FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

HAPPY FEAST DAY!

This weekend we celebrate the Second Sunday of Easter, also known as "Divine Mercy Sunday." On this great day, we acknowledge all the good gifts God sends our way. It's in that light, I'd like to share with you some wonderful news. Even as Father Dan prepares to retire and leave Divine Mercy Parish, we have a new priest joining the community.

Father Bob Heinz is a retired priest who has chosen to be in residence here at Divine Mercy Parish. We are thrilled to have him among us and we welcome him to this faith community.

The following is a conversation I had with Father Bob as a way to introduce him to all of you. In the days ahead, you will see Father Bob as a priest presider at daily and weekend Masses.

I've known Father Bob since seminary days. He's two years older than myself, and was ordained a priest one year ahead of me. He's a great guy. Those of you who do not know him, you'll see that in the following conversation, as I "interviewed" him for this column.

Tell us about yourself. What's life like these days?

It's new. Life is new these days. I am retired as of this past February, and I am finding everything new. Now as we're going through Holy Week, it's the first time in 42 years that I don't have to be concerned about the many, many



details.

I'm recognizing how blessed my life is. I'm deeply grateful to all the people who have shared their faith and life with me. I am looking forward to what is to come.

You mention being ordained as a priest for 42 years. Where have you been assigned in the Archdiocese?

I was ordained a transitional deacon in 1979, and was assigned to Our Lady of Victory for one year. My first priesthood assignment was at St. Ailbe on the southeast side of Chicago. I was an Associate for 4 years and a copastor for 6 years. Then I was assigned to St. Mary Star of the Sea for 6 months before going to St. James in Arlington Heights for 3 years. I became pastor of St. Alphonsus in Prospect Heights for 13 years, and then pastor of St. Norbert in Northbrook for 12 years.

For the last 3 years I've been helping in the Archdiocese as an Administrator of various parishes. Then, in February of this year, I received a love letter on Valentine's Day from Cardinal Cupich informing me that I was officially retired from assignments in the Archdiocese. My desire now is to serve as a priest without administrative duties and responsibilities.

Being retired doesn't mean you stop being a priest, but, as you say, it means you don't have official duties. How do you envision your retirement as you settle in to live at Divine Mercy Parish?

I want to spend more time with my family. I have sisters, nieces, nephews and grandnieces and grandnephews that I would like to get to know better and be more present to them.

I want to continue celebrating the sacraments for people in a less demanding schedule. I have come to the conclusion that God is never finished with us. The occasions that



we mark seasonally (Lent, Easter, Ordinary Time, and so on), we also mark culturally with birthdays and anniversaries.

Since God is never done with us, I want to be attentive to that life within me and in others, which affords a glimpse of eternity: God's presence now and forever. I desire to be attentive to that life, to share it, to listen to others who have that same life within themselves—and to be present to it all.

In your official capacities as an Associate Pastor and then Pastor, you've seen a lot. Any insights you'd like to share with us about ordained ministry?

It has challenged me to grow in ways that I never could have imagined at the outset.

So that's similar, I suppose, to what a married couple would say about marriage and that sacrament.

There have been very difficult moments, partly because of physical disabilities, partly because of my own sinfulness, but through God's grace touching me through people and through life in the Church, I've experienced the Resurrection and new life when I thought there was no life.

A warm welcome Fr. Bob Heinz, and a happy Feast Day to us all at Divine Mercy Parish!



PAPAL EASTER BLESSING 2022

Dear brothers and sisters, Happy Easter! Jesus, the Crucified One, is risen! He stands in the midst of those who



mourned him, locked behind closed doors and full of fear and anguish. He comes among them and says: "Peace be with you!" (John 20:19). He shows the wounds in his hands and feet, and the wound in his side. He is no ghost; it is truly Jesus, the same Jesus who died on the cross and was laid in the tomb. Before the incredulous eyes of the disciples, he repeats: "Peace be with you!" (v. 21). Our eyes, too, are incredulous on this Easter of war. We have seen all too much blood, all too much violence. Our hearts, too, have been filled with fear and anguish, as so many of our brothers and sisters have had to lock themselves away in order to be safe from bombing. We struggle to believe that Jesus is truly risen, that he has truly triumphed over death. Could it be an illusion? A figment of our imagination?

No, it is not an illusion! Today, more than ever, we hear echoing the Easter proclamation so dear to the Christian East: "Christ is risen! He is truly risen!" Today, more than ever, we need him, at the end of a Lent that has seemed endless. We emerged from two years of pandemic, which took a heavy toll. It was time to come out of the tunnel together, hand in hand, pooling our strengths and resources... Instead, we are showing that we do not still have within us the spirit of Jesus, we have within us the spirit of Cain, who saw Abel not as a brother, but as a rival, and thought about how to eliminate him. We need the crucified and risen Lord so that we can believe in the victory of love, and hope for reconciliation. Today, more than ever, we need him to stand in our midst and repeat to us: "Peace be with you!"

Only he can do it. Today, he alone has the right to speak to us of peace. Jesus alone, for he bears wounds... our wounds. His wounds are indeed ours, for two reasons. They are ours because we inflicted them upon him by our sins, by our hardness of heart, by our fratricidal hatred. They are also ours because he bore them for our sake; he did not cancel them from his glorified body; he chose to keep them, to bear them forever. They are the indelible seal of his love for us, a perennial act of intercession, so that the heavenly Father, in seeing them, will have mercy upon us and upon the whole world. The wounds on the body of the risen Jesus are the sign of the battle he fought and won for us, won with the weapons of love, so that we might have peace and remain in peace.

As we contemplate those glorious wounds, our incredulous eyes open wide; our hardened hearts break open and we welcome the Easter message: "Peace be with you!"


