FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

PARISH COUNCIL GUIDELINES

One of the tasks the Parish Council has been engaged in, is the creation of revised Parish Council guidelines. This got me thinking about what the Church says about parishes and parish councils.

There's not much on Parish Councils on the internet, except some references in the works of the Second Vatican Council and in Canon Law. However, there's a relatively new document issued by one of the curial congregations in Rome that addresses the nature of the modern parish.

What follows are excerpts from that document. If you want to peruse the entire text, I'm sure you can find it on the Holy See's website. The 2020 document is entitled (take a breath, it's a long title, but apt): The Pastoral Conversion of the Parish Community in the Service of the Evangelizing Mission of the Church. The excerpts are:

"The whole people of God must urgently embrace the Holy Spirit's invitation to begin the process of "renewing" the face of the Church.

In virtue of this discernment, the parish is called upon to read the signs of the times, while adapting both to the needs of the faithful and to historical changes. A renewed vitality is required that favors the rediscovery of the vocation of the baptized as a disciple of Jesus Christ and a missionary of the Gospel, in light of the Second Vatican Council and subsequent Magisterium.

The parish community is the human context wherein the evangelizing work of the Church is carried out, where sacraments are celebrated and where charity is exercised, all with missionary zeal, which, apart from being an intrinsic part of pastoral action, is a litmus test of its authenticity. In this present age, marked at times by marginalization and solitude, the parish community is called to be a living sign of the proximity of Christ. . . .

In the mysterious interplay between the action of God and that of [people], the proclamation of the Gospel comes through men and women who give credibility to what they say through the witness of their lives, together with their interpersonal relationships that inspire trust and hope. In these times, marked as they are by indifferentism, individualism and the exclusion of others, the rediscovery of brotherhood is paramount and integral to evangelization, which is closely linked to human relationships. In this way, the Christian community makes our Lord's words their own, as they spur us to "put out into the deep" (Luke 5:4), trusting in the Master as we pay out the nets in the assurance of hauling a "large catch."

The culture of encounter is conducive to dialogue, solidarity and openness to others, as it is person-centered.

Naturally, a parish must be a place that brings people together and fosters long-term personal relationships, thereby giving people a sense of belonging and being wanted.

The parish community is called truly to master the art of accompaniment. If deep roots are planted, the parish will become a place where solitude is overcome, which as affected so many lives, as well as being "a sanctuary where the thirsty come to drink in the midst of their journey and a center of constant missionary outreach" (Pope Francis, Evangelii Gaudium, The Joy of the Gospel, n 28, 2013).

If I had to break down the important points from these excerpts, those points would be the following.

- There is an urgent need for us to embrace the renewal prompted by the Holy Spirit.
- 2. Renewal in the Spirit happens through discernment of the signs of the times.
- 3. Evangelizing is the main work of a parish, a work that calls us out of ourselves and into other's lives.
- 4. The credibility of the faith depends on our witness, that is, by what we



- say and do with and for others.
- 5. The best parishes encourage a culture of encounter.
- 6. We are called to accompany one another on the journey of faith to God.

You may interpret the excerpts a bit differently than I do. Regardless, it's hard to miss the intersection between parish community, evangelization and following Jesus as his disciples who are engaged in making more disciples out in the world. I think our parish vision statement is right in line with the thoughts expressed the 2020 document. Divine Mercy Parish is a welcoming community that inspires disciples of Jesus to share God's love and transform the world.

FINE ARTS MASS A WONDERFUL GATHERING!



We wanted to share an article with you from the St. Paul Center on Why

Catholics Need Eucharistic Adoration by Lawrence Feingold, who is an Associate Professor of Theology and Philosophy at Kenrick-Glennon

Seminary in St. Louis. He is the author of numerous scholarly books, including The Eucharist: Mystery of Presence,

Sacrifice, and Communion, a comprehensive commentary on the mystery of the Eucharist drawing from Scripture, the Church Fathers, and magisterial teaching throughout the ages.

"Adoration also aids the faithful to be inserted more deeply into the communion of the Mystical Body. As the practice of pilgrimage to Jerusalem for the great festivals helped to consolidate the religious and social unity of Israel, so

Eucharistic adoration brings the faithful of the New Covenant throughout the Catholic world together to adore the same Lord present in every tabernacle. No geographical boundary limits the unity of worship of the one Lord and His one Sacrifice. Furthermore, adoration of the Lord who has given Himself for the flock helps nurture the faithful in cultivating the attitude of self-gift, which is the heart of Catholic social doctrine.

The growth of Eucharistic adoration over the past two millennia is a beautiful example of the organic development of doctrine and of Christian life and worship. Like Mary, who kept the words of the Lord in her heart and meditated on them day and night, the Church has reflected over the centuries on her greatest treasure and the fitting homage to give

to it. The second millennium has witnessed the constant growth of the personal prayer of the faithful before the Blessed Sacrament.

To help foster Eucharistic devotion, attention must be given to the architectural prominence of the tabernacle and its relationship with the

altar. The altar, as the place of sacrifice and the symbol of its acceptance, should be the heart of every church. After the altar, to which it is intrinsically linked, the tabernacle with the Blessed Sacrament also pertains to the heart of the church and must be architecturally manifested as such. As Pius XII emphasizes, "it is one and the same Lord who is immolated on the altar and honored in the tabernacle, and who pours out his blessings from the tabernacle." Containing the substantial presence of Jesus Christ, the tabernacle is the reality of which the Ark of the Covenant in the Holy of Holies in the Temple was the glorious type or figure. Every tabernacle is not only the heart of the church building but also contains the head and heart of the Mystical Body; it is the dwelling of the Bridegroom with His Bride.

WHY ALPHA MATTERS TO DIVINE MERCY AND TO YOU

Alpha is our chosen mechanism to jump start conversion and intentional discipleship at Divine Mercy. It is our hope that Alpha becomes the first step in a journey of many more steps as people encounter Jesus in their lives. As you read this, already over 160 individuals have gone through Alpha. If you are one of the persons who has done so, you know how important it is to invite others to experience Alpha. Just as Jesus told the disciples to go and make disciples, it's our responsibility as well. Think about the early Church and how quickly Christianity spread. It spread because people shared their experience of Jesus with one another. Renewal and revitalization is in our grasp. Together, we can effect change and growth in our parish, and in our Church. If you haven't tried Alpha, do it. You have nothing to lose, and much to gain if you are open to the possibilities the Holy Spirit can bring.

How ALPHA fits within the Catholic Context...

Alpha is run throughout the world by Christians of all traditions, providing a common expression of "proclamation, service and witness" (EG, 246).

Evangelization

Alpha is a tool to introduce people to an initial proclamation of the good news of Jesus Christ—the kerygma. As Pope Francis says, "Nothing is more solid, profound, secure, meaningful, and wisdom-



filled than that initial proclamation." (EG, 165).

Encounter

Alpha takes people on a journey often leading to a personal encounter with Jesus Christ. It enables people to ask their questions, share ideas, build friendships, and experience the love of God through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Everyone

Alpha is for everyone; all backgrounds, all contexts, all ages. Alpha is particularly attracting many young people around the world who are asking the question, "Is there more to life than this?"

PRAYER VIGIL FOR UKRAINE & HOW TO PROVIDE DIRECT AID TO UKRAINE

Many thanks to all those who attended last Sunday's Interfaith Prayer Vigil in Glencoe for the people of Ukraine. One of the speakers (introduced by Rabbi Lowenstein of Am Shalom) left Ukraine in the 1970s and her family is now providing direct humanitarian aid to the people of Ukraine. Help Me Provide Direct Aid to Ukrainians

Hi, my name is Jackie Birov and I'm a Ukrainian-American from Chicago doing what I can to help support Ukraine. I've been volunteering since the war began first from here in Chicago, then on the ground evacuating civilians from Russianoccupied territory.

Now I'm flying back to Ukraine to deliver much-needed supplies. This is where you can make a difference. I need your help to be able to keep buying and delivering essential humanitarian and military aid.

So far, I've sourced and delivered hundreds of bulletproof vests and helmets, distributed non-perishable food to destroyed villages outside Kyiv, and even handed out cash assistance to children at the border. I am flying back on May 18th with more supplies that Ukrainian soldiers near Luhansk have directly requested from me. I've paid for much of them out of my own pocket.
