FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

REBUILDING

It's no secret that I'm a Blackhawks fan. You'd know that if you walked past the front of the rectory. Most days the Blackhawks flag flies next to Old Glory. Well, the Blackhawks flag is temporarily gone because I need to get a new one: the old one was so tattered that a replacement is in order. Most of us Blackhawks fans are talking about how they are "rebuilding." This is not the same team that won multiple Stanley Cups in a handful of years. It happens. I think every sports team goes through these cycles.

I mention this because the whole purpose of the Renew My Church initiative was to jump start the rebuilding of our parishes into lively, vibrant communities of faith. The first phase of the renewal focused on needed mergers which resulted in the creation of new parishes so that we might have better resources with which to be parish. The next phase, which will take a lot longer, focuses on the internal rebuilding so that we can not only be parish, but that we might be vibrant, strong parishes filled with disciples of Jesus who are not afraid to be examples of faith and action.

In the Renew My Church process, this next phase is called "Building the New Reality." That's where we are today at Divine Mercy Parish.

The main instrument for our rebuilding is Alpha. Over 160 people have gone through an Alpha course here at Divine Mercy. That's pretty good, given that we've only been at it for three years and our parish isn't that big, about 900 households.

Alpha is all about exploration. Exploring Jesus, exploring the Holy Spirit, exploring faith and the household of the faithful in such a way that the participants can take hold of their faith relationship as the key which unlocks life.

Another Alpha course starts May 12th. Call the parish if you are interested in

The in-person Alpha includes good food, an exciting video, and a non-threatening, easy conversation revolving around the video. (We're also offering an online opportunity to join that same evening, so online participants will be part of the larger group.)

Rebuilding, whether it's a building or a team, occurs brick by brick, player by player, one step at a time. In a parish community, rebuilding takes place person by person, heart by heart. Consider Alpha and how it can help you deepen your own faith life, whether you are a cradle Catholic, a fallen-away Catholic or somewhere in between. And in so doing, it will help us become the parish we aspire to be. As our parish vision statement says: Divine Mercy Parish is a welcoming community that inspires disciples of Jesus to share God's love and transform the world.

BAPTISMS

At the Easter Vigil, we welcomed into the font five young men and women who were baptized into the Paschal mystery of Jesus Christ. Three adults, who had been baptized in other ecclesial communities, were received into the Catholic Church. All became one with us in the celebration of the Eucharist. This made for an exciting Easter Vigil. But it's more than just an exciting liturgy on a particular night of the year, it is a sign of true *life* for us as a parish.

Similarly, today we will Baptize Jennifer's and Sean's newest baby son. Jennifer is the Assistant Principal of Sacred Heart School. She's also the fourth grade teacher (on a maternity leave). Sean and Jennifer opted to celebrate the Baptism in the midst of the believing community, instead of an individualized celebration.

This, too, is a sign of life. Everything



depends on community. Without community, there is no parish.
Sacraments are celebrated by the community, even in the instance of Confession. The priest Confessor represents the whole community.
Remember, in the "good old" ancient days, folks got up in front of the entire assembly of Christians and confessed!

My point is that sacraments, while received by individuals, that reception and celebration is done within the community. That's who we are, and that is what sacraments build up: community. A sacrament is never meant solely for the benefit of the individual, but for the good of the whole household of believers.

It's another sign of hope and life that we are moving in the right direction when some of our infant Baptisms take place in the midst of the community on Sunday, the day the Lord rose from the dead, which is precisely what Baptism immerses us into, the Paschal mystery of Jesus Christ.

ADDITIONAL MASS THIS FRIDAY




SACRED HEART SCHOOL

As part of our unit on groundwater, the 6th grade science students used a model to simulate a contaminated industrial site. They analyzed "soil samples" to determine where the contamination originated. They also used the data to determine what direction the groundwater was flowing to decide if the town's water supply was in danger.

The 7th and 8th grade students had an opportunity to speak with Mr. Steen Metz for ELA and Social Studies. Mr. Metz is from Denmark, but now resides in Illinois, and is a Holocaust survivor who spent 18 months in a concentration camp when he was 8 years old. He spoke to the students about his time growing up in Denmark and about building courage to tell his story, which he started doing in the past few years. The 7th and 8th graders did an incredible job hearing his story and asking questions. Mr. Metz left each student with one homework assignment: to go and tell 4 people his story to help spread the message of how to be an "upstander". We are so thankful to Mr. Metz for taking the time to inspire our students.


