We've moved from the Christmas season to what's called in the Church calendar "ordinary time." What that means is that we're not into a special season, and the Sundays and weeks right now are ordinal, that is, they are named by the number of the week in the Church calendar. For example, this Sunday is the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time.

So it's called "ordinary," but our weekdays, weeks, and Sundays are anything but ordinary. How can they be? We travel through them with the Lord Jesus as our guide and companion.

Living with Jesus is anything but "ordinary." He challenges us. He consoles us. He changes us. Each day we are motivated by the Lord Jesus to do and be our best as we pursue kingdom living.

To help us reflect on that grace, we have a special visitor, a guest, who will be speaking at all the Masses this weekend, and most importantly, the 10:00 and 4:30 Masses which are loosely billed as "Sports Masses," meaning any of our youth who are involved in sports are encouraged to attend. Our guest speaker, Joe DiPenta, will reflect on the intersection of sports, life and faith. He's uniquely equipped to do so, having played hockey professionally and now working for Divine Renovation Ministry, one of the groups that is resourcing us here at our parish as we pursue revitalization, renewal and evangelization.

We welcome Joe and his reflection. We continue to aim for growth and development as a parish. We embrace the Lord Jesus and all that he offers us.


SENIOR LEADERSHIP TEAM

Council.

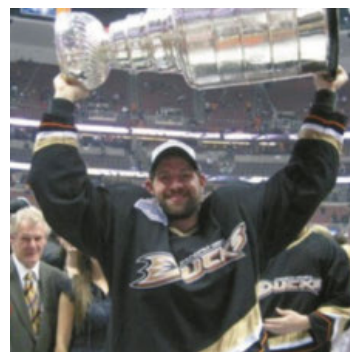

WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY:

JANUARY 18 -25

"We saw the star in the East, and we came to worship Him."
For the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2022, the Middle East Council of Churches chose this quote from the Gospel of Matthew. It expresses the Eastern Churches' tradition of joining Epiphany to the mystery of the Baptism of Christ, a baptism all Christians hold in common as testimony to their faith in the Son of God, exhibiting solidarity with those who suffer. The following is the prayer created for this year.

God of every nation, creator of every human life, the Lord Jesus Christ, the Word of God, has been made manifest in human history by becoming one of us and one with us. Born in a stable, born in homelessness, he is our King and Lord. The Magi bore witness to the Light of hope coming into the world as they faithfully followed the star, coming from foreign lands in the East, until arriving in Bethlehem of Judea.




The solidarity of God with created humanity in this gift of Epiphany calls us to a life of solidarity with the homeless, the refugee, the weakest and the rejected. We are all human beings worthy of redemption and prepared by that redeeming love to the glory of your Kingdom. Help us, O gracious Lord, to do this in unity and peace.

As we who bear the name of Christian, from the days of the church at Antioch, hold a special place in our hearts for the ancient Christian communities in the land we call holy, remind us to continually respond to our baptismal promises to you, who said through your Spirit at the Jordan, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased."

Help your Church, merciful One, to be a light for unity within itself and a beacon of hope for all humanity. We ask this through Jesus Christ, who with you and the Holy Spirit reign as One God for ever and ever. Amen.

We invite you to take a break and try Alpha, an opportunity to explore the basics of the Christian faith.

What is Alpha? Alpha is a series of gatherings where guests have the opportunity to explore life and the Christian Faith in a friendly and inviting atmosphere where no question is seen as too simple or too complex. It's an opportunity to explore the big questions of life. Why am I here? What is my purpose? Is there more to life than this? Why is there suffering in the world?

Who's it for? Absolutely anybody! Non-Christians, fallen away Catholics, cradle Catholics, anyone interested in exploring or questioning the meaning of life.

How does it work? Each session includes a meal (except for the online version!), a short video followed by a chance to share thoughts and ideas on the topic in a small group setting. There's no obligation to say anything, there's nothing you can't say (seriously) and there's no such thing as a silly question. It's an opportunity to hear from others and contribute your own perspective in an honest and informal setting.

Take a chance, try Alpha. Just come and see. There's no obligation to stay!

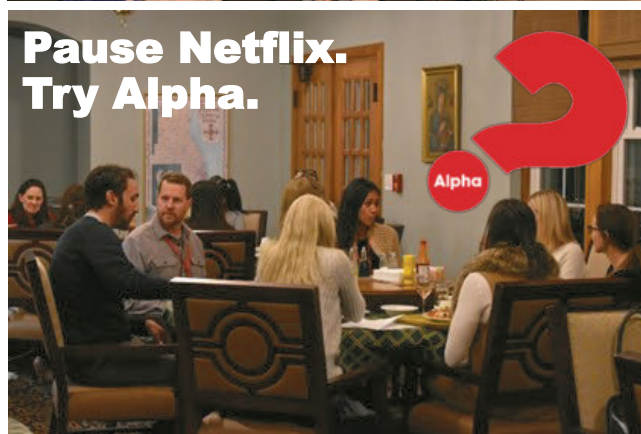

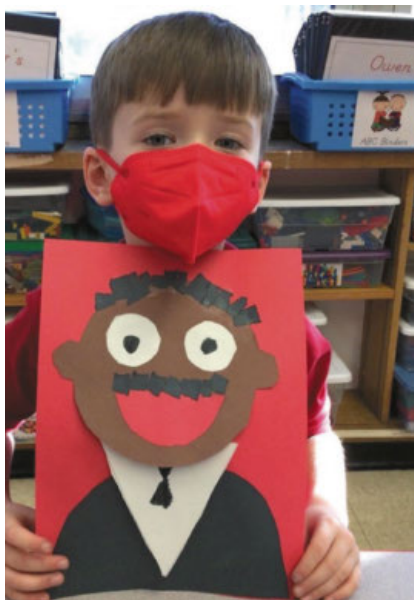

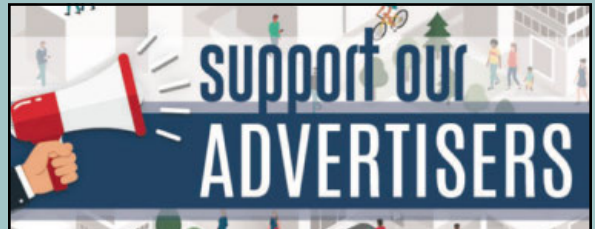
