





#### FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

#### THE GIFT OF NEW LIFE

This July we will mark four years since the former parishes of Sacred Heart and St. Philip the Apostle were dissolved and a brand new one was created from them, Divine Mercy Parish. The past four years have been filled with many wonderful efforts to move Divine Mercy forward into the future God is preparing for us.

Over 150 individuals have experienced Alpha, the main instrument of renewal. We just finished two additional Alpha courses which bumps that number up to over 175 individuals.

As a result of Alpha, there are a handful of small faith sharing groups that have continued to meet in order to deepen their own spirituality. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament has been held on a weekly basis at both of our church sites, which is a powerful prayer experience that helps fuel our renewal efforts, for after all, we will get nowhere without lots of prayer.

Early on, right after the merger, we created a small advisory group, the Senior Leadership Team (SLT). It consists of a few staff members, myself, and two parishioners, one from the Sacred Heart crowd and one from the St. Philip the Apostle. In the first three years of the SLT, we met weekly to oversee the many changes taking place as a result of the merger. Today, the SLT looks at both long-range and immediate priorities for the parish. The SLT will also help to implement the strategic plan being finalized by the Parish Council.

HAPPY EASTER!

The Parish Council has been meeting for over a year to craft and fine-tune a five year strategic plan for the parish. The plan is completed. The Council is currently delineating some of the structures needed to complement and support the pursuit of the plan. It will be shared with all of you shortly, but as I've reported previously in this column, each of the five years of the plan focuses on a particular element of parish life that will be key for our renewal. Those five key elements are: evangelization, community, discipleship, ministry and worship.

Before the Council even began talking about the five year plan, the SLT developed a parish Vision Statement that will frame all that we do. This Vision Statement was ratified by the Parish Council. Our parish vision is: Divine Mercy Parish is a welcoming community that inspires disciples of Jesus to share God's love and transform the world. You'll notice that of all the verbiage in this column, the Vision Statement is bolded. It's bolded because it's what guides us in everything we do. This was the jumping off point for the Parish Council's long discussions in crafting the strategic plan.

Vision is what lays out or articulates why we are who we are, and why we do what we try and do. Without a compelling vision, parishes simply maintain things. They do things as they've always done them.

That worked for a very long time in our

past history. It doesn't work anymore and is not effective, because the world we live in no longer supports the practice of faith, any faith, not just Catholicism. The Protestant, Jewish and Muslim faiths also are impacted. Even the Evangelical Protestant communities that seemed to be flourishing a few years ago, are experiencing the same thing we have experienced: a decline in



numbers.

If we keep doing what we've always done before, simply maintaining things, we will become more ineffective and smaller as a Church. As Pope Francis keeps reminding us, in the world today, the only way we can be effective as a Church is to be on mission. We must be on fire as intentional disciples of Jesus who go out to the margins, serve others and witness to the message of Good News in Jesus Christ. This is, of course, the Great Commission as found at the conclusion of Matthew's Gospel (Mt 28:19-20), where Jesus says to those original disciples and us: "Go therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always to the end of the age."

Yes, it's a big task. We're taking on the whole world. But visions are only compelling if they are big. Who wants to pursue a small, tiny vision? A mouse? A gnat?

We are God's children and disciples of Jesus Christ. Big is doable. We've been empowered by the Lord, and we are recipients of the Holy Spirit. All things are possible with God.

We've come quite a ways in the last four years. The next five will be even more exciting. Thank you for your dedication towards the hard work of renewal. Thank you for your commitment to Divine Mercy Parish. A blessed Easter to you all! May the new life of Christ propel us forward together!




