FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

Ascension

I really love this feast which we celebrate today, the solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord Jesus Christ. After his resurrection from the dead, and after having appeared to his disciples on a number of occasions, the Risen Lord was "taken up" (Acts 1:2, Luke 24:51). He sits now at the right hand of God the Father in glory.

The Preface Prayer for this feast, which is said right before the Holy Holy, proclaims, "Mediator between God and [humanity], judge of the world and Lord of hosts, he ascended, not to distance himself from our lowly state but that we, his members, might be confident of following where he, our Head and Founder, has gone before." Yes, the Ascension is a sign of wonder and hope that spurs us onward.

I love this feast for that reason, but also because due to this extraordinary event, Jesus is continually with us in a unique, unprecedented way. By his leaving the original disciples, the Holy Spirit descends upon them, and us.

It's as if the Spirit is unleashed upon the world by the Risen Lord Jesus being taken up in glory. Through that same Spirit, we are put in touch with the Lord Jesus. The gifts of the Holy Spirit are keys given to us that unlock the richness of the fullness of life in Christ.

Oh, blessed event that lavishes upon us the graces of heaven! Jesus ascends so that we might have a share in divinity, disciples linked forever with the Master, the Teacher, our Savior!

FINE ARTS MASS

Two weekends ago, we focused on the fine arts and all young folks involved in the fine arts at the 10:00 Sunday morning Mass. Bishop Bartosic, episcopal vicar for this area, was the main celebrant and homilist.

We had a very good crowd at the 10:00 Mass, and it was a lively celebration. It also marked the final session of the

year for Children's Ministry. What a wonderful year it was!

I am grateful for the many committed adults who participated as catechists this past year. Some were new at it. Some have been catechists for many years.

We also had 13 teenagers who acted as catechist aides this time around, five more than helped last year, which is a beautiful sign of hope for us as a parish.

Children's Ministry here at Divine Mercy is constantly evolving. They are trying new things, attempting to make sessions lively and challenging, while encouraging young people to experience the Lord Jesus beyond sessions through special prayer encounters and service & outreach projects. This is exactly where we want to go in Children's Ministry, so that we are not relying solely on catechetical sessions, but enriching the faith development of young people so that they truly build a relationship with the living, Risen Lord Jesus.

Thanks to all those who gave of their time and talent, and those who obeyed the promptings of the Holy Spirit, as they worked with and guided young people closer to the Lord and to the Lord's Church, this household of the faithful.

The ultimate goal of all our parish ministries is to cultivate and deepen our relationships: the relationship we have with Christ, and because of him, the many relationships we have with one another. In other words, the goal of all our parish ministries is set forth in our parish vision statement: **Divine Mercy Parish is a welcoming community that inspires disciples of Jesus to share God's love and transform the world.**

Yes, indeed, I would say that the key to our parish vision statement is, in a word – *relationship* - the relationship



we have with Jesus as his disciples, and the relationship we have with one another as his modern-day disciples. Amen!

WHY ALPHA MATTERS TO DIVINE MERCY AND TO YOU

OUTREACH

A LOOK AT HUNGER, JUST 7.5 MILES AWAY

Each month, multiple Divine Mercy parishioners volunteer at the Rogers Park non-profit community kitchen A Just Harvest. They help distribute food to area residents, transport donations of bread, deliver Uncle Pete's sack dinners made once a month by Divine Mercy volunteers, and bring non-perishable food donations.



On a recent visit to A Just Harvest, Director of Food Services David Crawford shared that he is seeing an upswing in need. The donations provided by Divine Mercy Parish are increasingly important to their operations.

Ninety percent of the non-perishable food pantry items A Just Harvest receives go



out each week. The bread delivered weekly by Divine Mercy volunteers goes out quickly, as does the produce they receive through other sources.


David further described the population they serve. They currently have 10 families with 6+ members. They are feeding 140 people each week from a nearby social service agency, and the shelter across the street recently closed so they have about 100 people from there they are feeding. That is in addition to those who simply walk up and request help.



In addition, A Just Harvest volunteers make upwards of 120 deliveries per week. He reports that they are also receiving an increase in calls from the City's emergency services looking for help for people with no food.

How can you help?

David said that our new Uncle Pete's Ministry sandwich dinners, which Divine Mercy Parish delivers each month, are very helpful. This is food his staff can plan on receiving and it gives them a little breathing room as they struggle to meet demand.

The following Adoration story is from Focus (see their webpage: <https://focusequip.org/stories-to-bring-to-adoration/>), written by Melissa Keating. Here's her introduction and "The Origin Story".

"If you're anything like me, then you need all the help you can get when it comes to prayer. I'm just not always sure what I'm supposed to do in Adoration. Do I sit there and try to look holy? Do I pray for other people the whole time? Do I read the Bible? Or do I just talk to God about what's on my heart?"

There's lots of super smart documents out there explaining this. However, we also have some really beautiful stories that we pass on to each other about the power of Eucharistic prayer. I encourage you to remember these the next time you go to the chapel.

THE ORIGIN STORY

The people in the Middle Ages experienced more acute anguish than modern day Cubs fans. They had to combat plagues, horrific medical procedures, and lots of nasty heresies. One of the nastiest of the nasty heresies was called Jansenism. Followers of this heresy really stressed that we're all awful and chock full of Original Sin. They also advocated the idea of predestination and, most importantly for this story, taught that the faithful should rarely receive the

Eucharist, on account of us being so terrible and unworthy.

This mentality seeped into all levels of the Church. St. Louis only received the Eucharist six times a year. The Poor Clares actually had to write into their rule that they would receive. The hierarchy fought this (the fourth Lateran Council specifically said the faithful *had to* receive once a year), but everyone's mentality had been skewed.

However, the people still loved the Eucharist. They still knew it was the Body and Blood of Christ. The legend has it that because they thought they couldn't receive, they paid extra close attention when the priest would lift the Host during the Consecration. They would just kneel there and get their weekly glimpse of Christ, drinking Him in as long as He was held up. They even asked their priests to slow down the Consecration so that they could look at Him longer. The priest listened, and held Him up for a full minute. Then a few minutes. Eventually, they started showing Him for prolonged periods of time. We had probably had exposed Adoration before this, but it took on a new life in this time period.

I'm not positive about the historicity of the first part of this story. However, I am confident that there have been people throughout history who couldn't receive, didn't have access to Adoration, and had to be content with brief peeks at Christ's physical body. Sometimes, I like to imagine what they were thinking during the Consecration. And then I thank God for putting me in a time and place with so many Adoration chapels.

So sometimes, it can just be enough to be grateful to have access to Him, and to live in a time when I'm encouraged to receive Him."

AN UPDATE ON THE FATHER PAUL FOUNDATION

Father Paul, a former associate at the Parish (and head of the Father Paul Foundation, which you can read more about on our website) recently sent a short update from Sri Lanka that simply stated, "(T)he situation is very bad. The economy is at its low ebb. We are not able to come out of this mess. Politically the country is in disarray. The power-hungry politicians are violently extorting the poor. We are continuing to do our ministries for the marginalized, vulnerable communities. God is with us. He sustains us. He is supporting us."


Life for Hasun Peiris began to unravel a year ago under the pull of powerful forces he didn't understand.

Climbing food prices drained the 32-year old woodcutter's savings, and his family sold their truck. Hunger began to gnaw at their bellies, and they pawned off their gold. Then, after war erupted thousands of miles away in Ukraine, diesel grew more and more scarce in Sri Lanka, leading to daily power cuts starting last month. Now, Peiris has been forced to scale back his lumber shipments - and his diet. What money he has goes to buying eggs for his pregnant wife.

"I can't remember the last time I ate chicken or coconut milk," Peiris said, sitting inside his half-finished house while his five employees idly sorted matchwood in the yard. It was another afternoon wasted, with no electricity or diesel to power his tools and make a living. "I'm afraid," he said. "I don't know how to continue."

Sri Lanka is mired in an unprecedented economic crisis brought on by mostly domestic factors: Years of foreign-debt-fueled government spending, badly timed tax cuts, policies that hurt crop yields and a precipitous drop in tourism during the coronavirus pandemic have hollowed out its foreign reserves. But Sri Lanka's teetering finances were dealt another blow this year when war in Europe sent global fuel and food prices surging, turning the small country's uphill economic struggle into something insurmountable."




