spiritual Journey.

# **RESPECT LIFE MONTH**

In October, the Church in the United States observes Respect Life Month. During this Year of St. Joseph, the humble and often hidden carpenter of Nazareth is guiding our reflections on the gift of life.

At the word of an angel, Joseph took Mary into his home, despite the mysterious nature of her pregnancy. He accompanied Mary in her pregnancy, assisted at the birth of the Messiah, presented Jesus in the Temple, fled with his family far from their homeland to protect them, and lovingly raised Jesus as his own son.

Like every other human family, the Holy Family had to confront real and concrete challenges. Yet, "in every situation, Joseph declared his own 'fiat'" (Patris corde, 3). His "yes" to the Lord meant that regardless of the hardship and personal sacrifice to himself, he consistently chose to put the needs of Mary and Jesus before his own. Joseph's devotion helps reveal to us our own call to show special care for

## SOME REFLECTIONS

During this Respect Life Month, we can start to become more like St. Joseph by asking ourselves a few questions and reflecting on them: Do we realize how precious every person is? As we go about our day, do we treat people accordingly? How can we help those in our society who are struggling to welcome new life, like moms who are pregnant or parenting in difficult circumstances? How can we reach out to those having a hard time seeing the worth of their own lives? How do we reassure those at the end of life who are afraid they are a burden or feel like their lives don't have meaning?

At times, we may feel like we can't make a difference, or that we're unequipped for what God is asking of us. But St. Joseph "teaches us that faith in God includes believing that he can work even through our fears, our frailties and our weaknesses" (PC, 2). When human life is threatened, when our brothers and sisters need support
