FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

MASS COUNTS

Each year every parish in the Archdiocese takes up the weekend Mass attendance counts in October. It's usually done during the homily time by the ushers who then report the numbers to our Director of Operations, Michelle Wasielewski.

Last year, due to COVID19 restrictions, the October count was not taken. That only makes sense, given that the Sunday obligation was lifted by the Cardinal as we fought the pandemic and limits were placed on how many folks could attend Mass with social distancing.

This year the October count resumes and you can see the numbers in the sidebar on this page. The number of Mass goers is down compared with our pre-pandemic attendance.

This is only to be expected. After more than a year-and-a-half fighting COVID people have developed new habits. Some do not make time for the Lord on the weekend. Some are replacing Mass attendance with other pursuits. Some are watching either the livestreamed Masses from our parish churches or they are watching Mass on TV. On the other hand, there are new members of the parish attending Mass on the weekends.

It will take a while to develop new habits that include in-person attendance. Meanwhile, things are in flux and shifting. It may be in our

future some of the faithful will continue watching Mass remotely and join in Holy Communion on an occasional basis. By writing about this, I'm not promoting the practice; I'm simply acknowledging what others have told me.


There will always be a place for inperson worship. We humans enjoy gathering together. Think back when in the darkest days of COVID19 we could not get together. People went a little stir crazy. It's not good for us to be isolated and alone, staring at the four walls where we live.

That holds for our faith practice. The word "church" in Greek from which we get our English term "ecclesial" literally means "gathered together." The Lord gathers us together to praise and worship him. We hear the word of God in Scripture and we celebrate and partake of the Eucharist. We can read the word of God on our own, true. But we cannot celebrate Eucharist on our own. It's meant to be shared. It's meant to be done together so that we gain strength not just from the Sacrament itself but from the encouragement of each other. Then, we go forth from Mass to change the world as we engage in the mission of Christ, serving others in need.

As one of the ancient Fathers of the Church described, "The Church makes the Eucharist; the Eucharist makes the Church."



There will always be a need for in person sacramental celebrations: robust, delightful, encouraging and uplifting celebrations of the faithful.



- We ask that all gift cards for **St. Moses** be delivered to Divine Mercy by **Monday, December 6th** so they can be delivered to them in time for their Christmas distribution.
- All gifts cards for **St. Benedict the African** will be accepted up until **Thursday, January 6th**, the feast of the Epiphany. Two deliveries to St. Benedict will take place: one before Christmas, and one after. St. Benedict prefers to distribute the gift cards through out the year to parishioners in need.

**You'll notice the gifts cards are different for each Sharing Parish. The larger amounts for St. Moses replaces the multitude of gifts that have been purchased for each family in the past. The variety of stores and amounts for St. Benedict reflect their needs throughout the entire year (not just at Christmas).







