

FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

THE POWER OF PRAYER

I've mentioned this in prior columns. Every day before I'm out in public, I pray.

I take the time to pray through the Liturgy of the Hours, Morning Prayer. In the quiet prior to leaving the rectory for whatever, including for daily Mass, I set my focus on the Lord in prayer.

I do that within the traditional format of the Liturgy of the Hours (some refer to it as the Office Book or the Breviary). Lay people are encouraged now to pray the Liturgy of the Hours and can do so by purchasing the one-volume or the more extensive four-volume set of books. You can also access the Liturgy of the Hours on-line. When I'm on vacation, that's what I do instead of lugging around the books with me.

Here at home, however, I use the book version. In fact, I use the large print edition. Easier on the eyes.

The holy cards I get at funerals I put in the front cover of the current volume. I will often look through those holy cards to recall those who now sleep in death.

Another personal addition that I engage in is to pray for persons by name who have asked me to pray for them after the formal petitions in Morning Prayer. I have a list. It's a paper list that expands or contracts depending on peoples' needs. On vacation, I have a photo of the list that I refer to.

HERE FATHER, YOU MIGHT LIKE THIS

Not long after one of my columns mentioning my Morning Prayer practice of praying for individuals by name, a parishioner shared with me a prayer that someone gave her that she thought I too might like. She was right.

It's a prayer to my guardian angel.

I'd like to share this prayer text with you. Perhaps you'd like to use it in your own prayer when you are praying for a whole bunch of people by name (or perhaps dear people you hold in your heart in prayer).

The prayer goes like this:

Guardian Angel of those whose names you can read in my heart, watch over them with every care. make their way easy, and their labors fruitful. dry their tears if they weep; sanctify their joys; raise their courage if they weaken; restore their hope if they lose heart. their health if they be ill, truth if they err, repentance if they fall.

Amen.

I think it's a lovely prayer. I hope you do too. Enjoy it. Use it. Keep praying. Keep praying for family, friends, and those who have asked you to pray for them.

There's a power in prayer. It's the power of invoking God, commending oneself and others to the Lord. Can I get an "Amen" on that?

- We ask that all gift cards for **St. Moses** be delivered to Divine Mercy by **Monday, December 6th** so they can be delivered to them in time for their Christmas distribution.
- All gifts cards for **St. Benedict the African** will be accepted up until **Thursday, January 6th**, the feast of the Epiphany. Two deliveries to St. Benedict will take place: one before Christmas, and one after. St. Benedict prefers to distribute the gift cards through out the year to parishioners in need.

**You'll notice the gifts cards are different for each Sharing Parish. The larger amounts for St. Moses replaces the multitude of gifts that have been purchased for each family in the past. WHY YOU SHOULD CONSIDER OUR ONLINE ROSARY ON WEEKDAY MORNINGS

The Mother of God appeared at Fatima over 100 years ago and said, "Say the Rosary every day to obtain peace for the world." Pope Pius IX said, "Give me an army saying the Rosary and I will conquer the world." Another saint said, "The Holy Rosary is a powerful weapon. Use it with confidence and you'll be amazed at the results". Given these quotes, it is clear praying the Rosary is important!

My name is John Russell, and my family has been parishioners of Divine Mercy for 32 years. In that time, I have served on the Parish Council, School Board, and Finance Council, among other roles. Divine Mercy has served as the focal point for our family and the growth of our Faith.



Over a year ago, during a period of turmoil, I pledged to pray the Rosary every day. At first, I had a

hard time keeping the commitment. At times I would rush through the Rosary to check the box. I confess a few times I missed the entire day. But over time, something changed. I realized it added significant value and it was something that should be a priority. It was not always perfect, distractions were present, but I realized the sheer intent of praying the Rosary was important. As more time passed, it became clear this was no longer something I wanted to do but something I must do. The formulaic process became more meditative. It was a calming time, a centering time, a reflective time, and a spiritual time.

All the while, I was praying by myself, but one day I signed into a community online and listened to others recite the Rosary. Some were on Zoom, some had their cameras off, and others had just called in on their phone. . It became clear that praying in a community enhanced the experience. I felt compelled to start a group within Divine Mercy, but also open to others. We have been praying together each morning at 7:30. I have found this to be my most enjoyable service as a parishioner. Each day we have 8 to 14 people. We would love to have more people praying with us. If you have long prayed the Rosary, please join us. We welcome your experience. If you are new to the Rosary, please join us. We would be excited to have you involved. The cost is low -20minutes of your time. Hopefully, the benefit is immeasurable - a strengthening in your Faith, a greater peace in your life, and a knowledge that your prayers are shared with and for others.




HAVE YOU LOST A LOVED ONE IN THE LAST YEAR?

CONTEMPLATIVE AMBIENCE INTRODUCED AT THE 4:30 P.M. MASS

With our days ending in darkness much earlier, and the liturgical focus of Advent just

weeks away, we have introduced a contemplative ambience to the 4:30 p.m. Mass. Elements of this contemplative ambience include dim, softer lighting with the use of candles to enhance our worship space, music that is more chant or Taizé like, and a tone that encourages us to slow down and focus our attention on the presence of the Lord around us and within us. Contemplation calms our mind and spirit. Thus, it can help us relieve worries and stress. It also leaves room for our mind to wander and then to focus again. This helps us clarify our thoughts and invites the Holy Spirit to enrich our prayer. This also is easily accomplished with the familiar text and responses of the Mass. It will provide a wonderful way to center us in our activities for the coming weeks during this busy time of year.

You'll notice a few changes to the Mass that will help create this new ambience and help us to dwell deeply in Christ's presence around and within us. We encourage you to limit conversation with other worshipers around you as soon as you enter your pew. You'll notice the Priest (and Deacon if present) will already be seated on the altar, sitting still, listening to the Lord. The assembly is invited to do the same. The Entrance Song is started, and when indicated by the Priest, we are invited to stand and begin with the familiar words "In the name of the Father ...". The other parts of the Mass remain unchanged. They simply incorporate this theme of contemplation. (You'll also see some of the pews roped off to encourage us to gather together.)

We invite you to come experience the "new" 4:30 p.m. Mass, and dwell in the quiet love of the Lord.




Feed the Hungry
