



#### A FOND FAREWELL

Sue Lehocky has worked at this parish (initially she was hired for the former Sacred Heart Parish and then she was hired for the new Divine Mercy Parish) since 2015. She began as the Director of Religious Education, overseeing the faith formation programs for public school kids in grades pre-kindergarten through eighth grade.

In her capacity as the DRE, Sue kept innovating year after year, to provide the best type of faith formation for our youth. Under her leadership, the program evolved, as it has continued to do so under the current leader, Kathy Handelman.

It was during Sue's time as DRE that the parish began offering an alternative to the regular formation program with once-a-month gatherings of adults and kids for a unit preparation that would continue in family's homes the remainder of the month. That alternative is called Family Faith Connection and has provided an example to other parishes in the quest to change things up for the better.

When we morphed into the new, combined parish with its two churches, St. Philip the Apostle and Sacred Heart, we knew that we wanted and needed to create a new position, the Director of Evangelization and Life Long Formation. This directorship would be key in promoting a sense of missionary discipleship among our adult parishioners.

Sue stepped into this crucial position and performed ably and well over the past few years. Evangelization, while we've always paid lip service to the concept, has not been actively pursued in our Catholic parishes. In today's secular world that does not support involvement in organized religion, evangelization is all the more necessary. Sue has brought expertise and passion to all our efforts at evangelizing.

The Alpha program is a key component

of evangelization. Under Sue's guidance, we have mounted a handful of Alpha courses which have contributed to the health and welfare of our new parish community. Another key component of evangelization is the hospitality and welcome ministry that enlivens our weekend Masses. COVID has impacted this welcoming ministry, but Sue's leadership in this area keeps it on the front burner even if the flame is at medium instead of high due to the coronavirus. We'll get there in God's good time.

Sue will be leaving ministry at Divine Mercy Parish as of January 10. She begins her new job at the Office for Evangelization and Missionary Discipleship for the Archdiocese of Chicago. In that capacity, she will check in with us, possibly lending a hand here at Divine Mercy from time to time, as she will in many other parishes throughout the Archdiocese.

This is one of the things we seem to be doing here at Divine Mercy, forming staff as strong leaders who go forth from here to help elsewhere with their expertise, dedication and passion for renewal and revitalization. Check out Sue's note to all of you in the column on the right.

Thank you, Sue, for the past seven years. We wish you well at the Archdiocese. May you continue to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ and may your spirited example help us and others to do the same!



We invite you to take a break and try Alpha, an opportunity to explore the basics of the Christian faith.

What is Alpha? Alpha is a series of gatherings where guests have the opportunity to explore life and the Christian Faith in a friendly and inviting atmosphere where no question is seen as too simple or too complex. It's an opportunity to explore the big questions of life. Why am I here? What is my purpose? Is there more to life than this? Why is there suffering in the world?

Who's it for? Absolutely anybody! Non-Christians, fallen away Catholics, cradle Catholics, anyone interested in exploring or questioning the meaning of life

How does it work? Each session includes a meal (except for the online version!), a short video followed by a chance to share thoughts and ideas on the topic in a small group setting. There's no obligation to say anything, there's nothing you can't say (seriously) and there's no such thing as a silly question. It's an opportunity to hear from others and contribute your own perspective in an honest and informal setting.

Alpha is a key component of what the future holds for us as we build our new

## CHRISTMAS GREETINGS FROM FR. PAUL IN SRI LANKA

Dear Friends in the Lord,

Grace and peace from the Infant Jesus, as we experience His love in our Hearts. I always give thanks to God, for the many graces, materials and spiritual, that he has enriched you, with.

Covid -19 pandemic confronted us, for the past two years, and tested our faith, and our trust in God. Some of us responded graciously, and evoked in our hearts, divine, presence of love, compassion, generosity, and sharing. You and I experienced this disposition of our hearts, and like Jesus, "a man for others", thought of the elderly, the lonely, the vulnerable, the children, and the people in need and distress.

My personal experience, during these heartbreaking moments, has been outwardly, and inwardly impactful. As I reached out, with the help of generous, loving hearts, my heart, was sensitized to compassion, energy and understanding. Our Counseling Centre was supported by many generous people. We were involved in Psycho-social compassionate work. We distributed dry-ration to thousands of families, for three months, because they were in lockdown or quarantine.

I had 75 children, in our homes. When the corona virus broke out, the children became vulnerable. They had no home to find shelter. From day one, till now, I am keeping them in our homes, and take care of all their needs. When the schools were closed, the classes were "online". They did not have any electronic facilities, to follow the classes. We bought for them smart phone, Zoom equipment, and Smart TV for them to continue their studies, without disruption.

The churches were closed. The people were not able to experience consolation through spiritual support. We Jesuits organized spiritual services, which we relayed to our catholic population, through virtual communication. I gave a retreat to 20 Jesuits, using the spiritual exercises, as a tool, to strengthen their spirits.

Our PPCC Centre, started a hot line service, to touch the hearts of lonely people, who were shut-ins and lonely. Young people unable to cope with intense, emotional pains, and prone to suicide, were helped by our consolers through "emotion coaching", which Mike McNulty introduced and trained us in. Corona virus victims were not given to the families they were not able to and grief we helped them to do rituals and spiritual exercises, to deal and heal their pain. We were able to do all their activities through the emotional, spiritual resources and support of good, generous, people who are facilitators in our compassionate ministries. Therefore, these ministries that we have given to the people in need give witness to the mercy, love and glory of God and his kingdom values. We all have been good missionaries bringing Jesus Christ to those who do not know him.

We also want to thank those who decorated our churches for both Advent and Christmas, indoors and out! Our churches were beautiful and inviting, and we are grateful to the parishioners and staff members who so generously donated their time and talent to these efforts!

Finally, thanks to our greeters and welcome desk volunteers for giving their time at Christmas. Our welcoming community is often what strikes visitors (and parishioners who have been away) the most when they come to Divine Mercy, and it's also what makes them decide to come back! So, we are grateful not only to our team of greeters, but to each and every parishioner who welcomes the stranger in the name of Jesus!



As I pen these personal reflections, on how I have coped with the Covid 19 Pandemic, I am in grief and pain. I lost my Brother, who resided in Trinidad and Tobago. He was an inspirational person for me. Academically, he was at the top level. Even when he was lecturing in the University, he studied Theology, was a Eucharistic Minister, and he was a member of the Parish Pastoral Council. His faith was deep. He was a Jesuit product. As Mike McNulty (Sr), mentioned, I embrace him in love.

My deeply esteemed and kind hearted friends, I hold you in my heart, and I never cease praying for you. Mike McNulty family and Conley clan, have strengthened my ministries for more than 15 years. I thank them and all who have supported me to build God's Kingdom. May you never depart from his life giving love and experience, peace, joy and delight in your day to day life


