# FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

### THE SEASON OF GIFTS

We exchange gifts at Christmas to show esteem and respect for others. We also exchange gifts at this time of year to express love and affection to friends and family members.

It is the season of gift-giving, the greatest gift being that of the Incarnation of God among us, Jesus Christ, who brings us salvation out of love for all humankind. This divine gift relies on the complete outpouring of self. The Messiah does not hold back but gives everything for our sakes.

The greatest gift a pastor can receive is the dedication and commitment of parishioners to the parish. There are many folks in this family of faith who give of themselves to make Divine Mercy Parish a wonderful, welcoming and loving household radiating the presence of God into the world.

I am so very grateful to all those in the Divine Mercy community who work so hard to make this parish a beautiful expression of the Good News of Jesus Christ. If I included the names of all those individuals, it would be a long one. You'd recognize many of the names.

I'd like to single out two people, knowing this particular bulletin will be shared with the parish not only on the Fourth Sunday of Advent, December 19 but also Christmas Eve and Day. The two people I'd like to highlight have been serving on the Senior Leadership Team for the past three years, Claudia Goodrich and Jim Dietz.

That's not the only thing they do within the community of the parish, but it's a huge thing. The Senior Leadership Team has been meeting almost every Monday for a brief boxed lunch and then for a two hour meeting these past three years. That's a lot of time Claudia and Jim, along with staff members Sue Lehocky, Michelle Wasielewski and Judy Pyke (and during her tenure here, the former principal, Kristen Fink).

When I asked the staff members to serve on SLT they didn't have much choice, being staff members. Laity who are nonstaff could say no to the invitation, but Jim and Claudia chose to say yes. We were blessed to have them on board. They've offered valuable insights in our meetings and helped to further the aims of the parish as we continue to pursue renewal through such realities as Alpha, evangelization, and intentional missional discipleship. Jim and Claudia are stepping away from the SLT after three years. They will continue to be committed parishioners working hard for Divine Mercy, they just won't be sacrificing Monday afternoons to SLT.

Thank you, Claudia and Jim, and thank you to your families, too. You have been invaluable in building the new reality here. In your work on SLT, you have been two priceless gifts to Divine Mercy Parish!



"As my time on the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) comes to a close, I am reflecting on the past 3 years since Sacred Heart and St. Philip the Apostle parishes were merged into one, that being Divine Mercy. The new parish has made great progress in those three years.

The parish faced many issues at its outset and many of those were addressed via the SLT. Some concerns were more immediate than others. Firstly, developing a meaningful and appropriate vision for Divine Mercy was a foremost priority. A more medium term concern was the consequences of the forthcoming successive retirement of our priests starting with Fr. Mike Solazzo in 2020 and Fr. Dean Semmer in 2021. With the reduced availability of priests to celebrate masses a change in the mass schedules for weekends and weekdays was necessary. Both of these issues were completed with much discussion,



compromise, and respect for both worship sites.

I have enjoyed working with my fellow members of the SLT. I will miss participating with them to implement the many improvements still envisioned for Divine Mercy as we progress along the path towards our vision. In the very near future, the Parish Council will complete development of a strategic plan for the parish. Along with the parish staff, the SLT will be developing and helping implement the resulting actions. It will be a big task but I am confident the SLT and staff will always be striving to do what is best for our parish to strengthen our discipleship as individuals and as a parish."

"Divine Mercy is a welcoming community that inspires disciples of Jesus to share God's love and transform the world. That is our parish's vision statement. We worked on that vision statement as members of the inaugural Senior Leadership Team (SLT). All members of the SLT had attended the Renew My Church Summit hosted by the Archdiocese of Chicago and kicked off the renewal process. At that summit, we heard the Chief Operating Officer of the Archdiocese tell the audience to, essentially, wake up and realize that the secular culture was evangelizing us and our children and we, Catholics, were sitting back, culturally silent, unprepared, and perhaps unwilling, to speak up and evangelize our own good news, the Gospel. It was a revelatory moment for me as I realized that I was one of those Catholics, comfortable sitting in the back of the church, quiet about my faith. But now the call had come for me to step up and lean into my faith. Father Steve invited me to join the SLT. It was my first step. Then came helping host Alpha sessions, then

leading small faith groups, then speaking up at a Mother's Day testimonial, then joining a Bible study group, then taking Scripture classes, then organizing weekly Eucharistic Adoration at Sacred Heart Church. What team am I on? I am on the Catholic team. I wear that jersey. I am proud of my faith. I will speak out. I will proclaim the gospel.

Thank you, Divine Mercy, for inviting me to be a member of SLT and converting me into an intentional disciple, one inspired to share God's love and transform the world. If you want to get active in our parish and with your faith, find one of us, ask us questions, join the team. And, may God bless you."


