

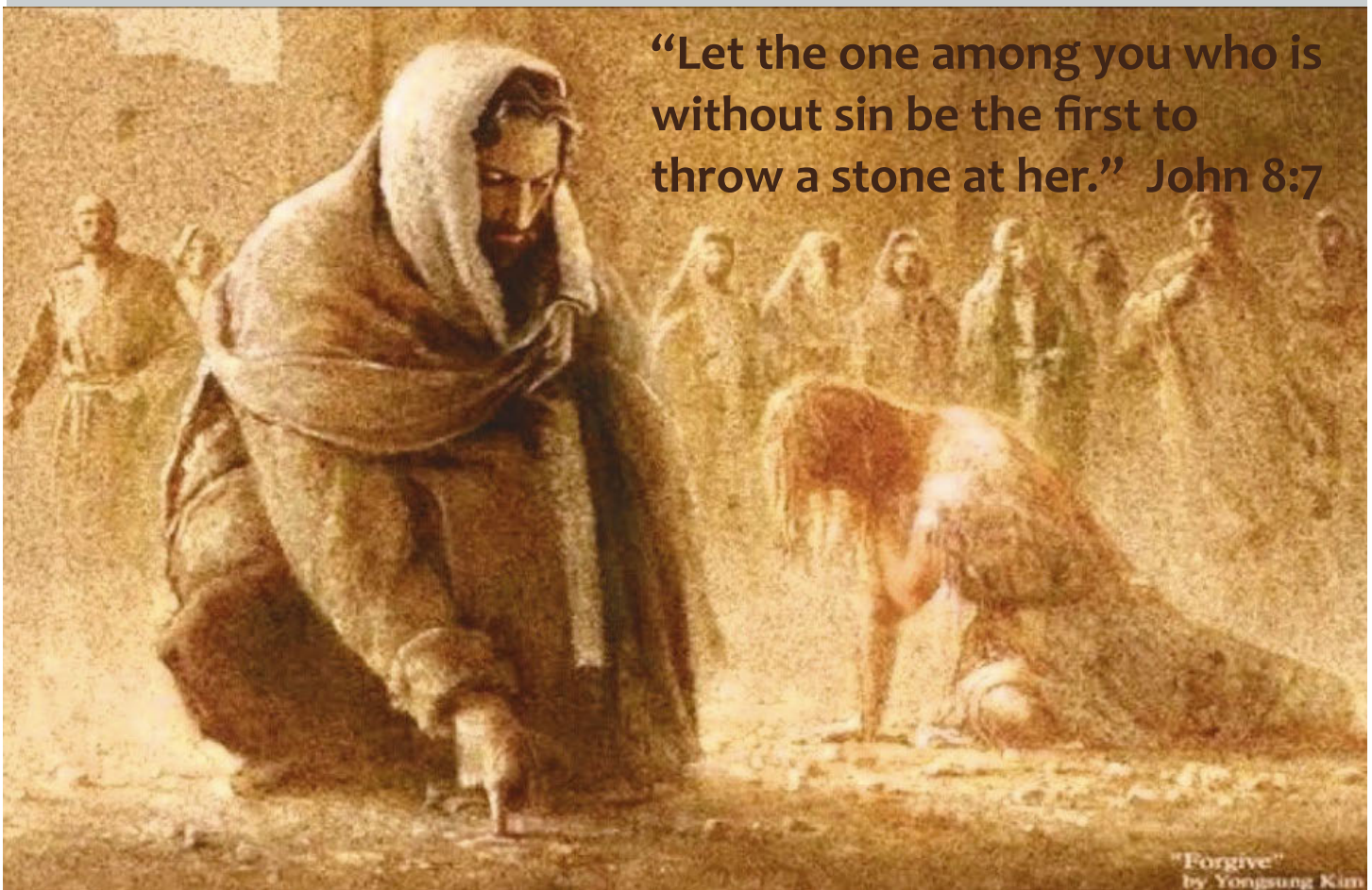

## FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

### PAVED WITH PALMS

Next week we celebrate the start of Holy Week with the annual celebration of Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion. We will commemorate the entrance Jesus made into the royal city, a prelude and backdrop to the saving events of his passion, death, and ultimately, his resurrection.

Dated from about the ninth century, there is an ancient hymn from our tradition that extols:

Gloria, laus, et honor tibi sit, Rex  
Christe Redemptor: Cui puerile decus  
prompsit Hosanna pium.

All glory, laud, and honor To thee,  
Redeemer King: To whom the lips of  
children Made sweet hosannas ring. I  
hope that you are able to join us for  
the celebration next Sunday.

I hope that the entire family is able to  
be present so that in our own way and  
in our own time we might make  
"sweet hosannas ring!"

In order to prepare for the liturgy this  
coming Sunday, you may want to  
read through the passion narrative as  
found in Luke's gospel. That will be  
the text for this weekend since we are

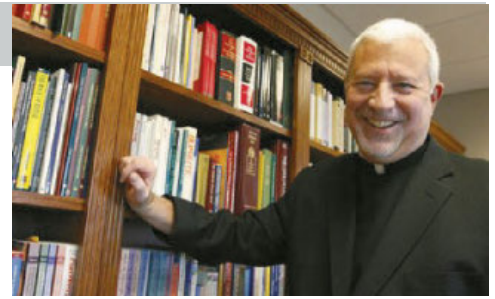
in the "Year of Luke" in the  
Lectionary. You'll find the passion  
narrative beginning at chapter 22:47  
and running through chapter 23:56.

As you read through it, you may want  
to focus on the plea of the second  
thief, crucified alongside Jesus who  
requested, "Jesus remember me  
when you come into your kingdom."

What does this request mean to you,  
personally? Do you see in it a cry  
filled with hope? What sort of hope  
do you place in the Lord Jesus, given  
your own situation and the  
challenges you face today and the  
challenges you anticipate in the near  
future?

May you prepare fruitfully to  
celebrate this Sunday! May it be for  
you a heartfelt entrance of the Lord  
Jesus into your own life! Together, let  
us make sweet hosannas ring!

### RCIA AND THE SCRUTINIES

This weekend, at the 10 a.m. Mass, we  
celebrate the final Scrutiny with those  
who will be baptized into the Church at  
the Easter Vigil - the Elect. Celebrated  
on the final Sundays before Holy Week,

strengthen them to resist temptation

## ADULT FAITH FORMATION

### SAVE THE DATE FOR MONDAY OF HOLY WEEK!

This is a wonderful opportunity to learn more about the Triduum (Latin for Three Days). As the Bishops of the United States define it: "The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum - from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically **one** day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery. The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.

The liturgical services that take place during the Triduum are:

- Mass of the Lord's Supper
- Good Friday of the Lord's Passion
- Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord."

### SPEND TIME WITH JESUS

One story told about St. John Vianney, the saintly pastor of Ars in France, is that he often saw a farmer sit in the back of the parish church. The saint took notice that the farmer would spend long periods of time there before the Eucharist. Finally one day, the saint asked him what he did during his time of adoration. The farmer simply responded, "I look at Him and He looks at me."

This is what Eucharistic Adoration is: a time for us to concentrate exclusively on Jesus present before us and allow Him to look back upon us with love.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is a natural development from the celebration of the Eucharist. To receive the Eucharist at Mass is an act of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Adoring the Blessed Sacrament outside of these times makes the times we receive Communion more spiritually mature, impacts us more deeply, and allows us to experience a fuller communion with the Lord and others in our life (Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, "Sacramentum Caritatis," #66). With such fruits, it is no wonder, then, why the Church encourages all to make some time weekly for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

Join us for weekly Adoration at Divine Mercy: Wednesdays from 2-3:00 p.m. at Sacred Heart Church hosted by the Magi and Friday mornings after 8:00 a.m. Mass (8:30 - 9:30 a.m.) at St. Philip the Apostle Church.

### GOD'S GIFT OF FORGIVENESS

In the Sacrament of Penance/Reconciliation, we meet the Lord, who wants to grant forgiveness and the grace to live a renewed life in him. In this sacrament, he prepares us to receive him free from serious sin, with faith, hope, and a sacrificial love in the Eucharist.

The Church sees confession as so important that she requires that every Catholic go at least once a year. The Church also encourages frequent confession in order to grow closer to Christ Jesus and his Body, the Church. By the grace of the Holy Spirit, we seek forgiveness and repentance, let go of patterns of sin, grow in the life of virtue, and witness to a joyful conversion. ## **LOOK WHAT'S HAPPENING AT SACRED HEART SCHOOL!**



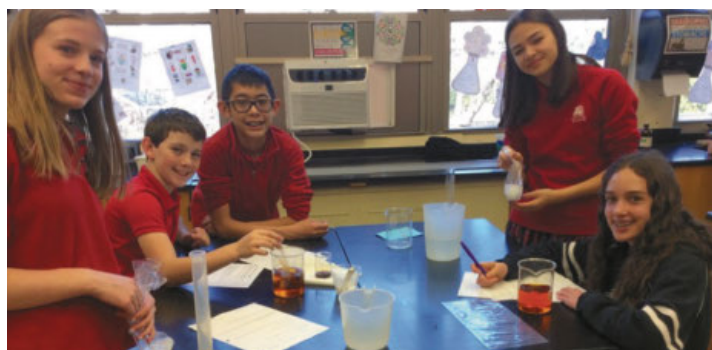
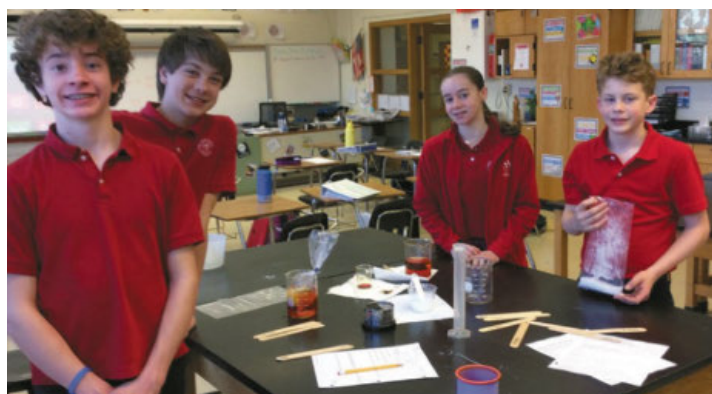
Our JK students are working hard at making a "SUN" for the letter S!
