#### FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

#### **DISCIPLESHIP PATHWAY**

The parish is slowly putting together what we're calling a "discipleship pathway" for those adults among us who want to either embark upon or deepen their intentional following of Jesus. Obviously, once begun, this is a life-long task.

In the pursuit of that task there are many different and creative ways folks can cultivate their relationship with Jesus such that it becomes more and more intentional and more and more transparent in their lives. In fact, I wrote about various means to do so in last week's bulletin.

This weekend, I'd like to follow up a bit on this notion of a discipleship pathway by sharing with you my own experience of *Rejoice!* 

That's the title of a short booklet that our small faith-sharing groups are using this Advent season to guide the discussion as they meet in their groups. We've got a handful of small groups meeting these days totalling about 40 people who are using this resource.

Given my schedule, I'm not able to meet in one of the small groups but I do have the booklet and I use it every morning after I finish praying the Liturgy of the Hours/Morning Prayer. I'm really loving this little book.

It's opened a whole new avenue of prayer for me. By the grace of God, the exercises in the booklet have been a big help to me as I've traveled through these Advent days. I especially like the scripture selections and the reflection questions. I have also quickly come to enjoy the space in the booklet for journaling in response to the questions.

Journaling is not something I have done to a great extent. I have never kept a diary. But I'm taking to these exercises these days. Apparently, it's meeting a spiritual need and, I like to think, improving my intentional

following of the Lord as I reflect upon the movement of the Spirit in my life.

Pope Benedict XVI, in meeting with youth in Rome before the Twenty-First World Youth Day (April 6, 2006), said this:

It is necessary to enter into real friendship with Jesus in a personal relationship with him and not to know who Jesus is only from others or from books, but to live an ever deeper personal relationship with Jesus, where we can begin to understand what he is asking of us. And then, the awareness of what I am, of my possibilities: on the one hand, courage, and on the other, humility, trust and openness.

I hope that you are able to engage in a courageous spiritual practice this Advent which deepens your relationship



to the Lord Jesus in such a way that he becomes even more present in your life than he has been, a practice that is filled with humility, trust and openness. Even if you're not using *Rejoice!* but some other resource or method of prayer, scripture reflection, or a combination thereof, may this Advent bring you closer to Jesus and to his community of disciples, the Church. May you travel this Advent prepared for the coming celebration of Christmas.




#### FR. DAN SHARES SOME NOTES!

# SOME THOUGHTS ON "HOW" TO MAKE A HOLY HOUR FROM THE WORD ON FIRE INSTITUTE

The following is an excerpt from an article written by Fr. Billy Swan for the Word on Fire Institute in January of 2019. The article stresses that sometimes we need a little guidance for Adoration to help us focus.

"The first twenty minutes before the Lord really present in the Eucharist is a sacred time of intimacy between us and him. It is a time to just be present to our God who welcomes us and accepts us. In the words of St. John Vianney, it is a time when "I look at Him and he looks at me." Before the Eucharist is a time when we lean on Jesus' breast, like John did at the last supper, and allow his heart to speak to ours. This was the episcopal motto of Blessed (now Saint) John Henry Newman: cor ad cor loquitur (heart speaks to heart). We begin to grow in our "interior knowledge of the Lord" as we contemplate his words, his life, and his real presence before us (St. Ignatius of Loyola, Spiritual Exercises, 104). Here is the zone into which we are drawn in the first third of our holy hour, where our heart speaks to his. It is also a time when we listen to him and allow him to speak to us. This is a time when we can tell him everything about how we are and how we feel. It is a time to tell him about our day and to ask his help in ways in which we need it. Above all it is a time to thank the Lord for his presence and action in our lives and to adore him for his goodness,

truth, and mercy. It is also an opportunity to present to him the things we don't understand, our sins, failings, and the worries that burden us. In this twenty minutes of our holy hour, we bask in the light of his love that never fails us.

The second twenty minutes can be a time when we intercede for all the people we know and are part of our lives. At this stage of our prayer, we bring to the Lord all who have asked us to pray for them, our families and friends both living and dead. In this time we pray for all we have met in the past day or week, the conversations we had, the things we have said and done. Often during this time in the holy hour, some person will arise in our minds who we feel the Lord is calling us to pray for, reach out to, to contact or to visit. It is also a time to focus on what lies ahead—our next appointment, our next challenge, or perhaps a courageous conversation we need to have with someone to clear the air. In this time of prayer, our hearts are reminded that our call is to love others in Christ's name, and that the same Lord before us in the Eucharist is the same Lord present in everyone, especially in the least of his brothers and sisters (cf. Matt 25:31ff).

The final twenty minutes can be a time when we pray for the entire human family and the whole universe. So we might pray for persecuted Christians around the world, for the victims of famine, and for an end to conflicts and wars. We might pray for the Church around the world, for the Holy Father



on a foreign visit, or for all missionaries away from home. We might pray for the environment and for the care of the earth, thinking of ways to conserve more and consume less. For his beauty revealed in creation, this is a time to thank God for the sun, moon, and stars that were made through his Word present before us in the Eucharist. Finally, we can pray in this time for the peace among all nations for which Jesus lived and died—and that it might become a reality in our troubled world today.

There are many ways of praying and many ways of making a holy hour for "the Spirit blows where it wills" (John 3:8). But sometimes we need a little guidance that helps us to focus. Above is a guide for a holy hour of Adoration before the Lord, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. It starts off with his love for us but ends with a prayer that blesses God for the whole of creation. In this way we exercise our share in Christ's priesthood that lovingly embraces every individual but extends to the entire cosmos we inhabit."



# JOIN US DURING ADVENT FOR OUR NEW CONTEMPLATIVE MASS ON SUNDAYS AT 4:30 P.M. AT SACRED HEART CHURCH

With the earlier darkness and the liturgical focus of Advent just weeks away, we have introduced a contemplative ambience to the 4:30 p.m. Mass. Elements of this contemplative ambience include dim, softer lighting with the use of candles to enhance our worship space, music that is more chant or Taizé like, and a tone that encourages us to slow down and focus our attention on the presence of the Lord around us and within us. Contemplation calms our mind and spirit. It will provide a wonderful way to center us in our activities for the coming weeks during this busy time of year.

You'll notice a few changes to the Mass that will help create this new ambience and help us to dwell deeply in Christ's





presence around and within us. We encourage you to limit conversation with other worshipers around you as soon as you enter your pew. You'll notice the Priest (and Deacon if he is present) will already be seated on the altar, sitting still, listening to the Lord. The assembly is invited to do the same. The Entrance Song is started, and when indicated by the Priest, we are invited to stand and begin with the familiar words "In the name of the Father ...". The other parts of the Mass remain unchanged. They simply incorporate this theme of contemplation.

We invite you to come experience the "new" 4:30~p.m. Mass, and dwell in the quiet love of the Lord.
