





#### FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

### THE ELECT ARE ON THEIR WAY

The "Elect" is name we give to the group of catechumens (unbaptized seekers) who are in the final preparation for Baptism,
Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. They are elected by God through the bishop who gives voice to the discernment of the Church that they are ready to enter the waters of the baptismal font.

Our parish elect are on the final approach to full initiation into the Paschal mystery of Christ. As such, we offer special prayers for them on the following three Sundays of the Lenten season. These prayers are called "the scrutinies" in that they are scrutinized by God's compassionate grace, and filled with that grace through our prayers as they get closer to Easter and initiation.

Why are these prayers necessary?

I once heard it explained that the devil will do anything to dissuade people from getting into the baptismal font. So, more than ever, the elect need our prayers and support to encourage them to go forward, renounce sin and profess faith in lesus Christ

As the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults says, the scrutinies "are celebrated in order to deliver the elect form the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life. These rites should . . . deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all" (RCIA, n 141).

Let us continue, then, to pray for Gabby, Abby, Aiofe, Aiden and Frank, our elect. Let us pray for the elect throughout the world.

Let us also pray for our candidates. They come to us from other Christian faith communities. They are already validly baptized and they have chosen to join with us in professing the faith as Catholics, be confirmed and celebrate for the first time with our elect and us at the Eucharistic table of the Lord at Easter. Our candidates are Diane, Suzanne and Lisa.

May God continue to send to us inquirers who seek the light of Christ and who are attracted to us by our example of faith, witness and service!

#### POPE FRANCIS WANTS TO HEAR FROM YOU!

Pope Francis is inviting the laity worldwide to participate in the 2021-2023 Synod by offering our reflections on journeying together as the Universal Church in the areas of Communion, Participation, and Mission. (Note: Communion as in community, rather than Eucharist.) Reflections in any language will be accepted until April 1, 2022. Please join in this process as we journey together guided by the Holy Spirit!

If you'd like to understand more about the three topics of reflection noted above before completing the short 'questionnaire' for the Holy Father, the Church has provided **many** questions to help guide your thought process. - 1. Companions on the journey Who are the companions you value most in the Church? Why? What does companionship mean for you? In what ways can the circles of companionship grow further Have you ever distanced yourself from the Church community or do you know someone who has? What are some reasons? What would make you (or that person) come closer to the Church community?
- 2. Listening Who do you think are the people that the Church is listening to? Do you feel that you are being listened to in the Church? Why or why not? How can the Church do better to listen to everyone? Especially those who have a different view from us?
- 3. **Speaking out** Do you know how, where, or to whom you can share your views when you have something to say in your Church community? What prevents people in your Church community from coming forward to make their views known? What helps them to do so?
- 4. **Celebration** What are the communal prayers and liturgical activities that you participate in most frequently? How do they make a difference in your life? What do you find most meaningful or life-giving in the liturgies of your local Church community?
- 5. **Sharing responsibility for our common mission** What do you think hinders people from being active missionary disciples? In what ways do you collaborate with one another in your commitment to the Christian mission?
- 6. **Dialogue in the Church and society** What do you think promotes or hinders dialogue in your local Church and society? How are conflicts or disagreements usually handled in your community? How can we promote better dialogue in the Church and society?
- 7. **Ecumenism** What are the joys and fruits, or challenges and difficulties, in the relations among different Christian denominations? How can we walk together better?
- 8. **Authority and participation** Do you feel you can come forward or take action easily if you want to do something in the church? What can the clergy do to encourage more participation in the life and mission of the church?
- 9. **Discerning and deciding •** How are decisions usually made in your Church community? To what extent do the current ways of making major decisions promote listening to the whole People of God? How can this be improved? In your opinion, how much transparency and accountability are there in decision-making in your local Church?
- 10. **Forming ourselves in synodality** What are the current efforts in lay leadership formation in your local Church, or formation in communal discernment? What are the current strengths and weaknesses in the formation of clergy, religious, and laity towards promoting communion, participation, and mission?

Whether you decide to share your thoughts with Pope Francis or not, it may be helpful to ponder the questions above as you live out your faith life in the communion, participation and mission of the local church. Your review of these questions may also aid in living out our parish vision. The more we learn about ourselves, each other and our parish faith community, we'll grow as disciples of Jesus who love and care for each other. Divine Mercy continually seeks to be a welcoming community that inspires disciples of Jesus to share God's love and transform the world.

### LENTEN IDEAS FOR CHILDREN OR FAMILIES: CREATE A LENTEN PRAYER SPACE AT HOME

- Find a purple cloth to ground your space.
- Tie 2 twigs from the yard together with yarn to create a cross.
- Include an empty bowl in which prayers can be placed daily.
- Place a candle next to the cross that is lit when prayers are shared (at meals) or when they're placed in the bowl.
- Include a bible, prayer book or prayer that you'll recite together each day during lent. (Use our daily reflection booklets for Lent.)
- On Good Friday, find a creative way to offer up all the prayers to the Lord.

### 10 THINGS THAT HAPPEN WHEN YOU GO TO ADORATION

### 1. YOU DEVELOP A SENSE OF AWE AND WONDER

There is nothing like the atmosphere of a quiet chapel or church, the smell of incense and the splendor of the monstrance to help you understand the truth of what is happening in Adoration. We are truly before Jesus Christ, His Body,

Blood, Soul and Divinity. The more you sink into that silence in front of the Host, the more you'll realize that the only response is awe and wonder at the greatness of our God.

### 2. YOU EXPERIENCE PEACE IN OTHER AREAS OF YOUR LIFE

Jesus said "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you." (John 14:27) The outward peace we can experience in Adoration (the quiet and the stillness) reaches much deeper. It leads to an inner peace that affects all areas of our lives. It doesn't mean everything in our life will be perfect and without suffering, but Christ's peace means that we know that the storms of life can't shake us.

#### 3. YOU BEGIN TO LOOK OUTWARDLY

Jesus told us to "love one another as I have loved you". (John 13:34)
Spending time in Adoration connects us to the whole world – after all, we're spending time with the Creator of all things! More time praising and adoring God means you can look beyond your own concerns and see the needs of others in your life and in the world that we live in.

### 4. YOU GET BORED SOMETIMES There are going to be times when

## UNITED IN PRAYER (CONTINUED)

Adoration can feel anything but glorious. You get distracted, your mind begins to wander, you can hear someone else sniffing next to you. Maybe in the beginning Adoration was full of wonderful feelings! Regular Adoration is when daily life sets in and it can make it feel not so special. But that doesn't devalue or take away from the truth of what Adoration is. Our faith is more than feelings and God will still be working in you. This is the beauty of the Incarnation – God made man, coming into all our stresses, fears, problems – and yes, boredom. Know that even if an hour spent in Adoration is a continual returning to Him every few minutes when your mind wanders, you are still giving God the best gift you can – your time and company.

### 5. YOU BECOME EXCITED GOING TO ADORATION

The more time you spend in Adoration discovering that God is a God who loves you and wants to spend time with you, the more you begin to actually want to go. If Adoration once felt like a chore, you might even find yourself becoming excited to go! Adoration is addictive, not just because of the things we can gain for ourselves, but because we were created to adore. As we say in the Mass, it is "right and just" that we should give thanks to the Lord! Adoration is imprinted on our hearts and "our hearts are restless until they find our rest in Him"! (St Augustine)

## SAVE THE DATE FOR MONDAY OF HOLY WEEK!

This is a wonderful opportunity to learn more about the Triduum (Latin for Three Days). As the Bishops of the United States explain it:

"The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery. The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil. The liturgical services that take place during the Triduum are:

- Mass of the Lord's Supper
- Good Friday of the Lord's Passion
- Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord."

You still may ask why it's three days since the Triduum begins on Holy Thursday and ends Easter Sunday evening. We must remember that these sacred days begin at sundown. Thus, Holy Thursday sundown until Good Friday sundown is the first day. Good Friday sundown until Holy Saturday sundown is the second day, and Holy Saturday sundown until Easter Sunday sundown is the third day. Hence, three days.




### A Bible Blessing Prayer Service for Our 7th Graders as Part of Their Confirmation Journey


