GREEN RIBBONS IN SUPPORT OF MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH

You will notice green ribbons around many of the trees at Divine Mercy Parish during the month of May, showing our support for Mental Health Awareness Month!

This effort is in cooperation with Paws for Patrick and the Glencoe Clergy Association, raising mental health awareness in our community – particularly relating to youth. We also have two youth mental health resources to share with you.

Paws for Patrick

Paws for Patrick is a non-profit organization dedicated to connecting young people to emotional support animals to aid them as they live with mental illness. The organization helps families obtain and advocate for emotional support animals, provides trained therapy dogs, and helps break the stigma of mental health issues among young people.

Erika's LightHouse

Erika's LightHouse gives educators the tools to promote inclusive school cultures around mental health. The organization helps schools provide their students with the skills needed to talk to each other, to their parents, to their teachers and to counselors. Their resources raise awareness, reduce stigma, educate students, promote good mental health and encourage help-seeking.

10 WAYS TO RELIEVE STRESS DURING FINALS

In the next few weeks, middle schools, high schools, and colleges will have finals. We pray that the young people in our parish community will do well both academically and emotionally during this stressful time, and that they know how much we care for them.

The following tips are from ErikasLighthouse.org, a local resource that provides information and resources about teen depression. Here are 10 ways to relieve stress during finals:

1. Form a Study Group! Studying is always more fun when you have a buddy or two.

- 2. Start early and make a plan! It'll be beneficial to start early so you're not cramming the night before finals.
- 3. Take Breaks! Whether it's going for a quick run, grabbing a snack, or watching an episode of your favorite show, study breaks are important for good mental health!
- 4. Practice mindfulness and meditation to regain focus during a long stretch of studying.
- 5. Make a playlist full of music that helps you get into the zone! (Classical music has been shown to help students retain information while studying.)
- 6. Ask for help! Don't be afraid to reach out to your teachers if you're struggling. That's what they're there for
- Eat balanced meals! Not being hungry will help you focus on studying. Stick to water and herbal tea (no caffeine!) so you don't have trouble falling asleep when you're done studying.
- 8. Get a good night's sleep! It's very important that you are rested and energized while studying.
- Know your limits and stick to them! Your mental and emotional health come first.
- 10. Plan something fun for after your last final: anything from going to see a movie to sitting on the couch eating ice cream! Having something to look forward to will be a great motivator.

If you have concerns about your child's mental health or mood, we encourage you to get help. A good first step is to contact your child's pediatrician, and to contact your child's teachers or school counseling staff. MAY IS THE MONTH OF MARY

Many of us grew up celebrating the month of May with a May Crowning of Mary. But why? Why May? Reasons abound, but according to Marge Fenelon in a blog for the National Catholic Register in 2020 stated, "The idea of a month dedicated specifically to Mary can be traced back to baroque times. Although it wasn't always held during May, Mary Month included thirty daily spiritual exercises honoring Mary.

It was in this era (medieval times) that Mary's Month and May were combined, making May the Month of Mary with special devotions organized on each day throughout the month. This custom became especially widespread during the nineteenth century and remains in practice until today.

The ways Mary is honored in May is as varied as the people who honor her.

It's common for parishes have a daily recitation of the Rosary during May, and many erect a special May altar with a statue or picture of Mary as a reminder of Mary's month. Additionally, it's a long-standing tradition to crown the statue of Mary during May – a custom known as May Crowning. Often, the crown is made of beautiful blossoms representing Mary's beauty and virtue. It's also a reminder to the faithful to strive to imitate our Blessed Mother's virtue in our own lives. May Crowning, in some areas, is a huge celebration and is usually done outside of Mass, although Mass may be celebrated before or after the actual crowning.

But May altars and crownings aren't just "church" things. We can and should be doing the same in our homes. When we echo the customs and traditions of the Church in our homes – our domestic churches – we participate more fully in the life of the Church.

If you haven't already, I encourage you to erect a prayer corner in your home. No matter how fancy or simple it is. The main point is that it's a place designated for God, and more specifically, for spending time with him. Just as you need proper atmosphere to sleep, you also need proper atmosphere to pray.

For May, give Mary a special spot in your prayer corner. It can be a statue or picture, but place there some representation of our Blessed Mother. Make it appealing and a real tribute to her beauty and virtue.

Then, crown Mary. You can give her an actual or spiritual crown and you can make it a subtle gesture or ornate ceremony of your own device. The meaning is far more important than the action. You can do it in the beginning, at the end of May or anywhere in between.

Just do it.

Why?

Not because it's a long-standing tradition in the Church, although it is.

Not because there are any special graces connected to it, although there is

No, do it because Mary is Mother – your mother, my mother, everyone's mother – and because she cares for all of us day-in-and-day-out without fail, interceding for us in even the tiniest matters.

For that, she deserves an entire month in her honor."




