

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

#### **SORTING STUFF**

It is pretty amazing what you find when you take the time to sort through the accumulated hardcopy of your office. That's what I did recently.

I sifted through my notes and materials pertaining to the Parish Council and the Senior Leadership Team. I retain notebooks for each of these groups, as I do for other groups and ministerial concerns. For example, I have a notebook for the wedding couples I'm dealing with in preparing for their marriages. The wedding couple notebook is kept up-to-date. It must be, as I'm dealing with them fairly often, and I need to keep notes in some sort of order.

The Parish Council and Senior Leadership Team notebooks have organizer tabs, but more often than not, I stuff papers into the front of the notebook without taking the time to put them into the proper tabs. I pulled out one of those notebooks the other day and papers spilled out everywhere. I had stuffed too much material in the front of the notebook.

This, in turn, caused me to "get it together." I went through all the loose papers and put them where they belonged. It made me feel good, like I had actually accomplished something! And it's not even time for spring cleaning.

Among all that material through which I sorted, I discovered a handout that had been prepared for the members of the Parish Council and Senior Leadership Team explaining the roles of each of these bodies. I thought perhaps you might like to know what we conveyed to them about their roles.

#### Senior Leadership Team:

This body supports, advises and shares responsibility with the pastor to implement the vision of renewal and revitalization for Divine Mercy Parish. The group addresses the issues confronting the future of the parish, surfaces new ideas for revitalization, and

sets the priorities for renewal, evangelization and growth of Divine Mercy Parish.

As a footnote to the above, once the Parish Council completes the five year strategic plan as a roadmap toward our future, the SLT will, of course, do what it does in light of the five year plan. We're very close to having that plan. I am hoping that the Council completes the plan by the end of this month.

#### Parish Council:

This is a group of parishioners that represents the entire parish community. The members serve in a lay leadership, consultative capacity, and are concerned with broad strategy and the future direction of the parish, as shaped by our parish vision: "Divine Mercy Parish is a welcoming community that inspires disciples of Jesus to share God's love and transform the world."

As I look at the above description, it occurs to me that it needs some work, given that it sounds a whole lot like the description of the SLT. The work in refining the description of the Parish Council should definitely take place after it concludes its work on the strategic plan.



We just received the guidelines for Parish Councils as formulated by the Archdiocese. Those guidelines will help us put together a better description of the role of the Council.

All of these ruminations, which I share with you in this column, stem from my desire to tidy up two of the organizer notebooks in my office. Maybe I should do that more often.

I can just hear some of the staff telling me "no, don't do any more sorting" because when I do, it means more work for everybody. Well, that's the name of the game, isn't it?

Work is a good thing. What would we do without it?

May your own sorting be a blessed event that causes good things to happen!

#### ADULT FAITH FORMATION: LENT BEGINS NEXT WEEK

#### **FAITH SHARING GROUPS FOR LENT**

Lent is an important season in the Church's liturgical year - it is the time when we take stock of where we are in our faith and prepare for the death and resurrection of our Savior. Often, we lose sight of the point of this season because we get caught up in ourselves—how hard it is to fast, how bad we are at fasting—and we end up just waiting for the season to be over at Easter. Because of this, we often arrive at Easter with our lives no different than they were on Ash Wednesday.

As a parish, we seek to prepare for Jesus' death and resurrection, and experience true transformation in our lives during this powerful season, so that we arrive at Easter renewed. One way we're doing this is by engaging with Ascension's Lenten Companion, a resource that will enable us to journey together from Ash Wednesday to the Triduum (latin for three days—Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday/the Easter Vigil). We'll use their video series hosted by Fr. Mark Toups. Each session will only last 45 minutes to one hour. Groups will watch the video and then discuss its content.

We encourage you to consider joining one of these small faith sharing groups for Lent this year. As has been the practice in recent years, we'll offer this series both online and in-person.



#### JOIN US FOR EUCHARISTIC ADORATION AT BOTH OUR CHURCHES DURING FEBRUARY

#### **ADORATION STORIES**

Have you ever wondered if Eucharistic Adoration has made a difference in people's lives? Why should I go? Why can't I just pray at home since Jesus is everywhere? We'd like to share a few stories of how Adoration has impacted people's lives. The following stories are from an organization called *The Apostolate of Eucharistic Adoration*, which shares the testimonies of several individuals who have experienced the presence of Christ through Eucharistic Adoration.

#### Mary's Story (not her real name)

It was a wet and windy Sunday morning and I was standing inside the Church door, out of the rain, waiting for a lift to do some study in the University as exams were on the horizon. Mass was not something that interested me much, since my Confirmation. Mass was going on as I stood in from the rain. During the Mass, a man was invited by the priest to speak to the congregation. He kept talking about Adoration. At one point during the talk he pointed at the Tabernacle and said very slowly 'He is there. Jesus is there', guoting some saint. I couldn't believe what I was hearing.

My lift never arrived and I waited until Mass was over to challenge the speaker. I felt he was just saying 'He is there' for effect and to get the people to listen. I went straight up to the speaker and blurted out 'did you do that for effect, to get the people to listen when you said and pointing to the tabernacle 'He is there'. The reply with a smile was calm and definite. I meant everything I said and Jesus is there. Come around to the Adoration Chapel and I will show you Jesus, true God and true man, in



the Monstrance, the same Jesus who walked the Holy Land just over 2000 years ago, the same Jesus that performed all the amazing miracles there.

I was gobsmacked and got a bit emotional at this point. I asked him if he would be speaking at the evening Mass and saying the same thing, as my parents usually go to that mass. He said, why do you ask me that? Well I feel that my parents don't know that Jesus is there in the Tabernacle or in the Monstrance, and that it is really Him. Why do you say that? He asked. Because my parents never told my brother or myself. If they knew I feel they would have told us. I found myself going back to that evening Mass with my parents and from then on Mass has become a must for me. I really enjoy telling others about my journey back to my faith again. I now understand why people love to go to Adoration. I now drop in when passing to the Adoration Chapel.


If any of these things sound like you, then your fellow Divine Mercy parishioners need you!








Mrs. Klatt joined the 7th grade social studies class, who is learning about the renaissance, to help us paint like the pros!


